1 AN ACT Relating to establishing the state capitol committee as an
2 advisory entity of state government; amending RCW 43.34.010,
3 43.34.015, 43.34.080, 43.34.090, 79.24.030, 79.24.060, 79.24.087,
4 79.24.300, 79.24.530, 79.24.560, 79.24.570, 79.24.650, 43.17.070,
5 79.24.710, 79.24.720, 47.02.010, and 79.24.600; adding a new section
6 to chapter 43.34 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.19 RCW;
7 recodifying RCW 79.24.300; and repealing RCW 43.34.040, 43.82.020,
8 79.24.085, 79.24.310, 79.24.320, 79.24.330, 79.24.340, 79.24.400,
9 79.24.410, 79.24.450, 79.24.500, 79.24.510, 79.24.520, 79.24.540, and
10 79.24.550.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

12 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.34.010 and 1997 c 279 s 1 are each amended to
13 read as follows:

14 (1) The state capitol committee is established as an interbranch
15 advisory committee of state government. The governor or the
16 governor's designee, ((the lieutenant governor,)) the secretary of
17 state, ((and the commissioner of public lands,)) two members of the
18 state senate, and two members of the house of representatives, ex
19 officio, shall constitute the ((state capitol)) committee. The
20 members of the senate and house of representatives must be appointed
21 by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of

1 representatives, respectively, from each of the two largest caucuses
2 in the respective bodies.

3 (2) The committee shall:

4 (a) Make recommendations to the legislature and the governor that
5 contribute to the attainment of architectural, historical, aesthetic,
6 functional, and environmental excellence in design and maintenance of
7 the state capitol public and historic facilities;

8 (b) Receive and share advice and recommendations from the work
9 group; and

10 (c) Advise the department on amendments and modifications to the
11 comprehensive plan for state capitol buildings and grounds created
12 under RCW 79.24.530.

13 (3) The department shall provide staff support services to the
14 committee.

15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.34
16 RCW to read as follows:

17 The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter
18 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

19 (1) "Committee" means the state capitol committee established in
20 RCW 43.34.010.

21 (2) "Department" means the department of enterprise services.

22 (3) "Director" means the director of the department of enterprise
23 services.

24 (4) "State capitol public and historic facilities" has the
25 meaning in RCW 79.24.710.

26 (5) "Work group" means the entity established in RCW 43.34.080.

27 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.34.015 and 1997 c 279 s 2 are each amended to
28 read as follows:

29 The ~~((commissioner of public lands))~~ director shall ~~((be))~~
30 appoint a person to serve as the secretary of the state capitol
31 committee ~~((, but the committee may appoint a suitable person as~~
32 ~~acting secretary thereof, and fix his or her compensation)).~~
33 ~~((However, all))~~ All records of the committee shall be filed ~~((in the~~
34 ~~office of the commissioner of public lands))~~ with the department.

35 **Sec. 4.** RCW 43.34.080 and 2013 2nd sp.s. c 19 s 7015 are each
36 amended to read as follows:

1 (1) The capitol campus design technical advisory (~~committee~~)
2 work group is established as an advisory group to the (~~capitol~~)
3 committee and the director (~~of enterprise services to review~~). The
4 work group assists the committee by reviewing programs, planning,
5 design, and landscaping of state capitol facilities and grounds and
6 (~~to make~~) by making recommendations that (~~will~~) contribute to the
7 attainment of architectural, aesthetic, functional, and environmental
8 excellence in design and maintenance of (~~capitol facilities on~~
9 ~~campus and located in neighboring communities~~) state capitol public
10 and historic facilities.

11 (2) The (~~advisory committee~~) work group shall consist of the
12 following persons who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure
13 of the director (~~of enterprise services~~):

14 (a) Two members must be architects;

15 (b) ((A)) One member must be a landscape architect; ((and))

16 (c) ((An)) One member must be an urban planner;

17 (d) One member must represent the department of enterprise
18 services;

19 (e) One member must represent the department of archaeology and
20 historic preservation; and

21 (f) One member must represent the Washington state arts
22 commission.

23 (3) The director (~~of enterprise services~~) shall appoint the
24 chair and vice chair and shall provide the staff and resources
25 necessary for implementing this section. The (~~advisory committee~~)
26 work group shall meet (~~at least once every ninety days and at the~~
27 ~~call of the chair~~) as often as necessary.

28 (4) The members of the (~~committee~~) work group shall be
29 reimbursed as provided in RCW 43.03.220 and 44.04.120.

