N O T I C E1967 Hunting and Trapping Seasons and Bag Limits for the  
State of Washington

The following resolution and regulation was duly and regularly passed and adopted at a special meeting, May 15, 1967, of the State Game Commission for the State of Washington.

RESOLVED: That it shall be unlawful to hunt upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals in the State of Washington at any time except during the following open seasons, with bag limits as prescribed for each species, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that it shall be unlawful to hunt upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals on lands set aside as state game reserves where the hunting of such upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals is prohibited, PROVIDED, FURTHER, that all other game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals not specifically mentioned in the following open seasons, are protected by closed seasons, and it shall be unlawful to hunt, or possess the same at any time.

BLUE GROUSE, RUFFED GROUSE, SPRUCE (Franklin) GROUSE:General Open Seasons:

September 9 to November 19, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state.

Bag and Possession Limit: Three (3) grouse per day or a total of nine (9) in possession at any one time, straight or mixed bag.

Hunting Hours: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

EARLY CHUKAR, REDLEG AND HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE SEASON:

September 16 to October 8, both dates inclusive, in Asotin and Garfield Counties; Game Management Unit 1-P in Whitman County; and in that part of Columbia County that is north and east of the Tucannon River.

Bag and Possession Limits: Eight (8) partridge (chukar, redleg or Hungarian) per day, or a total of twenty-four (24) partridge in possession at any one time, straight or mixed bag.

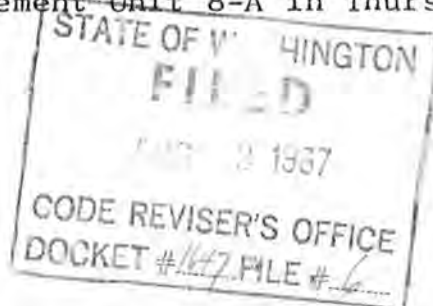
Hunting Hours: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

CHINESE PHEASANT, QUAIL, CHUKAR, REDLEG AND HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE, SHARPTAILED GROUSE AND SAGE HEN:

Open Season starts 12:00 o'clock Noon, Daylight Saving Time, on October 14th.

SPECIAL SHOTGUN RESTRICTION EFFECTIVE DURING ALL OPEN DEER HUNTING

SEASONS IN CERTAIN AREAS: Only shotguns firing slugs or buckshot may be used for deer hunting on Bainbridge, Vashon, Maury, Fox, Marrowstone, Ketrone, Shaw, Indian and Harstene islands; Puget Island (Wahkiakum County); those lands between U. S. Highway No. 830 and the Columbia River between Cathlamet and Skamokawa; and that part of Game Management Unit 8-A in Thurston County.



GENERAL BUCK DEER SEASONS:

Bag Limit: One (1) buck deer with visible antlers (buck fawns not legal).

Note: A visible antler is hereby defined as a horn-like growth with velvet shed that is visible above the hair.

October 14 to November 5, both dates inclusive, in all counties in western Washington and in Asotin, Benton, Columbia, Garfield, Kittitas, Walla Walla and Yakima counties in eastern Washington.

October 14 to November 12, both dates inclusive, in Adams, Chelan, Douglas, Ferry, Franklin, Grant, Klickitat, Lincoln, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, Spokane, Stevens and Whitman counties; and in that part of Game Management Unit 9-D in Skamania County; EXCEPT closed in Game Management Unit 1-G South in Pend Oreille County.

EXTENDED BUCK DEER SEASONS:

Bag Limit: One (1) buck deer with visible antlers (buck fawns not legal).

November 18 to December 3, both dates inclusive, in Pend Oreille and Stevens counties, and in that part of Spokane County north of the Spokane River; EXCEPT closed in Game Management Unit 1-G South in Pend Oreille County.

November 25 to 27, both dates inclusive, in Game Management Units 9-C, 9-L and in that part of 9-D west of the Big White Salmon River.

HIGH MOUNTAIN BUCK DEER SEASON:

Bag Limit: One (1) buck deer with visible antlers (buck fawns not legal).

September 9 to October 1, both dates inclusive, in High Deer Area No. 1, High Deer Area No. 2 and Game Management Units 1-G North and 1-G South.

EITHER SEX DEER SEASONS:

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex.

Open Season: November 11 to 15, both dates inclusive, in Deer Area No. 3, described as follows:

Sherman Creek area (Ferry County): That part of Ferry County lying within 2½ miles of the west shore of Roosevelt Lake between the north boundary of the Colville Indian Reservation and Deadman Creek.

Open Season: November 25 to 28, both dates inclusive, in the following areas:

Deer Area No. 5: (San Juan County) San Juan and Lopez Islands.

Deer Area No. 6: (Snohomish County) Jim Creek Naval Radio Station Reservation.

#### CONTROLLED DEER HUNTING SEASONS:

It shall be lawful for any person who is the holder of a controlled hunt permit, issued under the provisions of this regulation, to hunt deer of either sex in the controlled hunt area for which the permit has been issued, PROVIDED, that all permittees must have in possession a 1967 hunting license and a 1967 deer tag.

