SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR GRAIN, HAY, BEANS, & PEAS

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 22.09 RCW, after due notice as provided under Chapters 42.32 and 34.04 RCW and a public hearing held in Olympia, Washington on June 1, 1965, do hereby promulgate the following regulations relating to schedule of fees for agriculture commodity inspection and weighing, agricultural commodity grades and standards, and warehouse bonding requirements.

Regulation 1. Definitions

Section 1. "Department" means the Washington State Department of Agriculture.

Section 2. "Ton" means 2,000 pounds avoirdupois.

Section 3. "Overtime" means any time worked on Saturdays, Sundays, or Holidays and all time worked before 3:00 A.M. or after 5:00 P.M. on Monday through Friday. Where industries operate regular, sustained shifts other than specified herein, exceptions may be made at the discretion of the Department.

Section 4. "Fees" means any charge made by the Department for inspection and handling of any agricultural commodity.

Regulation 2. Commodity Inspection Points

Section 1. The following cities in the State of Washington are hereby designated as inspection points for the purpose of inspecting and weighing grain, hay and other commodities: Kalama, Longview, Pasco, Seattle, Spokane, Tacoma, and Vancouver.

Regulation 3. General Provisions for Hourly Charges

Section 1. Straight Time, rate per hour.....(minimum charge, 1 hour).....\$ 4.50

This hourly rate may be applied on any job where the fee is not sufficient to provide revenue of \$4.50 per hour, per man.

Section 2. Overtime, rate per hour.....(minimum charge, 1 hour).....\$ 3.00

Whenever overtime is required for the performance of any service for which the fee is charged on a tonnage, car, or sample basis or for the inspection of ships as to condition for cargo, this overtime rate will be charged in addition to the regular fee.

Whenever, overtime is required Saturdays, Sundays, or Holidays, or an employee is called from his home after regular working hours, a minimum of four (4) hours may be charged.

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Section 3. Standby, Overtime; rate per hour.....\$ 6.00

Whenever a service is requested and service cannot be performed through no fault of the Department, the Standby, Overtime rate shall be applied. Before or after regular working hours, Monday through Friday, minimum charge will be 2 hours. On Saturdays, Sundays, or Holidays minimum charge will be 4 hours.

Regulation 4. Inspection and/or Weighing Fees

Section 1. Combination Inspection and Weighing Fees

Ships, Barges, and Transfers of Bulk Grain

- 1. From vessel to elevator.....per ton.....\$.07
- 2. Transfers, Bin.....per ton.....\$.07
- 3. From elevator to vessel.....per ton.....\$.07

(Inspection .02 per ton)
(Weighing .05 per ton)

Sacked Grain.....per ton.....\$.10

(Inspection .02 per ton)
(Weighing .08 per ton)

Section 2. Inspection (Only)

(Sample, Inspect, Grade, and Certificate)

- 1. Railroad boxcars at designated hold tracks or at plants.....\$ 2.25
- 2. Covered hopper-type cars.....\$ 5.00
- 3. Reinspection of rail boxcars (if grade changed, fee cancelled).....\$ 4.50
- 4. Reinspection of covered hopper-type cars (if grade changed, fee cancelled).....\$ 7.50

Section 3. Weigh (Only)

- 1. From railroad boxcars, covered hopper-type cars, or vessels to elevator.....per ton.....\$.05
- 2. From elevator to railroad boxcars, covered hopper-type cars or vessels...per ton.....\$.05

Section 4. Submitted Samples and/or Sample Inspections.....\$ 1.00

Section 5. Inspection of Ships as to Condition.....\$25.00

Section 6. Trucks

- 1. Inspect and/or weigh....per truck.....\$ 3.00

Regulation 5. Physical Analyses

Section 1. Moisture Determination (Letter or Call; No Certificate).....\$.50

Section 2. Requested Additional Factors (that do not affect the grade).....\$.50

Section 3. Rodent Pellet Count (Requested Sample and Certificate).....\$ 2.50

Section 4. Rodent Pellet Count (File Sample and Certificate).....\$ 1.50

Regulation 6. Certificates

Section 1. Copies of Certificates, after original issuance, each run.....\$.50

(The above shall apply to "Divided Original Export Certificate". Each numbered set of certificates shall constitute a "run".)

Regulation 7. Sampling, Testing and Certification of Wheat for Sedimentation Values.

Section 1. Sampling and Certification of identifiable lots.....\$ 5.00

Section 2. Reinspection (file sample or lot).....\$ 5.00

Section 3. Submitted sample certification.....\$ 5.00

Section 4. For sampling service only, to provide a sedimentation sample (Minimum charge 1 hour) per hour.....\$ 4.50

Regulation 8. Inspection of Miscellaneous Commodities

Section 1. Hay Inspection

1. Complete inspection (minimum charge \$5.00)per ton.....\$.50

2. Partial inspection (minimum charge \$5.00)per ton.....\$.50

3. Submitted sample inspection.....each.....\$ 1.00

Section 2. Inspection of Beans, Peas, and Similar Commodities (minimum charge).....\$ 4.00

1. Inspection of bags....per cwt.....\$.01½

2. Commodity inspection point, bulk per ton...\$.10

3. Submitted sample inspection...per sample...\$ 4.00

Regulation 9. Miscellaneous

Section 1. Weighing, checking and/or sampling commodities (other than grain).....(minimum charge \$4.50 per hour).....per ton.....\$.05

Section 2. Mailing samples (minimum charge).....\$.30

Section 3. Sampling only, bulk commodities

1. Minimum charge.....\$ 1.25

2. Covered hopper-type cars.....\$ 4.00

Section 4. Sampling only, sacked commodities

Hourly rate.....\$ 4.50

Section 5. Car mileage.....per mile.....\$.10

Section 6. In all cases where no fee has been established for services, the charge for such service shall be as provided in Regulation 3.

Regulation 10. Services Rendered Away From Inspection Points

Section 1. The provisions of this regulation shall apply to the grading, weighing, sampling, and inspection of grain, hay, and other commodities at places other than inspection points. In addition to the applicable fees for such services, the applicant shall pay the following costs:

1. Time per hour, per man, including overtime, if any, from office and return.
2. Mileage from office and return except where transportation is furnished by applicant.
3. Subsistence allowance if employee is away from station, as defined, first day and all subsequent days.
4. Incidental costs for postage, telephone, etc.


Regulation 11. Warehouse Bonding Requirements.

Section 1. A bond of not less than \$10,000, nor more than \$200,000, is required for each warehouse licensed pursuant to Chapter 22.09 RCW, Laws of 1963, the Washington Warehouse Act. The amount of such bond shall be computed at the rate of \$.12 per bushel of licensed storage capacity.

Regulation 12. Grades and Standards.

Section 1. The grades and standards established by the United States Department of Agriculture as of July 1, 1965, for all commodities included within the provisions of this chapter are hereby adopted as the grades and standards for such commodities in this state.
