1 AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition and financial aid;
2 amending RCW 28B.10.265, 28B.15.031, 28B.15.065, 28B.15.067,
3 28B.15.070, 28B.15.202, 28B.15.225, 28B.15.380, 28B.15.402, 28B.15.502,
4 28B.15.520, 28B.15.522, 28B.15.527, 28B.15.535, 28B.15.540, 28B.15.543,
5 28B.15.545, 28B.15.546, 28B.15.556, 28B.15.558, 28B.15.615, 28B.15.620,
6 28B.15.628, 28B.15.725, 28B.15.730, 28B.15.740, 28B.15.750, 28B.15.756,
7 28B.35.361, 28B.40.361, 28B.50.259, 28B.70.050, 28B.80.580, 28C.04.545,
8 82.33.020, 28B.102.020, 28B.102.050, 28B.101.040, and 28B.12.040;
9 reenacting and amending RCW 28B.15.014 and 28B.15.100; adding new

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** This act shall be known as the access to
2 higher education act.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** The legislature finds that the higher
4 education and work force training of all of the state's citizens who
5 desire the opportunity and can benefit from that education and training
6 are vital to the state's social welfare and economic vitality.
7 Individuals who achieve higher levels of education and training will,
8 on average, live longer, healthier, and more productive and secure
9 lives than will people with lesser levels of education and training.

10 The legislature further finds that the current system of federal,
11 state, and institutional financial aid is inadequate to meet the
12 financial needs of the citizens of Washington who want to pursue higher
13 education and training.

14 The legislature also finds that by providing increased flexibility
15 to institutions of higher education to set tuition fees, grant waivers
16 and exemptions from those fees, and manage revenue from tuition fees,
17 the institutions can be administered more efficiently and be more
18 responsive to the needs of the students at those institutions.

19 By this act, the legislature intends to establish a comprehensive
20 system of higher education tuition management that provides flexibility
21 and efficiency for institutions, and that will, through an improved
22 financial aid program, strive to enable every Washington resident, who
23 prepares himself or herself through appropriate and sufficient high
24 school coursework, to obtain a college or university education
25 regardless of his or her financial status.

26 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.10.265 and 1985 c 390 s 1 are each amended to read
27 as follows:

1 Subject to the limitations of section 44 of this act, the boards of
2 regents of the state universities and the boards of trustees of the
3 regional universities, The Evergreen State College, and the community
4 and technical colleges may waive all or a portion of the tuition,
5 operating, and services and activities fees for children of any person
6 who was a Washington domiciliary and who within the past eleven years
7 has been determined by the federal government to be a prisoner of war
8 or missing in action in Southeast Asia, including Korea, or who shall
9 become so hereafter(~~(, shall be admitted to and attend any public~~
10 ~~institution of higher education within the state without the necessity~~
11 ~~of paying any tuition and service and activities' fees for any and all~~
12 ~~courses offered at any time including summer term whether attending on~~
13 ~~a part time or full time basis: PROVIDED, That such child shall)), if~~
14 the children meet such other educational qualifications as such
15 institution of higher education shall deem reasonable and necessary
16 under the circumstances. (~~Affected institutions shall in their~~
17 ~~preparation of future budgets include therein costs resultant from such~~
18 ~~tuition loss for reimbursement thereof from appropriations of state~~
19 ~~funds.)) Applicants for free or reduced tuition shall provide~~
20 institutional administrative personnel with documentation of their
21 rights under this section.

22 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28B.15.014 and 1989 c 306 s 3 and 1989 c 290 s 3 are
23 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

24 The boards of regents of the state universities and the boards of
25 trustees of the regional universities, The Evergreen State College, and
26 the community colleges may exempt the following nonresidents (~~shall be~~
27 ~~exempted)) from paying all or a portion of the nonresident tuition~~
28 (~~and)) fees differential:~~

1 (1) Any person who resides in the state of Washington and who holds
2 a graduate service appointment designated as such by a public
3 institution of higher education or is employed for an academic
4 department in support of the instructional or research programs
5 involving not less than twenty hours per week during the term such
6 person shall hold such appointment.

7 (2) Any faculty member, classified staff member or administratively
8 exempt employee holding not less than a half time appointment at an
9 institution who resides in the state of Washington, and the dependent
10 children and spouse of such persons.

11 (3) Active-duty military personnel stationed in the state of
12 Washington and the spouses and dependents of such military personnel.

13 (4) Any immigrant refugee and the spouse and dependent children of
14 such refugee, if the refugee (a) is on parole status, or (b) has
15 received an immigrant visa, or (c) has applied for United States
16 citizenship.

