

I further certify that I am the legal official in whose custody is placed the minutes of the State Game Commission.



N O T I C E

The following resolution and regulation was duly and regularly passed and adopted at special meetings, May 15, 1967, and August 21, 1967, of the State Game Commission for the State of Washington.

RESOLVED: That the Temporary Rule and Regulation herinafter set forth was duly ordered, adopted and promulgated by vote of the State Game Commission.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That Temporary Regulation No. 266 shall be amended to include the following open seasons, with bag and possession limits as specified for these seasons: It shall be lawful to hunt the following named upland game birds in the State of Washington during the following open season, with bag limits as prescribed for each species.

CHINESE PHEASANTS:GENERAL COCK PHEASANT SEASON:

Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to November 12 and November 23 to December 31, all dates inclusive, in all counties in the State.

Daily Bag Limit:

Eastern Washington - Three (3) cocks per day.

Western Washington - Two (2) cocks per day.

Possession Limit:

Statewide - Twelve (12) cocks in possession at any one time.

HEN PHEASANT SEASON:

Open Season: October 28 to November 12, both dates inclusive, on those lands that are east of the Columbia River, north of the Snake River and south of the Spokane River, which includes all of Adams, Douglas, Franklin, Grant, Lincoln and Whitman counties, and that part of Spokane County south of the Spokane River.

Daily Bag Limit: Not to exceed one (1) hen in the regular eastern Washington 3-bird limit.

Possession Limit: Not to exceed three (3) hens in the regular 12-bird limit.

QUAIL:Eastern Washington:

Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 21, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Western Washington:

Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to November 12, both dates inclusive.

Daily Bag Limit: Ten (10) quail per day.

Possession Limit: Thirty (30) quail in possession at any one time.

NOTICE 720

CHUKAR, HUNGARIAN AND RED-LEGGED PARTRIDGE:

General Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 21, 1968, both dates inclusive, in all counties of eastern Washington.

Daily Bag and Possession Limits: Five (5) partridges per day, straight or mixed bag; fifteen (15) partridges in possession at any one time.

EXCEPTION: Eight (8) partridges per day, straight or mixed bag; twenty-four (24) partridges in possession at any one time, in Asotin and Garfield counties and that part of Whitman County south of the Washtucna-Colfax-Pullman-Moscow Highway; and in that part of Columbia County that is north and east of the Tucannon River.

SHARP-TAILED GROUSE:

General Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to October 22, both dates inclusive, in all counties in eastern Washington.

Daily Bag Limit: Two (2) grouse per day.

Season Limit: Four (4) grouse per season.

SAGE GROUSE (Sage Hen):

General Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to October 22, both dates inclusive, in all counties in eastern Washington.

Daily Bag Limit: One (1) sage grouse per day.

Season Limit: Two (2) sage grouse per season.

WILD TURKEY:

Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., and October 15, in all counties in eastern Washington.

Daily Bag Limit: One (1) turkey per day.

Season Limit: One (1) turkey per season.

HUNTING HOURS:

Lawful hunting hours for all upland game birds in the State of Washington shall be as shown in the following table:

Note: :

Eastern Washington includes all counties east of the summit of the Cascade Mountains and that part of Klickitat County east of the Big White Salmon River.

Western Washington includes all counties west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains and that part of Klickitat County west of the Big White Salmon River.

AND BE IT RESOLVED that the foregoing Temporary Regulation No. 271 shall be forthwith entered and recorded in the minutes of the State Game Commission and published at Olympia, Thurston County, Washington, as provided by law, for one issue.

1967 Migratory Waterfowl and Migratory Game Bird Regulations
For The State of Washington

The following resolution and regulation was duly and regularly passed and adopted at a special meeting, August 21, 1967, of the State Game Commission for the State of Washington.

RESOLVED: That it shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl and migratory game birds in the State of Washington at any time except during the following open seasons, with bag limits as prescribed for each species. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that it shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl and migratory game birds on lands set aside as state game reserves where the hunting of such migratory waterfowl and migratory game birds is prohibited. PROVIDED, FURTHER, that all other migratory waterfowl and migratory game birds not specifically mentioned in the following open seasons are protected by closed seasons, and it shall be unlawful to hunt or possess the same at any time.

DUCKS, except mergansers:Open Seasons:

Western Washington: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 7, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Eastern Washington: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 21, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Daily Bag Limits:

Western Washington: Five (5) ducks, straight or mixed bag, Provided such bag limit may not contain more than two (2) canvasbacks.

