House Bills

HB 2348 by Representatives Reykdal, Probst, Sells, Anderson, Ormsby, Kenney, Moscoso, Hunter, Ladenburg, and Tharinger

Strengthening Washington's workforce development system by providing greater focus and better alignment of roles and responsibilities, and transferring administration of title I-B of the workforce investment act to the workforce training and education coordinating board.

Transfers powers, functions, and duties of the employment security department's worksource standards and integration division, pertaining to the administration of title I-B of the workforce investment act, to the workforce training and education coordinating board.

Requires workforce development councils to establish as their primary missions: (1) Developing a workforce with the skills most needed by top industries targeted for growth and recruitment including, but not limited to, aerospace, biotechnology, and information technology; and

(2) Increasing the percentage of Washington households living in the middle-income bracket or higher.

(3) Keep records of all nuisance beaver calls, requests for relocation, and relocated beavers; and

(4) Develop a beaver damage management plan.

Concerning institutions of higher education services and activities fees.

Prohibits the services and activities fee committee from being limited in the program or instructional activities they consider and recommend to the governing board that preserves educational program quality and the ability of students to complete their programs of study.

Requires institutions of higher education, in coordination with the services and activities fee committee, to post services and activities fees expenditure information for the prior academic year on their web site.

Allowing lunch breaks for registered tow truck operators while requiring reasonable availability.

Authorizes a registered tow truck operator to close the business office for a lunch break not to exceed one hour under certain circumstances.

Prohibits trafficking in stolen property in the first degree and second degree from being prosecuted more than six years after their commission or discovery, whichever occurs later.

Authorizes the department of agriculture, subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, to provide capital funding to local governments and nonprofit organizations, on a competitive basis, to support capital projects that make health or safety improvements to agricultural fair grounds or fair facilities.

Prohibits the department of labor and industries from removing a provider from the industrial insurance medical provider network for failure to follow the department's coverage decisions or treatment guidelines or policies if the treatment or procedure performed by the provider was ordered by the board of industrial insurance appeals or a court.

Exempts from public inspection, information associated with an auto insurance filing for a usage or mileage-based insurance product that constitutes a trade secret.

(4) Requirements for court appearance;

(5) Disclosure of information in cases involving domestic violence or child abuse;

(6) Regional domestic violence fatality review panels; and

(7) Address confidentiality program participant information.

Requires the state institute for public policy to conduct a statewide study to assess recidivism by domestic violence offenders and assess domestic violence perpetrator treatment.

Provides that section 12 of the act is null and void if appropriations are not approved.

Regarding large wild carnivore conflict management.

Defines "large wild carnivore" which includes wild bears, cougars, and wolves.

Prohibits the department of fish and wildlife from paying more than fifty thousand dollars per fiscal year from the state wildlife account for claims and assessment costs for injury or loss of commercial livestock caused by large wild carnivores.

Prohibits a person from negligently or intentionally feeding or attempting to feed large wild carnivores or negligently or intentionally attracting large wild carnivores to land or a building.

Improving state agency risk management practices.

Establishes the risk management review process to evaluate claims information of state agencies with relatively high claim payments in order to identify claim trends and patterns, and opportunities for corrective action.

Requires the department of licensing, in consultation with the utilities and transportation commission, to set the fee for each original tow truck operator registration and annual renewal to cover the costs of administration.

Requires the utilities and transportation commission to make, fix, alter, and amend just, fair, and reasonable maximum rates for tow truck services and vehicle storage.

Requiring the labeling of ceremonially or religiously prepared foods.