17 (5) Domestic exchange students participating in the program created
18 under RCW 28B.15.725.

19 (6) Any dependent of a member of the United States congress
20 representing the state of Washington.

21 **Sec. 5.** RCW 28B.15.031 and 1987 c 15 s 2 are each amended to read
22 as follows:

23 The term "operating fees" as used in this chapter shall include the
24 fees, other than building fees, charged all students registering at the
25 state's colleges and universities but shall not include fees for short
26 courses, self-supporting degree credit programs and courses, marine
27 station work, experimental station work, correspondence or extension
28 courses, and individual instruction and student deposits or rentals,
29 disciplinary and library fines, which colleges and universities shall

1 have the right to impose, laboratory, gymnasium, health, and student
2 activity fees, or fees, charges, rentals, and other income derived from
3 any or all revenue producing lands, buildings and facilities of the
4 colleges or universities heretofore or hereafter acquired, constructed
5 or installed, including but not limited to income from rooms,
6 dormitories, dining rooms, hospitals, infirmaries, housing or student
7 activity buildings, vehicular parking facilities, land, or the
8 appurtenances thereon, or such other special fees as may be established
9 by any college or university board of trustees or regents from time to
10 time. All moneys received as operating fees at any institution of
11 higher education shall be ~~((transmitted to the state treasurer within
12 thirty-five days of receipt to be deposited in the state general fund:
13 PROVIDED, That two and one-half percent of moneys received as operating
14 fees be exempt from such deposit and be retained by the institutions
15 for the purposes of RCW 28B.15.820))~~ deposited in depositories approved
16 by the state treasurer and within thirty-five days of receipt
17 transferred to the state treasurer to be credited to the appropriate
18 fund under section 42 of this act: PROVIDED ((FURTHER)), That money
19 received by institutions of higher education from the periodic payment
20 plan authorized by RCW 28B.15.411 shall be transmitted to the state
21 treasurer within five days following the close of registration of the
22 appropriate quarter or semester, for transfer to the appropriate fund
23 under section 42 of this act.

24 **Sec. 6.** RCW 28B.15.065 and 1977 ex.s. c 322 s 6 are each amended
25 to read as follows:

26 (1) It is the intent of the legislature that needy students not be
27 deprived of access to higher education due to increases in educational
28 costs or consequent increases in tuition ~~((and))~~ fees. It is the sense
29 of the legislature that state appropriations for student financial aid

1 be adjusted in an amount which together with funds estimated to be
2 available in the form of basic educational opportunity grants as
3 authorized under Section 411 of the federal Higher Education Act of
4 1965 as now or hereafter amended will equal twenty-four percent of any
5 change in revenue estimated to occur as a result of revisions in
6 minimum and maximum tuition and fee levels under (~~the provisions of~~
7 ~~this 1977 amendatory act~~) this chapter.

8 (2) This section shall expire June 30, 1993.

9 **Sec. 7.** RCW 28B.15.067 and 1990 1st ex.s. c 9 s 413 are each
10 amended to read as follows:

11 (1) The board of trustees of each institution and the state board
12 for community and technical colleges shall set annual tuition fees as
13 necessary for the operation of the respective institutions and
14 colleges, subject to any minimum and maximum tuition fee amounts
15 established under this chapter. Minimum and maximum tuition fees shall
16 be established and adjusted annually under the provisions of this
17 chapter beginning with the (~~1987-88~~) 1992-93 academic year. ((Such
18 fees shall be identical, subject to other provisions of this chapter,
19 for students enrolled at either state university, for students enrolled
20 at the regional universities and The Evergreen State College and for
21 students enrolled at any community college. Tuition fees shall reflect
22 the undergraduate and graduate educational costs of the state
23 universities, the regional universities and the community colleges,
24 respectively, in the amounts prescribed in this chapter. The change

2 shall not apply to high school students enrolling in community colleges
3 under RCW 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.395.

4 **Sec. 8.** RCW 28B.15.070 and 1989 c 245 s 3 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) The higher education coordinating board, in consultation with
7 the house of representatives and senate committees responsible for
8 higher education (~~shall develop, in cooperation with the higher~~
9 ~~education coordinating board~~), the respective fiscal committees of the
10 house of representatives and senate, the office of financial
11 management, and the state institutions of higher education, shall
12 develop by December of every fourth year beginning in 1989,
13 definitions, criteria, and procedures for determining the undergraduate
14 and graduate educational costs for the state universities, regional
15 universities, and community colleges upon which minimum and maximum
16 tuition fees will be based. (~~In the event that no action is taken or~~
17 ~~disagreement exists between the committees as of that date, the~~

19 (2) Every four years the state institutions of higher education in
20 cooperation with the higher education coordinating board shall perform

23 beginning with 1989-90. Institutions shall complete the studies within
24 one year of the end of the study year and report the results to the
25 higher education coordinating board for consolidation, review, and
26 distribution.

