- RCW 41.80.040 and 2020 c 357 s 913 are each amended to 5 Sec. 1. 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) The employer shall not bargain over rights of management 8 which, in addition to all powers, duties, and rights established by constitutional provision or statute, shall include but not be limited 9 10 to the following:
- 11 $((\frac{1}{1}))$ (a) The functions and programs of the employer, the use 12 of technology, and the structure of the organization;
- 13 $((\frac{2}{2}))$ (b) The employer's budget, which includes for purposes of 14 any negotiations conducted during the 2019-2021 fiscal biennium any 15 specification of the funds or accounts that must be appropriated by 16 the legislature to fulfill the terms of an agreement, and the size of 17 the agency workforce, including determining the financial basis for
- 18 layoffs;
