1 AN ACT Relating to additive transportation funding; creating new
2 sections; and providing effective dates.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) Additive transportation funding is
5 hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions set forth, the several
6 amounts specified, or as much thereof as may be necessary to accomplish
7 the purposes designated, are hereby appropriated from the several
8 accounts and funds named to the designated state agencies and offices
9 for employee compensation and other expenses, for capital projects, and
10 for other specified purposes for the period ending June 30, 2015.

11 (2) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions
12 in this subsection apply throughout this act:

13 (a) "Lapse" means the amount shall return to unappropriated status.

14 (b) "LEAP" means the legislative evaluation and accountability
15 program committee.

16 (c) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only
17 for the specified purpose. Unless otherwise specifically authorized in
18 this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified

1 purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and
2 limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

13 appropriation is provided solely for the purpose of making grants to

15 streets and roads.

16 (2) \$25,200,000 of the county road administration board storm water
17 pollution account--state appropriation, consistent with the funding
18 provided under chapter . . . (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of
19 2013 for this purpose, is provided solely for grants to local
20 governments for the purpose of complying with the local government's
21 national pollution discharge elimination system permit.

35 appropriation is provided solely for the purpose of establishing a
36 major projects grants program.

1 (3) \$25,200,000 of the transportation improvement board storm water
2 pollution account--state appropriation, consistent with the funding
3 provided under chapter . . . (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of
4 2013 for this purpose, is provided solely for grants to local
5 governments for the purpose of complying with the local government's
6 national pollution discharge elimination system permit.

14 consistent with the funding provided under chapter . . . (House Bill
15 No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of 2013 for this purpose, is provided
16 solely for the responsibilities of the department in complying with the
17 department's national pollution discharge elimination system permit.

22 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
23 conditions and limitations: \$1,316,000 of the state transportation
24 storm water pollution and fish passage barrier account--state
25 appropriation, consistent with the funding provided under chapter . . .
26 (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of 2013 for this purpose, is
27 provided solely for the responsibilities of the department in complying
28 with the department's national pollution discharge elimination system
29 permit.

30 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6. FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION--**
31 **PROGRAM DELIVERY MANAGEMENT AND SUPPORT--PROGRAM H**

32 State Transportation Storm Water Pollution and
33 Fish Passage Barrier Account--State Appropriation \$9,261,000

1 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
2 conditions and limitations: \$9,261,000 of the state transportation
3 storm water pollution and fish passage barrier account--state
4 appropriation, consistent with the funding provided under chapter . . .
5 (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of 2013 for this purpose, is
6 provided solely for the responsibilities of the department in complying
7 with the department's national pollution discharge elimination system
8 permit.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7. FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION--**
10 **IMPROVEMENTS--PROGRAM I**

11 Connecting Washington Account--State Appropriation \$371,700,000

12 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
13 conditions and limitations:

14 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the entire
15 connecting Washington account appropriation--state is provided solely
16 for the Program I projects and activities listed in LEAP Transportation
17 Document 2013-1, as developed February 20, 2013. The amounts provided
18 in this subsection are further subject to the limitations in chapter
19 . . . (House Bill No. . . . (H-1569/13)), Laws of 2013.

20 (2) \$9,200,000 of the connecting Washington account--state
21 appropriation is provided solely for the SR 509/I-5/SR 167 Freight
22 Corridor project. The secretary of transportation must work with the
23 freight mobility strategic investment board to ensure that the project
24 is a priority project within the state freight mobility plan required
25 under the federal moving ahead for progress in the 21st century act.

26 (3) \$230,000,000 of the connecting Washington account--state
27 appropriation is provided solely for the purposes of the Interstate
28 5/Columbia River Crossing project.

29 (4) The appropriation in this section includes up to \$230,000,000
30 in proceeds from the sale of toll revenue bonds authorized in chapter
31 . . . (House Bill No. . . .(H-1359/13)), Laws of 2013.

8 provided solely for the responsibilities of the department in complying
9 with the department's national pollution discharge elimination system
10 permit.

18 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
19 conditions and limitations:

20 (1) The amounts provided in this section are further subject to the
21 limitations in chapter . . . (House Bill No. . . . (H-1569/13)), Laws
22 of 2013.

23 (2) \$110,000,000 of the connecting Washington account--state
24 appropriation in this section is provided solely for the purposes of
25 constructing a ferry boat vessel with a carrying capacity of at least
26 one hundred forty-four cars.

27 (3) The appropriations in this section include up to \$110,000,000
28 in proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized in chapter . . . (House
29 Bill No. . . . (H-1359/13)), Laws of 2013.

30 (4) \$28,400,000 of the connecting Washington account--state
31 appropriation, consistent with the funding provided under chapter . . .
32 (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of 2013 for this purpose, is
33 provided solely for the Mukilteo and Seattle terminal replacement
34 projects of the Washington state ferry system. The amount provided in
35 this subsection represents the first portion of a ten-year state
36 funding plan as described in LEAP Transportation Document 2013-1, as

1 developed February 20, 2013. This LEAP transportation document
2 identifies: (a) \$88,560,000 in state funds to be provided over ten
3 years to complete the Mukilteo terminal replacement project once
4 federal sources have been identified; and (b) \$191,885,000 in state
5 funds to be provided over ten years for substantial advancement of the
6 Seattle terminal replacement project, including: (i) Design work and
7 selection of a preferred plan; (ii) replacing timber pilings with
8 pilings sufficient to support a selected terminal design; (iii)
9 replacing the timber portion of the dock with a new and reconfigured
10 steel and concrete dock; and (iv) other staging and construction work
11 as the amount allows.

29 to address freight movement and safety issues at railroad and street
30 intersections.

31 (2) \$12,200,000 of the motor vehicle account--state appropriation
32 is provided solely for grants to local governments under the complete
33 streets grant program.

34 (3) \$1,500,000 of the essential rail assistance account--state
35 appropriation is provided solely for the freight mobility strategic
36 investment board for the freight rail assistance program.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 13. FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY**

2 Department of Ecology Storm Water Pollution

3 Account--State Appropriation \$40,000,000

4 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following
5 conditions and limitations:

6 (1) \$20,000,000 of the department of ecology storm water pollution
7 account--state appropriation, consistent with the funding provided
8 under chapter . . . (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of 2013 for
9 this purpose, is provided solely for the department to assist the
10 department of transportation in retrofitting existing facilities for
11 the purposes of complying with the department of transportation's
12 national pollution discharge elimination system permit.

13 (2) \$20,000,000 of the department of ecology storm water pollution
14 account--state appropriation, consistent with the funding provided
15 under chapter . . . (House Bill No. . . .(H-1407/13)), Laws of 2013 for
16 this purpose, is provided solely for the department to assist local
17 governments in retrofitting existing facilities for the purposes of
18 complying with the local government's national pollution discharge
19 elimination system permit.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 14. FOR THE STATE TREASURER--BOND RETIREMENT
21 AND INTEREST, AND ONGOING BOND REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER CHARGES: FOR
22 BOND SALES DISCOUNTS AND DEBT TO BE PAID BY MOTOR VEHICLE ACCOUNT AND
23 TRANSPORTATION FUND REVENUE**

24 Highway Bond Retirement Account--State Appropriation \$6,900,000

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 15. FOR THE STATE TREASURER--BOND RETIREMENT
26 AND INTEREST, AND ONGOING BOND REGISTRATION AND TRANSFER CHARGES: FOR
27 BOND SALE EXPENSES AND FISCAL AGENT CHARGES**

28 Capital Vessel Replacement Account--State Appropriation \$418,000