27 (3) In order to conduct the study required by subsection (2) of
28 this section, the higher education coordinating board, in cooperation
29 with the institutions of higher education, shall develop a methodology

1 that requires the collection of comparable educational cost data, which
2 utilizes a faculty activity analysis or similar instrument.

3 (4) Based on the most recent cost study, the higher education
4 coordinating board may make annual cost adjustments for purposes of
5 enabling the determination of annual minimum and maximum tuition fees
6 under RCW 28B.15.202, 28B.15.402, 28B.15.502 and sections 11 and 15 of
7 this act.

8 **Sec. 9.** RCW 28B.15.100 and 1985 c 390 s 18 and 1985 c 370 s 67 are
9 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

10 (1) The board of regents or board of trustees at each of the
11 state's regional and state universities and at The Evergreen State
12 College shall charge to and collect from each of the students
13 registering at the particular institution for any quarter or semester
14 such tuition fees and services and activities fees, and other fees as
15 such board shall in its discretion determine, the total of all such
16 fees, the tuition fee, and services and activities fee, to be rounded-
17 out to the nearest whole dollar amount: PROVIDED, That such tuition
18 fees for other than summer session quarters or semesters shall be in
19 the amounts for the respective institutions as otherwise set forth in
20 this chapter, as now or hereafter amended: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the
21 fees charged by boards of trustees of community college districts shall
22 be in the amounts for the respective institutions as otherwise set
23 forth in this chapter, as now or hereafter amended.

24 (2) Part time students shall be charged tuition and services and
25 activities fees proportionate to full time student rates established
26 for residents and nonresidents: PROVIDED, That students registered for
27 fewer than two credit hours shall be charged tuition and services and
28 activities fees at the rate established for two credit hours: PROVIDED
29 FURTHER, That residents of Idaho or Oregon who are enrolled in

1 community college district number twenty for six or fewer credits
2 during any quarter or semester may be (~~allowed to enroll at resident~~
3 ~~tuition and fee rates~~) exempted from payment of all or a portion of
4 the nonresident tuition fees differential upon a declaration by the
5 higher education coordinating board that it finds Washington residents
6 from such community college district are afforded substantially
7 equivalent treatment by such other states.

8 (3) Full-time students registered for more than eighteen credit
9 hours shall be charged an additional operating fee for each credit hour
10 in excess of eighteen hours at the established per credit hour tuition
11 fee rate applicable to part-time students in the respective
12 institutional tuition and fee rate categories set forth in this
13 chapter: PROVIDED, That the boards of regents of the University of
14 Washington and Washington State University may exempt students who are
15 registered exclusively in first professional programs in medicine,
16 dental medicine, veterinary medicine and law from all or a portion of
17 the additional charge: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the state board for
18 community and technical colleges (~~education~~) may exempt students who
19 are registered exclusively in required courses in vocational
20 preparatory programs from all or a portion of the additional charge.

21 **Sec. 10.** RCW 28B.15.202 and 1985 c 390 s 19 are each amended to
22 read as follows:

23 Minimum and maximum tuition fees and maximum services and
24 activities fees at the University of Washington (~~and at Washington~~
25 ~~State University~~) for other than summer quarters or semesters shall be
26 as follows:

27 (1) For full time resident undergraduate students and all other
28 full time resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled
29 in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of

1 dental surgery, and doctor of veterinary medicine, the maximum total
2 tuition fees shall be (~~((one-third))~~) thirty-nine percent of the per
3 student undergraduate educational costs at the state universities
4 computed as provided in RCW (~~((28B.15.067-and))~~) 28B.15.070: PROVIDED,
5 That the building fees for each academic year shall be one hundred and
6 twenty dollars.

7 (2) For full time resident graduate students not enrolled in
8 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine(~~((7))~~) and doctor
9 of dental surgery, (~~((and doctor of veterinary medicine,7))~~) the minimum
10 total tuition fees shall be twenty-three percent of the per student
11 graduate educational costs at the state universities computed as
12 provided in RCW (~~((28B.15.067-and))~~) 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the
13 building fees for each academic year shall be one hundred and twenty
14 dollars.

15 (3) For full time resident students enrolled in programs leading to
16 the degrees of doctor of medicine(~~((7))~~) and doctor of dental surgery,
17 (~~((and doctor of veterinary medicine,7))~~) the minimum total tuition fees
18 shall be one hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in
19 subsection (2) (~~((above))~~) of this section: PROVIDED, That the building
20 fees for each academic year shall be three hundred and forty-two
21 dollars.