Eastern Washington: Six (6) ducks, straight or mixed bag, Provided such bag limit may not contain more than two (2) canvasbacks.

Possession Limits:

Western Washington: Ten (10) ducks, straight or mixed bag, Provided such possession limit may not contain more than two (2) canvasbacks.

Eastern Washington: Twelve (12) ducks, straight or mixed bag, Provided such possession limit may not contain more than two (2) canvasbacks.



MERGANSERS:

Open Seasons:

Western Washington: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 7, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Eastern Washington: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 21, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Daily Bag Limit: Five (5) mergansers, singly or in the aggregate, Provided that such limit may not contain more than one (1) hooded merganser.

Possession Limit: Ten (10) mergansers singly or in the aggregate, Provided that such limit may not contain more than two (2) hooded mergansers.

GEESE, except Black Brant: (Season closed on Swan)

Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 11, 1968, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the State

EXCEPTION: It shall be unlawful to hunt, take or pursue geese in Adams, Benton, Douglas, Franklin, Grant, Lincoln, Okanogan, Spokane and Walla Walla Counties, and that part of Klickitat County lying east of the Satus Pass Highway (U.S. Highway 97) at any time other than November 23, December 25, January 1 and 11, and Saturdays, Sundays and Wednesdays during the period October 14 to January 11, 1968.

Daily Bag Limit: Three (3) geese of any kind, straight or mixed bag, PROVIDED that such bag limit may not contain more than one (1) Ross's goose.

Possession Limit: Six (6) geese of any kind, straight or mixed bag, PROVIDED that such possession limit may not contain more than one (1) Ross's goose.

BLACK SEA BRANT:

Open Season: November 18 to February 18, 1968, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the State.

Daily Bag Limit: Four (4) black sea brant per day.

Possession Limit: Eight (8) black sea brant in possession at any one time.

COOT:

Open Seasons:

Western Washington: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 7, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Eastern Washington: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to January 21, 1968, both dates inclusive.

Daily Bag Limit: Twenty-five (25) coot per day.

Possession Limit: Twenty-five (25) coot in possession at any one time.

WILSON'S SNIPE OR JACKSNIPE:

Open Season: October 14, starting at noon, D.S.T., to December 2, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the State.

Daily Bag Limit: Eight (8) snipe per day.

Possession Limit: Sixteen (16) snipe in possession at any one time.

HUNTING HOURS:

Lawful hunting hours for all migratory game birds in the State of Washington shall be as shown in the following table:

For ducks and coot in eastern Washington, the lawful hunting period shall include an additional thirty minutes beyond the closing time shown in the above table.

Legal hunting hours for brant after January 21, 1968, shall be one-half hour before sunrise to sunset, as taken at Seattle, Washington.

Note:

Eastern Washington includes all counties east of the summit of the Cascade Mountains and that part of Klickitat County east of the Big White Salmon River.

Western Washington includes all counties west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains and that part of Klickitat County west of the Big White Salmon River.

MEANS OF TAKING:

It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or take migratory waterfowl or migratory game birds by the aid or use, directly or indirectly, of shelled, shucked, or unshucked corn, or of wheat or other grain, salt or other feed that has been so deposited, distributed, or scattered as to constitute for such birds a lure, attraction or enticement to, on, or over the area, where hunters are attempting to take them. Provided, however, such birds may be taken over properly shocked corn and standing crops of corn, wheat or other grain or feed, and grains found scattered solely as a result of agricultural harvesting; and it shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl by the use, directly or indirectly, of live duck or goose decoys, or by the use or aid of electrical or mechanical recordings or reproductions of bird calls or sounds, or recorded imitations of such calls or sounds.

It shall be unlawful for any person to shoot at any game bird from a power boat or sail boat, and it shall be unlawful to use any such boat for the purpose of pursuing, following, concentrating, driving, disturbing or stirring up waterfowl, except, it shall be lawful to hunt from a power boat or sail boat which is resting at anchor or fastened within or tied immediately alongside of any type of stationary hunting blind.

Any boat with an outboard motor attached is considered a power boat. If the outboard motor is detached and placed on the floor of the boat, it is no longer considered a power boat. It is legal to use a power boat for transportation to and from the hunting area and for picking up dead or injured birds.

The foregoing Temporary Regulation No. 270 shall be forthwith entered and recorded in the minutes of the Commission and published at Olympia, Thurston County, Washington, as provided by law, for one issue.
