1970 Hunting Seasons and Game Bag Limits


are hereby approved and adopted as the 1970 seasonal rules of

1970 HUNTING SEASONS AND

GAME BAG LIMITS

(Until Changed by Order of the State Game Commission)

RESOLVED: That it shall be unlawful to hunt upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals in the State of Washington at any time except during the following open seasons, with bag limits as prescribed for each species, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that it shall be unlawful to hunt upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals on lands set aside as state game reserves where the hunting of such upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals is prohibited, PROVIDED, FURTHER, that all other game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals not specifically mentioned in the following open seasons, are protected by closed seasons, and it shall be unlawful to hunt, or possess the same at any time.

UPLAND BIRD HUNTING SEASONS

BLUE GROUSE, RUFFED GROUSE AND SPRUCE (FRANKLIN) GROUSE:

General Open Season:

September 12 to November 22, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state.

Bag and Possession Limit: Three (3) grouse per day or a total of nine (9) in possession at any one time, straight or mixed bag.

EARLY CHUKAR, REDLEG AND HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE SEASON:

September 12 to October 9, both dates inclusive, in Asotin and Garfield Counties; in that part of Whitman County south of the Washtucna-Colfax-Pullman-Moscow highway; in that part of Columbia County that is north and east of the Tucannon River; and Game Management Unit 4-K in Kittitas and Chelan Counties.

Bag and Possession Limit: Ten (10) partridge (chukar, redleg or Hungarian) per day, or a total of thirty (30) partridge in possession at any one time, straight or mixed bag; EXCEPT the bag and possession limit shall be six (6) and eighteen (18) in Game Management Unit 4-K in Kittitas and Chelan Counties.

CHINESE PHEASANT; QUAIL; CHUKAR, REDLEG AND HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE; SHARP-TAILED GROUSE, AND SAGE HEN

General Open Season: Starts October 10 (Noon opening).

TURKEY:

General Open Season: Starts October 10 (See Official Hunting Hours Table).

CLOSING DATES AND OTHER GENERAL HUNTING REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THESE UPLAND GAME BIRDS WILL BE ESTABLISHED IN AUGUST AND WILL BE PUBLISHED IN ENTIRETY IN THE GAME BIRD PAMPHLET.

## DEER HUNTING SEASONS

### BAG LIMIT:

One (1) deer per hunter during the 1970 hunting seasons as listed in this pamphlet.

Buck Deer Seasons: Open only to the taking of male deer with visible antlers (buck fawns illegal), and a visible antler is defined as a horn-like growth with velvet shed that is visible above the hair.

Either-sex Deer Seasons: Open to the taking of any deer, either with or without antlers.

### TAGGING REQUIREMENTS:

Deer Tags: Every person, while hunting deer, must have in his possession a supplemental deer tag. Every person, after killing a deer, shall immediately cut out from his supplemental tag the two appropriate notches designating the month and day the animal was killed, and shall immediately attach this tag to the carcass. It is unlawful to possess a deer without a valid tag attached.

### FIREARM RESTRICTIONS:

Special Shotgun and Bow Hunting Areas: Only shotguns firing slugs or buckshot and bow and arrow may be used for deer hunting on Bainbridge, Vashon, Maury, Guemes, Camano, Marrowstone, Fox, Ketron, Shaw, Indian and Hartstene Islands; Point Roberts (Whatcom County); that part of Game Management Unit 8-J in Thurston County; that part of Game Management Unit 8-J in Mason County that is South of Hammersley Inlet; and Deer Area No. 1 in Spokane County.

### GENERAL BUCK SEASONS: (Only buck deer with visible antlers)

October 10 to November 4 and November 7 and 8, all dates inclusive, in Asotin, Benton, Clallam, Clark, Columbia, Cowlitz, Garfield, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, Kittitas, Lewis, Mason, Pacific, Pierce, Skamania, Thurston, Wahkiakum, Walla Walla and Yakima Counties.

October 10 to November 8, both dates inclusive, in Adams, Chelan, Douglas, Ferry, Franklin, Grant, Island, King, Kitsap, Klickitat, Lincoln, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, San Juan, Skagit, Snohomish, Spokane, Stevens, Whatcom and Whitman Counties.