22 (4) For full time nonresident undergraduate students and such other
23 full time nonresident students not in graduate study programs or
24 enrolled in programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine(~~((7))~~)
25 and doctor of dental surgery, (~~((or doctor of veterinary medicine,7))~~) the
26 minimum total tuition fees shall be one hundred percent of the per
27 student undergraduate educational costs at the state universities
28 computed as provided in RCW (~~((28B.15.067-and))~~) 28B.15.070: PROVIDED,
29 That the building fees for each academic year shall be three hundred
30 and fifty-four dollars.

1 (5) For full time nonresident graduate students not enrolled in
2 programs leading to the degrees of doctor of medicine(~~(7)~~) and doctor
3 of dental surgery, (~~(and doctor of veterinary medicine,7)~~) the minimum
4 total tuition fees shall be (~~(four thousand and seventy-four dollars,~~
5 ~~and thereafter such fees shall be)~~) sixty percent of the per student
6 graduate educational costs at the state universities computed as
7 provided in RCW (~~(28B.15.067 and)~~) 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the
8 building fees for each academic year shall be three hundred and
9 fifty-four dollars.

10 (6) For full time nonresident students enrolled in programs leading
11 to the degrees of doctor of medicine(~~(7)~~) and doctor of dental surgery,
12 (~~(and doctor of veterinary medicine,7)~~) the minimum total tuition fees
13 shall be one hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in
14 subsection (5) (~~(above)~~) of this section: PROVIDED, That the building
15 fees for each academic year shall be five hundred and fifty-five
16 dollars.

17 (7) The board(~~(s)~~) of regents of (~~(each of the state universities)~~)
18 the University of Washington shall charge and collect equally from each
19 of the students registering at (~~(the particular)~~) that institution and
20 included in subsections (1) through (6) (~~(hereof)~~) of this section a
21 services and activities fee which for each year of the 1981-83 biennium
22 shall not exceed one hundred and thirty-eight dollars. In subsequent
23 biennia the board of regents may increase the existing fee annually,
24 consistent with budgeting procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045, by a
25 percentage not to exceed the annual percentage increase in minimum
26 tuition fees authorized in subsection (1) (~~(above)~~) of this section or
27 the annual percentage increase in the actual tuition fees, whichever is

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 11.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.15
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 Minimum and maximum tuition fees and maximum services and
6 activities fees at Washington State University for other than summer
7 quarters or semesters shall be as follows:

8 (1) For full time resident undergraduate students and all other
9 full time resident students not in graduate study programs or enrolled
10 in programs leading to the degree of doctor of veterinary medicine, the
11 maximum total tuition fees shall be thirty-seven percent of the per
12 student undergraduate educational costs at the state universities
13 computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building
14 fees for each academic year shall be one hundred and twenty dollars.

15 (2) For full time resident graduate students not enrolled in
16 programs leading to the degree of doctor of veterinary medicine, the
17 minimum total tuition fees shall be twenty-three percent of the per
18 student graduate educational costs at the state universities computed
19 as provided in RCW 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for
20 each academic year shall be one hundred and twenty dollars.

21 (3) For full time resident students enrolled in programs leading to
22 the degrees of doctor of veterinary medicine, the minimum total tuition
23 fees shall be one hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees charged in
24 subsection (2) of this section: PROVIDED, That the building fees for
25 each academic year shall be three hundred and forty-two dollars.

26 (4) For full time nonresident undergraduate students and such other
27 full time nonresident students not in graduate study programs or
28 enrolled in programs leading to the degree of doctor of veterinary
29 medicine, the minimum total tuition fees shall be one hundred percent

1 of the per student undergraduate educational costs at the state
2 universities computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the
3 building fees for each academic year shall be three hundred and
4 fifty-four dollars.

5 (5) For full time nonresident graduate students not enrolled in
6 programs leading to the degree of doctor of veterinary medicine, the
7 minimum total tuition fees shall be sixty percent of the per student
8 graduate educational costs at the state universities computed as
9 provided in RCW 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees for each
10 academic year shall be three hundred and fifty-four dollars.

11 (6) For full time nonresident students enrolled in programs leading
12 to the degree of doctor of veterinary medicine, the minimum total
13 tuition fees shall be one hundred sixty-seven percent of such fees
14 charged in subsection (5) of this section: PROVIDED, That the building
15 fees for each academic year shall be five hundred and fifty-five
16 dollars.