Anyone wishing to apply for a controlled deer hunt must apply on the application card provided on the deer tag and fill in the following information:

- (1) Name and address of applicant.
- (2) Designate unit number or area and county in which the applicant desires to hunt.
- (3) Number of applicant's 1967 hunting license.

Controlled hunt applications may only be used by the person to whom the corresponding hunting permit was issued.

Only one person may make application for a controlled deer hunt on each application form.

Any person whose name is entered on more than one application for any controlled deer hunt will be eliminated entirely from all deer drawings.

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex per controlled hunt permittee.

Applications for controlled deer hunts must be received not later than 4:30 p.m., Daylight Saving Time, on September 7, 1967, at the Department of Game Office, 600 North Capitol Way, Olympia, Washington, or any Department of Game District (Regional) Office.

Open Season: November 4 to 19, both dates inclusive, in the following areas:

Elk Area No. 14--Pend Oreille Area (Spokane-Stevens-Pend Oreille Counties): All of Spokane, Stevens and Pend Oreille Counties EXCEPT closed in Game Management Unit 1-G South.

Elk Area No. 15, in Unit 3-B (Columbia-Garfield Counties): Those lands in Unit 3-B lying north of the Patrick Trail road and west of the Tucannon River road to the north boundary of the W. T. Wooten Game Range; AND those lands lying north and east of the elk drift fence (woven wire) from the Tucannon River road to the Mountain road.

Elk Area No. 16, in Unit 3-C (Asotin-Garfield Counties): Those lands in Unit 3-C lying north of the elk drift fence and Charley Creek road: Beginning at the Mountain road and following the elk drift fence easterly to its end near Iron Springs; thence following the cattle drift fence (barbed wire) to the Charley Creek road; thence easterly down the Charley Creek road to the Asotin Creek road; AND those lands lying east of the Asotin Creek road and the south fork of Asotin Creek to the junction of the south fork of Asotin Creek with the Umatilla National Forest boundary; AND those lands lying east and north of the Umatilla National Forest boundary, from the junction of the south fork of Asotin Creek to the Anatone-Wenatchee Guard Station road near Big Butte.

Elk Area No. 17, in Unit 3-F (Asotin-Garfield Counties): All lands in Unit 3-F lying outside the Umatilla National Forest boundary; AND IN ADDITION, those lands within the national forest within the watershed of Medicine Creek (Sec. 13, Twp. 7 N., R. 43 E.W.M.); and that area lying west of the Mountain road and south of the Sheep Driveway Trail, from the Saddle Butte to the Three Forks Trail; AND that area lying south of the Three Forks Trail and east of the Crooked Fork from the Three Forks Trail to the Oregon-Washington boundary.

Open Season: November 18 and 19 in Elk Area No. 13, described as follows:

Skagit-Whatcom Area (Skagit-Whatcom Counties): All of Skagit and Whatcom Counties, EXCEPT closed in Game Management Unit 6-C West.

Elk Area No. 10--Soleduck River Area (Clallam County): That part of Clallam County lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the junction of U.S. Highway No. 101 and the Maxfield Prairie road in Sec. 16, Twp. 29 N., R. 13 W.W.M.; thence easterly up the Maxfield Prairie road to Maxfield Creek; thence southerly down Maxfield Creek to the Soleduck River; thence south and westerly down the Soleduck River to bridge on U.S. Highway No. 101 in Sec. 29, Twp. 29 N., R. 14 W.W.M.; thence northerly up U.S. Highway No. 101 to the Maxfield Prairie road and point of beginning; AND IN ADDITION, all lands within one-half mile distance of the Soleduck River to the east in Sections 22, 27, 28 and 33, Twp. 29 N., R. 13 W.W.M.



Open Season: December 2 to 17, both dates inclusive, in Elk Area No. 12, described as follows:

Wenatchee Area (Chelan-Kittitas Counties): All of Game Management Unit 5-J and that part of Chelan County north of Unit 5-J.

Open Season: December 11 to 17, both dates inclusive, in Elk Area No. 11, described as follows:

Teanaway Area (Kittitas County): That part of Kittitas County which is north and east of U.S. Highway No. 10 (Snoqualmie Pass Highway) and west and north of U.S. Highway No. 97 (Blewett Pass Highway).

HUNTING RESTRICTION: During any open season for elk, it shall be unlawful to hunt any wild animals or wild birds with a rifle or shotgun with slugs therein, in those areas where elk may reasonably be expected, EXCEPT this regulation shall not be effective on November 4 and 5, 1967, when deer and elk seasons overlap; PROVIDED that this regulation shall not apply to those persons who have in their possession a valid supplemental elk tag and other permits required by law to hunt elk.

CONTROLLED ELK HUNTING SEASONS:

It shall be lawful for any person who is the holder of a controlled hunt permit, issued under the provisions of this regulation, to hunt elk of either sex in the controlled hunt area for which the permit has been issued, PROVIDED: That all permittees must have in possession a 1967 hunting license and a 1967 elk tag.