### LATE BUCK SEASON: (Only buck deer with visible antlers)

November 21 to December 6 both dates inclusive, in Pend Oreille, and Stevens Counties, and in that part of Spokane County north of the Spokane River.

### EARLY BUCK SEASON: (Only buck deer with visible antlers)

September 12 to 27, both dates inclusive, in Early Buck Area No. 1; Early Buck Area No. 2 and Early Buck Area No. 3.

CLOSING DATE: Applications for controlled deer hunts must be received not later than 4:30 p.m., Daylight Saving Time, on September 3, 1970, at the Game Department Olympia office or at any Game Department regional office. Each hunter may apply for only ONE controlled deer hunt during the 1970 hunting season.

SPECIAL CLOSURE NOTICE

The Little Pend Oreille Wildlife Recreation Area in Stevens County is closed to all hunting except during the period of October 10 to December 31.

SPECIAL CLOSURE NOTICE (continued)

Parker Lake Closure. All lands south of the Ruby Creek Road; east of Range Line between Ranges 42 E and 43 E just east of Timber Mountain summit; north of the Tacoma Creek Road; and west of B.P.A. power line; closed to all hunting October 10 to December 31.

These closures were established to provide a protected area for the Air Force Military Survival Training Program.

Cathlamet Closure: Those lands between U. S. Highway No. 830 and the Columbia River between Cathlamet and Skamokawa, and all of Puget Island in Wahkiakum County; closed to all deer hunting.

This closure is established to protect the rare Columbia Whitetail Deer.

ELK HUNTING SEASONS

BAG LIMIT:

One (1) elk per hunter during the 1970 hunting seasons as listed in this pamphlet.

Bull Elk Seasons: Open only to the taking of male elk with visible antlers.

Either-sex Elk Seasons: Open to the taking of any elk, either with or without antlers.

TAGGING REQUIREMENTS:

Elk Tags: Every person, while hunting elk, must have in his possession a supplemental elk tag. Every person, after killing an elk, shall immediately cut out from his supplemental tag the two appropriate notches designating the month and day the animal was killed, and shall immediately attach this tag to the carcass. It is unlawful to possess an elk without a valid tag attached.

SPECIAL HUNTING RESTRICTION:

Hunting Restriction: During any open season for elk, it shall be unlawful to hunt any wild animals or wild birds with a rifle or shotgun with slugs therein, in those areas where elk may reasonably be expected, PROVIDED that this regulation shall not apply to those persons who have in their possession a valid supplemental elk tag and other permits required by law to hunt elk; PROVIDED, further that this regulation shall not apply to persons hunting in areas open for the taking of both deer and elk.

GENERAL BULL ELK SEASON: (Only bull elk with visible antlers)

Open Season: November 7 to 22, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state; except closed in Game Management Units 1-G, and 1-E.

EITHER-SEX PERMIT CONTROLLED ELK SEASONS: (Open to permit holders only)

WHO MAY APPLY: Any person with a valid 1970 Washington hunting license; EXCEPT those who received elk permits in 1968 or 1969.

Application: The 1970 elk tag will have attached a card bearing the same number as the applicant's elk tag, which will be the only form that will be accepted as an application for a controlled elk hunt.

EITHER-SEX PERMIT CONTROLLED ELK SEASONS: (Continued)

CLOSING DATE: Applications for controlled elk hunts must be received not later than 4:30 p.m., Daylight Saving Time, on September 17, 1970, at the Game Department Olympia office or at any Game Department regional office.

Permit Restrictions: It shall be unlawful for any person receiving an elk permit to apply for the next two succeeding years. Persons who received elk permits for the 1968 or 1969 elk seasons will be ineligible to apply for an elk permit in 1970. Persons who receive elk permits for the 1970 elk season will be ineligible to apply for an elk permit in 1971 and 1972. Any person applying for an elk permit during the period when ineligible shall automatically be disqualified for an additional two years.

