I, Joe Dyer, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 11, Laws 1961 (Chapter 15.48 RCW), after due notice as provided in Chapter 42.32 RCW and in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act (Chapter 34.04 RCW), hereby adopt the following regulations relating to noxious weeds:

Regulation 1. Primary (Prohibited) Noxious Weed Seeds.


