A RESOLUTION Relating to rules and regulations of the Department of Game
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GAME COMMISSION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF GAME, STATE OF
WASHINGTON:

Section 1. The annexed regulations, to-wit:

1971 Fishing Seasons, Rules, and Regulations are hereby approved and
adopted as rules and regulations of the Department of Game.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for game fish in the State of
Washington at any time or at any place or in any manner except as provided
for by rule and regulations of the State Game Commission.


Sec. 3. All opening and closing dates are included in all open
seasons.

Sec. 4. This resolution and annexed regulations, after being first
recorded as an administrative order in the Order Register of the Department
of Game, shall be forwarded to the Code Reviser for filing pursuant to RCW
34.04 and WAC 1-12-050.

THE DEPARTMENT OF GAME

CATCH AND POSSESSION LIMITS:

Trout and Steelhead--Six pounds and 1 fish, not to exceed 12 fish but shall not include more than 2 steelhead over 20" in length. Note: A person may take 2 trout regardless of weight.

Exception--The limit for an unlicensed fisherman under 16 years of age shall be 4 pounds and 1 fish not to exceed 8 fish or 2 steelhead over 20" in length.

Exception--2 fish per day over 15" in length in Bayley Lake, Stevens County, and 2 fish per day over 12" in length in Tempo Lake, Thurston County.

Exception--5 fish per day in Ryderwood Lake, Cowlitz County; Baker Pond, Garfield County; Chopaka Lake, Okanogan County; Fish Lake, Spokane County. (Weight limit also applies).

Exception--7 fish per day in Lake Desire and Rattlesnake Lake, King County; Bonney Lake, Pierce County; Pass Lake, Skagit County; Ebey Lake, Blackman's Lake and Little Cavanaugh Lake, Snohomish County; Padden Lake, Whatcom County. (Weight limit also applies).

Exception--25 silver trout per day in addition to the regular daily catch limit in Lake Chelan, Chelan County and Bumping Lake, Yakima County.

Silver Trout (bonus limit)--In addition to the regular daily catch limit shown above, it shall be lawful to catch an additional 4 pounds of silver trout, but not to exceed 8 additional silver trout from the following lakes:

- Clallam County.....Lake Sutherland
- Chelan County.....Lake Wenatchee
- Grant County.....Banks Lake
- Grant County.....Billy Clapp Lake
- Kittitas County.....Lake Cle Elum
- Kittitas County.....Cooper Lake
- Kittitas County.....Kachess Lake
- Kittitas County.....Lake Keechelus
- Okanogan County.....Bonaparte Lake
- Pierce County.....American Lake
- San Juan County.....Mountain Lake
- Thurston County.....Summit Lake
- Whatcom County.....Samish Lake
- Whatcom County.....Lake Whatcom
- Yakima County.....Rimrock Lake

Whitefish --Fifteen (no weight limit)

Note: A person may take a limit of whitefish in addition to a limit of trout.

Bass--Twenty pounds and 1 bass, not to exceed 10 bass. Note: It shall be lawful to take a limit of bass in addition to a limit of trout.

Bluegills, Catfish, Perch, Crappie, Ling, Sunfish, Walleye--No catch limit

POSSESSION LIMITS:

Not to exceed one day's catch limit.

EXCEPTION: Lawful to possess 4 trout over 20" in length regardless of weight during the winter season on steelhead management waters December 1 to March 31.

NOTE: The weight or length limits as used in this regulation shall mean the weight or length before any part of the fish is removed or otherwise processed.

SIZE LIMITS:

Bass, Bluegills, Catfish, Perch, Crappie, Ling, Sunfish, Walleye--No size limit.

Steelhead and Other Trout:

Minimum length limit 10" during the winter season on Steelhead Management Waters.

Trout and other game fish--Minimum length of 6",

EXCEPTIONS: See individual counties for any exceptions to above size limits.

WEEKLY CATCH LIMIT:

The weekly catch limit shall not exceed two day's catch limit. The term "week" as used herein shall begin on Sunday morning and end on Saturday at midnight.

ANNUAL CATCH LIMIT--STEELHEAD ONLY:

Thirty steelhead over 20" in length, not to exceed 20 steelhead taken from the Columbia River and tributaries above Bonneville Dam, including the Snake River and its tributaries.

Note: Any steelhead over 20" in length caught from the main Columbia River below Bonneville Dam shall be recorded on the punch card as Lower Columbia River.

WINTER SEASON--BOAT FISHING UNLAWFUL:

It shall be unlawful to fish from a boat or any other floating device during the winter seasons in any of the following waters:

Cedar River

Cowlitz River from barrier dam at Salmon Hatchery to mouth of Mill Creek.