30 (~~(3) The advisory committee shall also consist of the secretary~~
31 ~~of state and two members of the house of representatives, one from~~
32 ~~each caucus, who shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of~~
33 ~~representatives, and two members of the senate, one from each caucus,~~
34 ~~who shall be appointed by the president of the senate.~~

35 (4)) (5) The (~~advisory committee~~) work group shall review
36 plans and designs affecting state capitol public and historic
37 facilities as they are developed. The (~~advisory committee's~~) work
38 group's review shall include:

39 (a) (~~The process of solicitation and selection of appropriate~~
40 ~~professional design services including design-build proposals;~~

1 ~~(b))~~ Compliance with the capitol campus (~~master~~) comprehensive
2 plan and design concepts (~~as adopted by the capitol committee~~)
3 under RCW 79.24.530;

4 ~~((e))~~ (b) The design, siting, and grouping of state capitol
5 public and historic facilities relative to the service needs of state
6 government and the impact upon the local community's economy,
7 environment, traffic patterns, and other factors;

8 ~~((d))~~ (c) The relationship of overall state capitol facility
9 planning to the respective comprehensive plans for long-range urban
10 development of the cities of Olympia, Lacey, and Tumwater, and
11 Thurston county; and

12 ~~((e))~~ (d) Landscaping plans and designs, including planting
13 proposals, street furniture, sculpture, monuments, and access to the
14 capitol campus and buildings.

15 ~~((5) For development of the property known as the 1063 block,~~
16 ~~the committee may review the proposal selected by the department of~~
17 ~~enterprise services but must not propose changes that will affect the~~
18 ~~scope, budget, or schedule of the project.))~~

19 **Sec. 5.** RCW 43.34.090 and 2015 c 225 s 74 are each amended to
20 read as follows:

21 (1) The legislature shall approve names for new or existing
22 buildings on the state capitol grounds based upon recommendations
23 from the (~~state capitol~~) committee and the director (~~of the~~
24 ~~department of enterprise services~~), with the advice of the (~~capitol~~
25 ~~campus design advisory committee~~) work group, subject to the
26 following limitations:

27 (a) An existing building may be renamed only after a substantial
28 renovation or a change in the predominant tenant agency headquartered
29 in the building.

30 (b) A new or existing building may be named or renamed after:

31 (i) An individual who has played a significant role in Washington
32 history;

33 (ii) The purpose of the building;

34 (iii) The single or predominant tenant agency headquartered in
35 the building;

36 (iv) A significant place name or natural place in Washington;

37 (v) A Native American tribe located in Washington;

38 (vi) A group of people or type of person;

1 (vii) Any other appropriate person consistent with this section
2 as recommended by the director (~~(of the department of enterprise~~
3 ~~services)~~).

4 (c) The names on the facades of the state capitol group shall not
5 be removed.

6 (2) The legislature shall approve names for new or existing
7 public rooms or spaces on the west capitol campus based upon
8 recommendations from the (~~state capitol~~) committee and the director
9 (~~(of the department of enterprise services, with the advice of the~~
10 ~~capitol campus design advisory committee)~~), subject to the following
11 limitations:

12 (a) An existing room or space may be renamed only after a
13 substantial renovation;

14 (b) A new or existing room or space may be named or renamed only
15 after:

16 (i) An individual who has played a significant role in Washington
17 history;

18 (ii) The purpose of the room or space;

19 (iii) A significant place name or natural place in Washington;

20 (iv) A Native American tribe located in Washington;

21 (v) A group of people or type of person;

22 (vi) Any other appropriate person consistent with this section as
23 recommended by the director (~~(of the department of enterprise~~
24 ~~services)~~).

25 (3) When naming or renaming buildings, rooms, and spaces under
26 this section, consideration must be given to: (a) Any disparity that
27 exists with respect to the gender of persons after whom buildings,
28 rooms, and spaces are named on the state capitol grounds; (b) the
29 diversity of human achievement; and (c) the diversity of the state's
30 citizenry and history.

31 (4) For purposes of this section, "state capitol grounds" means
32 buildings and land owned by the state and otherwise designated as
33 state capitol grounds, including the west capitol campus, the east
34 capitol campus, the north capitol campus, the Tumwater campus, the
35 Lacey campus, Sylvester Park, Centennial Park, the Old Capitol
36 Building, and Capitol Lake.

37 **Sec. 6.** RCW 79.24.030 and 2013 c 23 s 260 are each amended to
38 read as follows:

1 The board of natural resources and the department of natural
2 resources may employ such cruisers, drafters, engineers, architects,
3 or other assistants as may be necessary for the best interests of the
4 state in carrying out the provisions of RCW 79.24.010 through
5 (~~79.24.085, and all expenses incurred by the board and department,~~
6 ~~and all claims against the capitol building construction account~~
7 ~~shall be audited by the department and presented in vouchers to the~~

15 the timber or other materials, shall be paid into the capitol
16 building construction account which is hereby established in the
17 state treasury to be used (~~as in this act provided. All contracts~~
18 ~~for the construction of capitol buildings shall be let after notice~~
19 ~~for proposals or bids have been advertised for at least four~~
20 ~~consecutive weeks in at least three newspapers of general circulation~~
21 ~~throughout the state)) for purposes of state capitol buildings as
22 granted to the state of Washington by the United States pursuant to
23 an act of Congress approved February 22, 1889, for capitol building
24 purposes.~~

25 **Sec. 8.** RCW 79.24.087 and 2005 c 330 s 7 are each amended to
26 read as follows:

27 All revenues received from leases and sales of lands, timber, and
28 other products on the surface or beneath the surface of the lands
29 granted to the state of Washington by the United States pursuant to
30 an act of Congress approved February 22, 1889, for capitol building
31 purposes, shall be paid into the "capitol building construction
32 account." Available revenues in this account shall first be (~~pledged~~
33 ~~to~~) appropriated for state capitol public and historic facilities as
34 defined under RCW 79.24.710.