Anyone wishing to apply for a controlled elk hunt must apply on the application card provided on the elk tag and fill in the following information.

- (1) Name and address of applicant.
- (2) Designate unit number or area and county in which the applicant desires to hunt.
- (3) Number of applicant's 1967 hunting license.

Controlled hunt applications may only be used by the person to whom the corresponding hunting permit was issued.

Only one person may make application for a controlled elk hunt on each application form.

Two persons may be drawn together for a controlled elk hunt. Those wishing to do so MUST secure a partnership (double) application form from any license dealer and apply for the desired area in accordance with instructions printed on the back of this card.

Any person whose name is entered on more than one application for any controlled elk hunt will be eliminated entirely from all elk drawings.

Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex per controlled hunt permittee.

Applications for controlled elk hunts must be received not later than 4:30 p.m., Daylight Saving Time, on September 21, 1967, at the Department of Game Office, 600 North Capitol Way, Olympia, Washington, or any Department of Game District (Regional) Office.

CONTROLLED HUNT REGULATIONS APPLYING TO DEER AND ELK:

Applications received by the Department of Game which do not comply with the aforesaid requirements and those which are received after the closing date for these drawings will not be eligible to be drawn.

Persons whose names are drawn will receive special hunting permits by mail from the Department of Game.

Permits are not transferable.

The Director of Game shall designate two resident citizens of each county in which the drawings are held, who shall draw applications equal to the number of permits specified to be issued for each area shown in this regulation.

The applications drawn for each area will entitle the holders to a special hunting permit. Immediately after the drawings, the above persons shall sign an affidavit in duplicate before a notary public giving the number of cards they verified by count, also including the numbers of the cards they drew. One copy of the affidavit shall be filed with the auditor of each county where drawings are made, and the State of Washington Department of Game shall be furnished with a copy together with all cards used in the drawing.

USE OF DOGS PROHIBITED: It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or pursue any wild animal with the aid of a dog in any area of the state during the time when deer or elk are being lawfully hunted in such area.

BIG GAME BAG LIMITS: One deer and one elk is the legal limit per hunter during the 1967 hunting seasons.

HUNTING HOURS FOR DEER AND ELK: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

TRANSPORTATION: Big game with head; the head of each deer and elk killed shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation.

COUGAR (Mountain Lion) SEASON:

Open Season: Year-round in all counties of the State.

Exception - Okanogan County closed February, March and April, 1968.

Exception - Balance of eastern Washington closed January, February, March and April, 1968.

Bag Limit: One (1) cougar per calendar year, except no bag limit in Clallam, Jefferson, Grays Harbor and Mason Counties.

RABBITS: (Cottontail and Snowshoe)

Western Washington: September 9 to March 31, 1968, both dates inclusive, EXCEPT it shall be lawful to hunt rabbits during the entire year in Clark and Island counties, provided that no rabbits shall be hunted with dogs during April, May, June and July; AND IN ADDITION, it shall be unlawful to hunt rabbits with dogs on Whidbey Island during the deer season.

Eastern Washington: October 14 to March 31, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Additional open season on Snowshoe Rabbits: September 9 to October 13, both dates inclusive, in Chelan, Ferry, Kittitas, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, Spokane, Stevens and Yakima counties.

Bag Limit: Five (5) rabbits per day, straight or mixed bag, EXCEPT no bag limit in Clark, Island, Snohomish, Skagit and Whatcom Counties.

Hunting Hours for Rabbits: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset, EXCEPT hunting hours shall be the same as those for pheasants during the pheasant hunting season.

FUR-BEARING ANIMALS: (Except FISHER and WOLVERINE, season closed)

WESTERN WASHINGTON, including that part of Klickitat County west of the Big White Salmon River.

Clark County

Cowlitz County

Clallam County, including all parts within the boundaries of the National Forest.

Grays Harbor County, including all parts within the boundaries of the National Forest.

Jefferson County, including all parts within the boundaries of the National Forest; Penney Creek and its tributaries.

King County within the following described area: That area east of Highway 203 and north of Tolt and North Fork of Tolt River to the National Forest boundary; thence north along boundary to the Snohomish County line.

Mason County, including all parts within the boundaries of the National Forest.

Snohomish County within the following described area: Starting at the Tolt River bridge on Highway 203 just south of Carnation, proceed northerly on Highway 203, 17.5 miles to the Ben Howard road junction south of Monroe-Skykomish River bridge; thence easterly on Ben Howard and Mann roads 14.6 miles, and up Skykomish River to U.S.F.S. boundary; thence south and westerly on said National Forest boundary to the North Fork of the Tolt River, and the main Tolt River to bridge on Highway 203 and point of beginning.

BOW HUNTING LEGAL IN GENERAL SEASONS:

It is legal to hunt with a bow and arrow during any open season in any area that is open to hunting with firearms. The license requirements and bag and possession limits are the same as those which apply to firearm hunters.

AND BE IT RESOLVED that the foregoing Temporary Regulation No. 266 shall be forthwith entered and recorded in the minutes of the Game Commission and published at Olympia, Thurston County, Washington, as provided by law.