# BOW AND ARROW SEASONS

## BOW HUNTING LEGAL IN GENERAL SEASONS:

It is legal to hunt with a bow and arrow during any open season in any area that is open to hunting with firearms. The license requirements and bag and possession limits are the same as those which apply to firearm hunters. Bag and possession limits on game species in the following bow seasons are not additions to the general bag and possession limits.

## BLACK BEAR HUNTING SEASONS

NOTE: Grizzly Bear protected by closed season.

### TAGGING REQUIREMENTS:

Bear Tags: Every person, while hunting bear, must have in his possession a supplemental bear tag. Every person, after killing a bear, shall immediately cut out from his supplemental tag the two appropriate notches designating the month and day the animal was killed, and shall immediately attach this tag to the carcass. It is unlawful to possess a bear without a valid tag attached.

### Western Washington:

Bag Limit: No bag limit, EXCEPT three (3) bear per year in King, Skagit, Snohomish and Whatcom Counties (Tag required for each bear taken in all counties).

### Open Seasons:

April 1 to November 8, both dates inclusive, outside the National Forest boundary in Lewis, Pierce and Skamania County and in all of Clallam, Clark, Cowlitz, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, Kitsap, Mason, Pacific, Thurston and Wahkiakum Counties. This area will be open April 1, 1971, with closing date to be established later.

July 1 to November 8, both dates inclusive, outside the National Forest boundary and Ross Lake National Recreation Area in King, Skagit, Snohomish and Whatcom Counties.

September 12 to November 8, both dates inclusive, in those parts of King, Lewis, Pierce, Skagit, Skamania, Snohomish and Whatcom Counties, that are within the National Forest boundary and Ross Lake National Recreation Area; and that part of Klickitat County that is west of the Big White Salmon River.

### Eastern Washington:

Bag Limit: One (1) bear.

### Open Seasons:

September 12 to October 11, Both dates inclusive, in Ferry, Lincoln, Pend Oreille, Spokane, Stevens and Whitman Counties, EXCEPT closed in Parker Lake Area of Pend Oreille County after October 9.

September 12 to November 8, both dates inclusive, in Adams, Asotin, Chelan, Benton, Columbia, Douglas, Franklin, Grant, Garfield, Kittitas, Okanogan, Walla Walla and Yakima Counties; AND in that part of Klickitat County east of the Big White Salmon River.

## COUGAR (Mountain Lion) SEASON

Bag Limit: One (1) cougar per calendar year, EXCEPT no bag limit in Clallam, Jefferson, Grays Harbor and Mason Counties.

### Open Seasons:

May 1 to January 14, 1971, both dates inclusive, statewide, EXCEPT Clallam, Chelan Ferry, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, Mason, Okanogan and Pacific Counties. This area opens May 1, 1971, and closing dates will be set later.

May 1 to January 31, 1971, both dates inclusive, in Chelan, Ferry and Okanogan Counties. This area opens May 1, 1971 and closing dates will be set later.

Year-round, in Clallam, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, Mason and Pacific Counties.

Note: All cougar kills should be reported to a Wildlife Agent, Regional Game Department Office or 600 No. Capitol Way, Olympia, giving name and address of the hunter making kill.

## RABBIT SEASON

### Cottontail and Snowshoe Rabbits:

Bag Limit: Five (5) per day, EXCEPT no bag limit in Island, Snohomish, Skagit and Whatcom Counties.

#### Western Washington:

Open Season: September 12 to March 31, 1971, both dates inclusive, EXCEPT it shall be lawful to hunt rabbits during the entire year in Island County, provided that no rabbits shall be hunted with dogs during April, May, June and July; AND IN ADDITION, it shall be unlawful to hunt rabbits with dogs on Whidbey Island during the deer season.

#### Eastern Washington:

Open Season: October 10 to February 28, 1971, both dates inclusive.

#### Additional Open Season on Snowshoe Rabbits:

September 12 to October 9, both dates inclusive, in Chelan, Ferry, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, Spokane, Stevens, Kittitas and Yakima Counties.

### Black-tailed Jackrabbits: (Hunting License Required)

Bag Limit: No bag limit.

Open Season: Year round.