35 **Sec. 9.** RCW 79.24.300 and 2015 c 225 s 117 are each amended to
36 read as follows:

1 (~~The state capitol committee~~) Subject to legislative
2 appropriation, the department of enterprise services may construct
3 parking facilities for the state capitol adequate to provide parking
4 space for automobiles, said parking facilities to be either of a
5 single level, multiple level, or both, and to be either on one site
6 or more than one site and located either on or in close proximity to
7 the capitol grounds, though not necessarily contiguous thereto. The
8 (~~state capitol committee~~) department of enterprise services may
9 select such lands as are necessary therefor and acquire them by
10 purchase or condemnation. As an aid to such selection the committee
11 may cause location, topographical, economic, traffic, and other
12 surveys to be conducted, and for this purpose may utilize the
13 services of existing state agencies, may employ personnel, or may
14 contract for the services of any person, firm or corporation. (~~In~~
15 ~~selecting the location and plans for the construction of the parking~~
16 ~~facilities the committee shall consider recommendations of the~~
17 ~~director of enterprise services.~~)

18 Space in parking facilities may be rented to the officers and
19 employees of the state on a monthly basis at a rental to be
20 determined by the director of enterprise services. The state shall
21 not sell gasoline, oil, or any other commodities or perform any
22 services for any vehicles or equipment other than state equipment,
23 except that the department of enterprise services may operate
24 electric vehicle supply equipment for electric vehicles authorized to
25 park in its lots.

26 **Sec. 10.** RCW 79.24.530 and 2015 c 225 s 118 are each amended to
27 read as follows:

28 The department of enterprise services shall develop, amend, and
29 modify (~~an overall~~) as needed a comprehensive plan for the design
30 and establishment of state capitol buildings and grounds (~~on the~~
31 ~~east capitol site~~) in accordance with current and prospective
32 requisites of a state capitol befitting the state of Washington.
33 (~~The overall plan, amendments and modifications thereto shall be~~
34 ~~subject to the approval of the state capitol committee.~~)

35 **Sec. 11.** RCW 79.24.560 and 2015 c 225 s 120 are each amended to
36 read as follows:

37 The department of enterprise services shall have the power to
38 rent, lease, or otherwise use any of the properties (~~acquired in the~~

1 ~~east capitol site))~~ of the state capitol public and historic
2 facilities as defined in RCW 79.24.710, consistent with the
3 assignment or provision of the properties for use by the legislature,
4 state agencies, state officials, and the supreme court.

5 **Sec. 12.** RCW 79.24.570 and 2015 c 225 s 121 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 All moneys received by the department of enterprise services from
8 the management of the ((east)) capitol ((site)) campus, excepting (1)
9 funds otherwise dedicated prior to April 28, 1967, (2) parking and
10 rental charges and fines which are required to be deposited in other
11 accounts, and (3) reimbursements of service and other utility charges
12 made to the department of enterprise services, shall be deposited in
13 the capitol purchase and development account (~~of the state general~~
14 ~~fund~~)).

17 ((The state capitol committee)) Consistent with appropriations

21 governor's mansion, and such other buildings and facilities as are
22 determined by the department of enterprise services, with advice from

6 (1) The east, west and north capitol campus grounds, Sylvester
7 park, Heritage park, Marathon park, Centennial park, the Deschutes
8 river basin commonly known as Capitol lake, the interpretive center,
9 Deschutes parkway, and the landscape, memorials, artwork, fountains,
10 streets, sidewalks, lighting, and infrastructure in each of these
11 areas not including state-owned aquatic lands in these areas managed

24 **Sec. 16.** RCW 79.24.720 and 2015 c 225 s 124 are each amended to

26 The department of enterprise services is responsible for the
27 stewardship, preservation, operation, and maintenance of the public
28 and historic facilities of the state capitol, (~~subject to the policy~~
29 ~~direction of~~) in consultation with the state capitol committee (~~and~~
30 ~~the guidance of the capitol campus design advisory committee~~). In
31 administering this responsibility, the department shall:

32 (1) Apply the United States secretary of the interior's standards
33 for the treatment of historic properties;

34 (2) Seek to balance the functional requirements of state
35 government operations with public access and the long-term
36 preservation needs of the properties themselves; and

37 (3) Consult with the capitol furnishings preservation committee,
