- 3 designed to explode or produce uncontained combustion;
- 4 (d) The transporting, possessing or using of gasoline, kerosene,
- 5 or combustible, flammable, or explosive liquids or materials in a
- 6 glass or uncapped container of any kind except in connection with
- 7 the normal operation of motor vehicles, normal home use or
- 8 legitimate commercial use;
- 9 (e) The sale, purchase or dispensing of alcoholic beverages;
- 10 (f) The sale, purchase or dispensing of other commodities or
- 11 goods, as he or she reasonably believes should be prohibited to help
- 12 preserve and maintain life, health, property or the public peace;
- 13 (g) The use of certain streets, highways or public ways by the
- 14 public; and
- 15 (h) Such other activities as he or she reasonably believes
- 16 should be prohibited to help preserve and maintain life, health,

- 16 imposing the restrictions provided for by RCW 43.06.010, and

EFFECT: Terminates, on June 30, 2021, the eviction moratorium instituted by the Governor's Proclamation 20-19.6 and prohibits it from being extended or renewed.

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
