### SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6354

- 1 AN ACT Relating to filing of business forms with state agencies;
- 2. and adding a new section to chapter 43.17 RCW.

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- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 43.17 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) In any instance where a state agency requires that a business submit a document, form, or payment of a fee in paper format, the state 8 agency must provide the business an option to submit such requirement 9 electronically.
- A business may authorize a second party to meet 11 requirements imposed by a state agency under subsection (1) of this section on its behalf. 12
- 13 (3) The director of a state agency or the director's designee may exempt a document, form, or payment of a fee from the requirements of 14 this section if: 15
- 16 (a)(i) There is a legal requirement for such materials to be 17 submitted in paper format; or
- 18 (ii) It is not technically or fiscally feasible or practical, or in

the best interest of businesses for such materials to be submitted electronically; and

- (b) Within existing resources, the director or the director's designee establishes and maintains a process to notify the public regarding such exemptions.
- (4) Agencies must add the capability to submit existing documents, forms, and fees electronically as part of their normal operations. New documents, forms, and fees required of a business must be capable of electronic submission within a reasonable time following either their creation or the implementation of the new requirement.
- 11 (5) Agencies must document how they plan to transition from paper 12 to electronic forms.

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
