REGULATION PERTAINING TO THE FALLING NUMBERS TESTING OF WHEAT

The adoption of this emergency regulation requiring the falling numbers test on white wheat received by tidewater terminal elevators is in the public interest and for the purpose of protecting the public health and welfare.

I, Donald W. Moos, director of agriculture of the state of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under chapter 22.09 RCW, after due notice as provided under chapters 42.32 and 34.04 RCW and a public hearing held in Olympia, Washington on January 3, 1972, do hereby promulgate the following regulation relating to the falling numbers testing of white wheat for export.


All truck, rail, and barge shipments of white wheat received by tidewater terminal elevators in the state of Washington shall be tested pursuant to the falling numbers test under this regulation. If any white wheat is received by a tidewater terminal elevator on which a falling numbers test has not been completed, that wheat must be identity preserved in such a manner that such shipments are separate and apart from deliveries of white wheat on which a falling numbers test has been completed.

The number derived from the falling numbers test shall be a part of the information on the pan ticket and, if requested, shall be reported on a certificate supplied by the Department.

The fee for testing wheat for falling number determinations shall be \$1.75 per sample.

The Department shall test wheat using the "falling numbers test" procedure as outlined in the American Association of Cereal Chemists, Inc., cereal laboratory method 56-81.
