22 rules under chapter 34.05 RCW to assure uniformity in the information  
23 districts are required to report under subsections (1) through (4) of  
24 this section. In developing rules, the superintendent of public  
25 instruction shall consult with school districts, including  
26 administrative and counseling personnel, with regard to the methods  
27 through which information is to be collected and reported.

28 ((+3)) (6) In reporting on the causes or reasons, or both,  
29 attributed to students for having dropped out of school, school  
30 building officials shall, to the extent reasonably practical, obtain

1 such information directly from students. In lieu of obtaining such  
2 information directly from students, building principals and counselors  
3 shall identify the causes or reasons, or both, based on their  
4 professional judgment.
