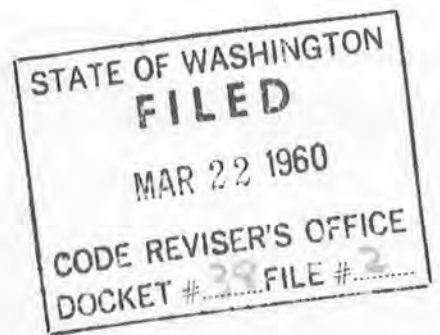

ORDER NO. 644

Superseding Order No. 565

REGULATIONS RELATING TO QUARANTINE, INDEMNITY, AND CLASSIFICATION
OF SUSPECTS AND REACTORS WHICH HAVE BEEN OFFICIALLY CALFHOOD
VACCINATED.

I, Sverre N. Omdahl, Director of Agriculture, by authority vested in me under Chapter 16.36, Revised Code of Washington, do hereby make and issue the following regulations:

Regulation 1. Quarantine.

1. All officially calfhood vaccinated animals that are positive to the brucellosis agglutination test 30 months or more after vaccination.
2. All officially calfhood vaccinated animals that are suspects to the brucellosis agglutination test 30 months or more after vaccination in reactor herds.
3. Officially calfhood vaccinated animals that are suspect to the brucellosis agglutination test will not be quarantined if, upon an entire herd test, all other animals are negative.

Paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 shall apply to animals being held in herds, but if moved out of herd, shall be classified at 24 months of age and moved only on permit.

Herd quarantine will not be issued if, upon an entire herd test, there are no other reactors in herd except officially calfhood vaccinated reactors.

Regulation 2. Retests.

Officially calfhood vaccinated animals which are positive to the brucellosis agglutination test 30 months or more after vaccination may be retested, on permission by the Director of the State Department of Agriculture, and released from quarantine if they become negative and are in otherwise negative herds.

Regulation 3. Indemnities.

Owners of herds as referred to in paragraph 1 of Regulation 1 shall have the option of slaughter with indemnity privileges if animal reacts on any test between 24 and 30 months after vaccination; or upon first test only, 30 months or more after vaccination. (No indemnity will be paid on reactors unless appraised and identified by tagging and branding).

Regulation 4. Tagging and Branding.

1. Officially calfhood vaccinated animals which are positive to the brucellosis agglutination test 30 months or more after vaccination and are held for retest shall be identified by suspect tag if in otherwise negative herds.

2. Officially calfhood vaccinated animals which are positive to the brucellosis agglutination test 30 months or more after vaccination shall be identified by tagging and branding if upon an entire herd test there are unvaccinated animals which are positive to test.
