# SENATE RESOLUTION 8630

WHEREAS, The Facilities and Operations Committee has determined 1 2 that the ongoing pandemic and declared statewide emergency under RCW 3 43.06.010 presents a continued risk to the health and safety of members and staff and requires continued operational changes to 4 5 adhere to public health quidance during the 2022 legislative session; 6 and 7 WHEREAS, Permanent Senate Rule 70 establishes a process by which 8 the Senate will adopt a resolution establishing the rules and 9 procedures to govern floor and committee action for such а 10 legislative session; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of 11 12 Washington, That Senate Resolution 8601 be amended as follows and 13 that the following be adopted as the Emergency Parliamentary Rules of 14 the Sixty-Seventh Legislature: 15 "EMERGENCY PARLIAMENTARY RULES 16 OF THE SENATE SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE 17 18 ((<del>2021</del>)) <u>2022</u> 19 SECTION I: GENERAL 20 Rule A Public Health Measures. 21 Rule B Filing of Bills.

1 (c) Committee hearings and executive action will be held 2 remotely.

3 <u>(3)</u> Public access to the Senate galleries during floor 4 action shall be determined by the Facilities and Operations 5 Committee. All committee and floor proceedings will be broadcast 6 to the public via streaming or televised platforms to ensure 7 public access. (See Article II, Section 11 of the state 8 Constitution.)

# Filing of Bills

**B.** (1) Any member desiring to introduce a bill shall email the bill to the office of the code reviser by noon of the day before the convening of the session at which the bill is to be introduced. Only bills that have been emailed by a member or the member's legislative assistant may be considered for introduction.

16 (2) Sponsor sheets will be electronically available for 17 introducing the bill. The member emailing the bill and 18 corresponding sponsor sheet shall be considered the sponsor of 19 the bill. The sponsoring member may designate one cosponsor of the bill by providing the cosponsor's name in the email and by 20 21 including the cosponsor's name in the cc line of the email.

(3) Additional members may add themselves as cosponsors to the bill by emailing the Senate workroom by 5:00 p.m. of the day of its introduction.

(4) Agency and governor request legislation shall follow this process and the sponsoring member or member's legislative assistant must email such legislation to the office of the code reviser.

(5) The introduction of title-only bills is prohibited. For the purposes of this subsection, a title-only bill is a bill containing a title or short summary of the intended subject matter, without laying forth the full changes intended to any act or sections of law.

#### Electronic Signatures

C. Electronic or scanned signatures are authorized in place
 of any physical signatures that are otherwise required in order
 for a member to conduct legislative business.

# Interpretation of Permanent Senate Rules

5 **D.** To the extent that a matter is not addressed in this 6 Resolution, the Permanent Rules of the Senate adopted January 7 ((<del>11, 2021</del>)) <u>10, 2022</u>, will govern. The President will interpret 8 all rules and procedures to facilitate legislative business in a 9 fair and efficient manner in light of the ongoing emergency and 10 remote session.

SECTION II 11 12 PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURES 13 ((Physical Distancing Required 14 E. Senators voting on the Senate floor must maintain at 15 least six feet of distance from one another.)) 16 Remote Voting 17 Ε. ((Unless otherwise designated by the ((<del>F.</del>)) (1)18 Facilities & Operations Committee, members will be required to vote remotely. Senate administration will make information 19 20 technology provisions for members who wish to participate in 21 floor action remotely from their offices or another isolated 22 location on campus. Members who wish to vote remotely from their 23 homes will be outfitted with necessary hardware and provided 24 remote information technology support. 25 (2) During any roll call vote, members)) Members will record 26 their vote using the remote voting system. The clerk will close 27 electronic voting and announce each member's vote individually. 28 The President will call on those members who are present but 29 have not yet voted. The President will then provide members a 30 final opportunity to be recognized and change their votes. The 31 clerk will then announce the vote. (2) Should the Facilities and Operations Committee determine 32 33 that public health conditions no longer require floor action to 34 be conducted in a hybrid remote format in accordance with Emergency Rule A, members will vote orally. During any roll call 35

vote where more than five members are participating remotely, 1 2 members participating remotely will record their vote using the remote voting system. In such cases, the clerk will close 3 electronic voting and announce the vote of remote members 4 5 individually. The President will call on those members who are 6 present but have not yet voted. The President will then provide 7 members a final opportunity to be recognized and change their 8 votes. The clerk will then announce the vote.

9 (3) If, during a roll call vote, ((<u>a member's</u>)) <u>the</u> vote <u>of</u> 10 <u>each member participating remotely</u> is unable to be taken, the 11 member will be automatically excused. The member may request in 12 writing that their vote be reflected in the Senate journal, 13 though it will not count towards the final roll call.

(4) In accordance with Senate Rule 22, once begun, a roll call vote will not be interrupted because a member <u>participating</u> <u>remotely</u> has connectivity issues. However, if a majority of members elected is no longer present due to connectivity issues, a majority of those still present may defer consideration of a bill, adjourn, or recess the Senate until a quorum can be reestablished.

#### Attendance and Quorum

((G.)) <u>F.</u> A member of the Senate voting remotely is considered in attendance within the bar of the Senate if the member is participating in the session through a remote access program established by the Secretary of the Senate as provided in Senate Rule 70.

#### ((Floor Motions

H. Members are permitted to move a bill, resolution, or amendment; rise to a parliamentary inquiry; request a roll call vote; and rise to a point of order. The floor leaders of the majority and minority caucuses will make all other motions. A floor leader may yield to a member for a question of privilege.)

