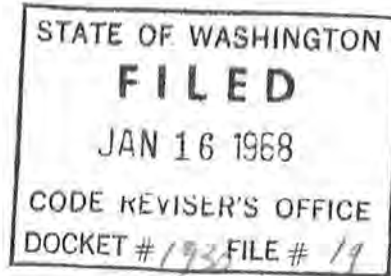

REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE USE OF INSECTICIDES ON CORN IN THE
COLUMBIA BASIN IRRIGATION PROJECT

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture, of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapters 17.21 and 15.57 RCW, after due notice as provided under Chapters 34.04 and 42.32 RCW, and a public hearing held in Othello on December 21, 1967, do hereby promulgate the following regulations relating to the restricted use of insecticides on corn actively shedding pollen.

Regulation 1. Definition: The term "actively shedding pollen" as related to any given corn field regulated under this Order shall be that stage of growth when 10 per cent or more of the corn plants in any one quarter portion of that field are showing spike anthers.

Regulation 2. Restricted Use Insecticides. The agricultural insecticides 1-Naphthyl-n-methyl carbamate, hereafter referred to as Carbaryl (Sevin); O,O-diethyl O-p-nitrophenyl phosphorothioate, hereafter referred to as Parathion; O,O-dimethyl O-p-nitrophenyl phosphorothioate, hereafter referred to as Methyl Parathion; O,O-dimethyl dithiophosphate of diethyl mercaptosuccinate, hereafter referred to as Malathion; Hexachlorohexahydromethano-2,4,3-benzodioxathiepin oxide, hereafter referred to as Endosulfan (Thiodan); and O,O-diethyl O-(2-isopropyl-4-methyl-6-pyrimidinyl) phosphorothioate, hereafter referred to as Diazinon; are by this Order declared to be restricted use insecticides. Such insecticides are restricted in their use in certain designated areas of the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project in the State of Washington.

Regulation 3. Area Under Order. This area includes all the irrigable lands in Grant, Adams, and Franklin Counties which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project.

Regulation 4. Area 1. This area includes all the irrigable lands in Grant County which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project lying north of U. S. Highway 10, starting from a point at Vantage on the west; thence easterly on U. S. Highway 10 to the Adams County Line.

Area 1. (Restrictions) The use of Carbaryl (Sevin), Parathion, and Methyl Parathion in any combination or formulation on corn which is actively shedding pollen is prohibited. The application of Malathion, Diazinon, and Endosulfan (Thiodan) on corn that is actively shedding pollen is prohibited between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Regulation 5. Area 2. This area includes all the irrigable lands lying within Blocks 12, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 23, and 201 which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project lying north and west of a line starting at a point at the southwest corner of Unit 232 of Block 15; thence east along the unit line to the Ringold Eltopia Road; thence east along the Ringold Eltopia Road to its junction with the Glade Road; thence north along the Glade Road to the Potholes East Canal; thence northeast along the Potholes East Canal to a point at the northeast corner of Unit 1 of Block 12, all lying in Franklin County.

Area 2. (Restrictions) The use of Carbaryl (Sevin), Parathion, and Methyl Parathion in any combination or formulation on corn which is actively shedding pollen is prohibited. The application of Malathion, Diazinon, and Endosulfan (Thiodan), on corn that is actively shedding pollen is prohibited between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Regulation 6. Area 3. This area includes all remaining irrigable lands in Grant, Adams, and Franklin Counties which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project that are not included in Areas 1 and 2.

Area 3. (Restrictions) This area is unrestricted as to the use of Carbaryl (Sevin), Parathion, Methyl Parathion, Malathion, Diazinon, Endosulfan (Thiodan), in any combination or formulation, on corn.