Elwha River from mouth to lower power dam.

Green River from the Renton Junction Bridge to its source.

Hoh River above Highway 101 Bridge--March 1 to March 31.

Skykomish River from Highway No. 2 bridge east of Goldbar to its source.

Stillaguamish River, North Fork, from mouth to source.

Toutle River upstream from Tower Bridge.

FISHING FROM BOATS PROPELLED BY MACHINERY PROHIBITED:

No person shall fish from any boat, raft, or other floating device while it is being propelled by machinery on the following water during the winter season:

Sauk River

GENERAL SUMMER SEASON--BOAT FISHING UNLAWFUL:

It shall be unlawful to fish from a boat or any other floating device in the following waters:

Clark, Cowlitz and

Skamania counties.....Lewis River Power Canal

between Swift Dam No. 1
and Swift Dam No. 2.

Columbia County.....Any of the impoundments adjacent to the Tucannon River.

Walla Walla County.....Quarry Pond

Whatcom County.....Weiser Lake from January 1
to 15 and November 1 to
December 31.

Whitman County.....Pampa Pond.

Yakima County.....Freeway Lake and Resthaven Lake

FISHING FROM BOATS WITH MOTORS UNLAWFUL:

No person shall fish from any boat, raft or any other floating device equipped with a motor in the following named waters:

<u>Cowlitz County</u>	Kalama River upstream from Modrow Bridge
<u>King County</u>	Rattlesnake Lake
<u>Lewis County</u>	Carlisle Lake
<u>Snohomish County</u>	Lake Fontal and Spada Lake
<u>Walla Walla County</u>	Mill Creek Reservoir
<u>Whatcom County</u>	Padden Lake

FLY FISHING ONLY:

No person shall fish from any boat, raft, or any other floating device equipped with a motor in waters which are restricted to fly fishing only, EXCEPT Merrill Lake, Cowlitz County. The following waters are open to fly fishing only:

<u>Cowlitz County</u>	Kalama River from Summers Creek upstream to 6420 road about 1 mile above gate at end of County road Merrill Lake
<u>Ferry County</u>	Long Lake
<u>Mason County</u>	Cady Lake
<u>Okanogan County</u>	Aeneas Lake, Chopaka Lake and Moccasin Lake
<u>Pend Oreille County</u>	Brown's Lake and Inlet Stream
<u>Pierce County</u>	Bonney Lake
<u>Skagit County</u>	Pass Lake
<u>Skagit and Snohomish Counties</u>	North Fork of Stillaguamish River EXCEPT during the winter season.
<u>Skamania County</u>	Wind River, beginning 1-1/2 miles upstream from the high bridge on Wind River to the south boundary of Sec. 36, T. 4 N., R. 7-1/2 E., as posted, a distance of about 2-1/2 miles
<u>Snohomish County</u>	Ebey Lake
<u>Stevens County</u>	Bayley Lake
<u>Thurston County</u>	Tempo Lake (regulation does not apply to juveniles under age 9)
<u>Yakima County</u>	Leech Lake (White Pass)

BULL FROGS:

Means of Taking: It shall be unlawful to take bull frogs in any other manner than by angling, hand dip netting, spearing, or with any bow and arrow. The use of an artificial light is lawful.

Open Season: It shall be lawful to take bull frogs only at such times and in such waters as are open for the taking of game fish.

Catch Limit: The daily catch limit and possession limit on bull frogs shall be ten (10).

QUALITY FISHING WATERS--The following waters shall be known and may be cited as "Quality Fishing Waters" and shall be subject to seasons, catch limits, means of taking, and restrictions as herein designated:

The following restrictions shall apply to waters designated as
"Quality Fishing Waters":

- A. Limit: 3 trout per day over 12" in length.
- B. Only artificial flies or lures allowed.
- C. Bait, including artificial fish eggs, unlawful.
- D. Double or treble hooks unlawful,
- E. No person shall fish from any boat, raft or any other floating device equipped with a motor.

FEEDING UNLAWFUL:

It is unlawful to place or deposit any fish eggs, or fish roe or food, or other substance for the purpose of attracting, collecting or feeding fish in any waters of the state Except in the silver trout lakes listed on page 1 and Baker Lake, Whatcom County, Lake Shannon, Skagit County, Lake Stevens, Snohomish County, and Lakes Union, Sammamish, and Washington in King County.

WATERDOGS PROHIBITED:

It is unlawful to use waterdogs or salamanders for fishing in Silver Lake, Cowlitz County.