# Rules of Debate

35 <u>G. In accordance with Senate Rule 29, when present on the</u> 36 <u>floor of the Senate, any senator about to speak in debate or</u>

1 <u>submit any matter to the Senate shall rise and respectfully</u>
2 <u>request recognition by the President by both voice and</u>3 <u>electronic means.</u>

4

#### Call of the Senate

5 ((I.)) H. A call of the Senate may be moved by the majority 6 or minority floor leader and sustained by three Senators. If 7 carried by a majority of those present, the Secretary shall call 8 the roll, after which the names of the absentees shall again be 9 called. The business of the Senate will be suspended until the absent senators are considered within the bar of the Senate for 10 such action as the Senate may deem proper. A call of the Senate 11 may not interrupt a roll call vote, and no penalties shall be 12 13 sustained for members experiencing connectivity issues.

## Referral of Bills to Committee

15  $((J_{\cdot}))$  <u>I.</u> (1) Draft bill referrals will be electronically 16 published by 8:00 p.m. the evening before any session to 17 consider them. All objections or requests for rereferral must be 18 communicated in writing by a member to the majority floor leader 19 by 8:00 a.m. the day of convening.

20 (2) The Senate may relieve the Rules Committee of a bill 21 with the consent of a majority of the Senate, provided that two 22 hours' notice has been given to the President and all members of 23 the Senate by the majority leader. The majority leader will 24 consult with the President prior to giving such notice.

### ((Consideration of Bills and Amendments

K. (1) The majority floor leader will provide draft orders of consideration for the Second Reading Calendar to the minority floor leader by 5:00 p.m. two days before scheduled floor action. Bills may be added to orders of consideration with the consent of the majority and minority floor leaders.

31 (2) Once a bill is listed on a draft order of consideration 32 submitted to the minority floor leader, any amendments must be 33 submitted electronically to the Secretary of the Senate for 34 consideration by 8:00 p.m. the day before scheduled floor action 35 to be in order. 1 (3) On and after the third day preceding adjournment Sine 2 Die of any session, or two days prior to any cut-off date for 3 consideration of bills, as determined pursuant to Article II, 4 Section 12 of the state Constitution or concurrent resolution, 5 or during any special session of the legislature, this rule may 6 be suspended by a majority vote.))

## Floor Amendments

J. Any floor amendments must be submitted electronically by a member to the Secretary of the Senate for consideration.

#### SECTION III

## COMMITTEES

## Committee Procedures

13  $((\mathbf{L}, \mathbf{)})$  <u>K.</u> (1) All committees will meet remotely, except 14 that, after consultation with the President, the majority leader 15 may choose to hold a Rules Committee meeting in person. A member 16 shall be considered in attendance at a committee hearing if the 17 member is participating through a remote access program 18 established by the Secretary of the Senate as provided in Senate 19 Rule 70.

(2) All committees will rely upon and use the Electronic
Bill Book. Committee staff should add all materials relating to
hearings, work sessions, or executive sessions to the Electronic
Bill Book as early as possible or when the material has been
made public. Paper copies will not be provided to members.

25 (3) All committees will use the Committee Sign-In system 26 used in the past by the public, which has been modified to allow 27 universal remote testimony sign-in for all committee hearings. 28 All committee members will be able to view the list of 29 individuals who have signed in to testify on each bill. All 30 testimony will be taken remotely or in writing. Members of the 31 public wishing to testify may sign up remotely up to one hour 32 before the committee is scheduled to meet.

33 (4) Chairs must publish the list of bills that may be 34 considered for executive session by 4:00 p.m. two days preceding 35 executive session. A chair with the consent of the ranking 1 member has discretion to waive this deadline in extraordinary 2 circumstances.

3 (5) Members must have amendment requests to nonpartisan 4 committee staff by noon the day before scheduled executive 5 action. Members should be considerate of staff and turn in 6 amendment requests earlier if they are long or complex, keeping 7 in mind the final deadline for consideration of amendments.

8 (6) All amendments, including substitutes, must be sponsored 9 by a committee member. All amendments and effect statements must 10 be either drafted or reviewed, or both, by nonpartisan committee 11 staff. To be eligible for consideration at an executive 12 session((, amendments must be released from confidentiality and 13 posted to the Electronic Bill Book for committee members by 4:00 p.m. the day before the executive session or the amendments will 14 15 be considered out of order)) in a committee meeting scheduled to 16 begin prior to 12:00 p.m., amendments must be released from 17 confidentiality and posted to the Electronic Bill Book for committee members and the public by 4:00 p.m. the day before the 18 executive session or the amendments will be considered out of 19 20 order. To be eligible for consideration at an executive session in a committee meeting scheduled to begin on or after 12:00 21 22 p.m., amendments must be released from confidentiality and posted to the Electronic Bill Book for committee members and the 23 24 public by 7:00 p.m. the day before the executive session or the amendments will be considered out of order. A chair with the 25 26 consent of the ranking member has discretion to waive this 27 deadline in extraordinary circumstances.

(7) Committee voting will be done through recorded roll call votes with the results transmitted to the Secretary of the Senate via electronic means. Members must be present and visible to be eligible to vote during the executive session. Voting will not be allowed "subject to signatures."

33 (8) Electronic reports of standing committees must be 34 received one hour prior to convening of the session in order to 35 be read at said session. This requirement may be suspended by a 36 majority of the Senate."