### White-tailed Jackrabbits: Season closed.

San Juan Rabbit hunting will be regulated by county ordinance. Check local regulations. Local safety regulations prohibit night hunting with firearms. A license is not required for hunting San Juan Rabbits.

Bobcat, Raccoon and Rockchuck (Yellow-bellied Marmot): (Hunting License Required)

Bag Limit: No bag limit.

Open Season: Year round for 1970. (Some closed seasons will be established for 1971 at a later date).

Minimum caliber to be .40, such measurement to be taken from land to land in the barrel.

## BOW REGULATIONS: (Crossbows unlawful)

- a. Any person hunting deer, bear, elk, mountain goat, mountain sheep or cougar with a bow and arrow must be equipped with a bow that possesses not less than forty (40) pounds of pull measured at twenty-eight (28) inches draw length, and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt said animals with a bow and arrow unless he is so equipped.
- b. It shall be unlawful to hunt deer, bear, elk, mountain goat, mountain sheep or cougar with any arrows other than arrows having sharp broad-head blade or blades at least seven-eighths (7/8) inches wide. The broadhead must be unbarbed and completely closed at the back end of the blade or blades by a smooth, unbroken surface starting at maximum blade width, forming a smooth line toward the feather end of the shaft, and such line shall not angle toward the point.
- c. It shall be unlawful to hunt wild animals with any firearm in any area designated for bow and arrow hunting only, during the bow and arrow season specified for that area.

### MOUNTAIN GOAT SEASON

Open Season: September 12 to November 1, both dates inclusive. Nine hundred twenty-five (925) Special Permits will be issued.

For details on open areas, controlled hunt instructions and regulations, see separate Mountain Goat-Mountain Sheep pamphlet available at license dealers. Closing date for applications is July 24, 1970.

### MOUNTAIN SHEEP SEASON

These are lawful hunting hours for deer; elk; mountain goat; mountain sheep; blue, ruffed and spruce grouse; turkey; mourning doves and band-tailed pigeons, during the entire seasons established for these species; and for the portions of the bear and cougar seasons falling within this period. These hours also apply for chukar, Hungarian and red-legged partridge during the early season.

The above table also applies to Cottontail and Snowshoe rabbit hunting, except during the pheasant seasons, when rabbits may be hunted only during the hours established for pheasant hunting.

Hunting hours for upland bird seasons, starting October 10, will be shown in the Game Bird Pamphlet.

Before September 1, 1970, and after January 31, 1971, legal hunting hours for all species open to hunting shall be one-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

There shall be no closed hunting hours on Black-tailed Jackrabbit, Raccoon and Bobcat.

# MOUNTAIN GOAT & SHEEP HUNTING SEASONS

## OPEN SEASONS:

**Mountain Goat:** September 12 to November 1, both dates inclusive, in the designated goat management units.

**Mountain Sheep,** September 26 to October 4, both dates inclusive, in the designated sheep management units.

## WHO MAY APPLY:

**Mountain Goat:** Anyone with a 1970 Washington hunting license; **EXCEPT** those who received **Goat Permits** during 1968 and 1969. <sup>1970</sup>

**Mountain Sheep:** Any resident with a ~~1969~~ <sup>1970</sup> Washington hunting license; **EXCEPT** those who received **Sheep Permits** during 1966, 1967, 1968, and 1969.

## BAG LIMITS:

**Mountain Goat:** One (1) adult goat of either sex with horns four (4) inches or longer.

**Mountain Sheep:** One (1) ram with horns being three-quarters ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) of a full curl or better.

## SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS:

It shall be unlawful for any person receiving a **Goat Permit** to apply for the next two succeeding years. Any person applying for a **Goat Permit** during the period when ineligible shall automatically be disqualified for an additional two years.

It shall be unlawful for any person receiving a **Sheep Permit** to apply for the next five succeeding years. Any person applying for a **Sheep Permit** during the period when ineligible shall automatically be disqualified for an additional five years.

## NOTE:

Persons receiving a permit to hunt goat or sheep must purchase a tag before hunting.

The hunter must have this tag in his possession while hunting. **IMMEDIATELY** after killing a goat or sheep, the appropriate tag **MUST** be notched and attached to the carcass.
