- 1 AN ACT Relating to exempting veterans from fingerprint and
- 2 background check requirements for real estate broker, managing broker,
- and firm licensees; and amending RCW 18.85.191.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 Sec. 1. RCW 18.85.191 and 2008 c 23 s 19 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 Before receiving a license, every real estate broker, managing
- 8 broker, and firm must pay a license fee as prescribed by the director
- 9 by rule. A license issued under the provisions of this chapter expires
- 10 two years from the issuance date. Licenses issued to real estate firms
- 11 that are partnerships, limited liability partnerships, limited
- 12 liability companies, corporations, and other legally recognized
- 13 business entities expire on the date when the registration or

certificate of authority filed with the secretary of state expires.

- 15 Licenses must be renewed every two years on or before the date
- 16 established under this section and a biennial renewal license fee as
- 17 prescribed by the director by rule must be paid. A license is
- 18 considered expired when the licensee fails to meet the renewal
- 19 requirements as of the date of renewal for that license.

If the director does not receive the application for a renewal license on or before the renewal date, a penalty fee as prescribed by the director by rule shall be paid. Acceptance by the director of an application for renewal after the renewal date shall not be a waiver of the delinquency.

The license of a person whose license renewal fee is not received within one year from the date of expiration is canceled. This person may obtain a new license by satisfying the procedures and requirements as prescribed by the director by rule.

The director may issue to each active licensee a license and a pocket identification card in the form and size as prescribed by rule.

The director must develop by rule a procedure and a schedule to ensure all active licensees and licensees applying for active status, renewal, or reinstatement have a fingerprint and background check done on a regular basis. Veterans who have been honorably discharged from a branch of the United States armed forces are exempt from the fingerprint and background check under this section upon presentation of their DD-214 form with their initial or renewal application.