17 (7) The board of regents of Washington State University shall
18 charge and collect equally from each of the students registering at the
19 particular institution and included in subsections (1) through (6) of
20 this section a services and activities fee which for each year of the
21 1981-83 biennium shall not exceed one hundred and thirty-eight dollars.
22 In subsequent biennia the board of regents may increase the existing
23 fee, consistent with budgeting procedures set forth in RCW 28B.15.045,
24 by a percentage not to exceed the annual percentage increase in minimum
25 tuition fees authorized in subsection (1) of this section or the annual
26 percentage increase in actual tuition fees, whichever is lower:
27 PROVIDED, That such percentage increase shall not apply to that portion
28 of the services and activities fee previously committed to the
29 repayment of bonded debt. The services and activities fee committee

1 provided for in RCW 28B.15.045 may initiate a request to the governing
2 board for a fee increase.

3 **Sec. 12.** RCW 28B.15.225 and 1981 c 20 s 1 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 The board of regents of the University of Washington may exempt
6 from payment all or a portion of the nonresident (~~(portion of the~~
7 ~~legally established student))~~ tuition ((and)) fees differential, any
8 student admitted to the university's school of medicine pursuant to any
9 contracts with the states of Alaska, Montana, or Idaho, or agencies
10 thereof, providing for a program of regionalized medical education
11 conducted by said school of medicine, or any student admitted to the
12 university's school of dentistry pursuant to any contracts with the
13 states of Utah, Idaho, or any other western state which does not have
14 a school of dentistry, or agencies thereof, providing for a program of
15 regionalized dental education conducted by said school of dentistry,
16 which contracts provide that the proportional cost of such program and
17 in excess of resident student tuition and fees will be reimbursed to
18 the university by or on behalf of said states or agencies thereof.

19 **Sec. 13.** RCW 28B.15.380 and 1990 c 154 s 1 are each amended to
20 read as follows:

21 In addition to any other exemptions as may be provided by law, the
22 board of regents at the state universities may exempt the following
23 classes of persons from the payment of all or a portion of tuition fees
24 or services and activities fees except for individual instruction fees:

25 (1) All veterans as defined in RCW 41.04.005: PROVIDED, That such
26 persons are no longer entitled to federal vocational or educational
27 benefits conferred by virtue of their military service: AND PROVIDED
28 FURTHER, That if any such veterans have not resided in this state for

1 one year prior to registration ((said)) the board may exempt them up to
2 one-half of the tuition payable by other nonresident students: AND,
3 PROVIDED FURTHER, That such exemptions shall be provided only to those
4 persons otherwise covered who were enrolled in universities on or
5 before October 1, 1977.

6 (2) Children of any law enforcement officer or fire fighter who
7 lost his life or became totally disabled in the line of duty while
8 employed by any public law enforcement agency or full time or volunteer
9 fire department in this state: PROVIDED, That such persons may receive
10 the exemption only if they begin their course of study at a state
11 university within ten years of their graduation from high school.

12 **Sec. 14.** RCW 28B.15.402 and 1989 c 245 s 1 are each amended to
13 read as follows:

14 Minimum and maximum tuition fees and maximum services and
15 activities fees at the regional universities ((and The Evergreen State
16 College)) for other than summer quarters or semesters shall be as
17 follows:

18 (1) For full time resident undergraduate students and all other
19 full time resident students not in graduate study programs, the maximum
20 total tuition fees shall be ((one-fourth)) twenty-nine percent of the
21 per student undergraduate educational costs at the regional
22 universities computed as provided in RCW ((28B.15.067 and)) 28B.15.070:
23 PROVIDED, That the building fees for each academic year shall be
24 seventy-six dollars and fifty cents.

25 (2) For full time resident graduate students, the total minimum
26 tuition fees shall be twenty-three percent of the per student graduate
27 educational costs at the regional universities computed as provided in
28 RCW ((28B.15.067 and)) 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the building fees
29 for each academic year shall be seventy-six dollars and fifty cents.

1 (3) For full time nonresident undergraduate students and all other
2 full time nonresident students not in graduate study programs, the
3 minimum total tuition fees shall be one hundred percent of the per
4 student undergraduate educational costs at the regional universities
5 computed as provided in RCW 28B.15.067 and 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That
6 the building fees for each academic year shall be two hundred and
7 ninety-five dollars and fifty cents.

8 (4) For full time nonresident graduate students, the minimum total
9 ((~~of~~)) tuition fees shall be seventy-five percent of the per student
10 graduate educational costs at the regional universities computed as
11 provided in RCW ((~~28B.15.067 and~~)) 28B.15.070: PROVIDED, That the

29 understandable to the average citizen;

1 (6) Insofar as is feasible under state and federal law, provide
2 reasonable protection of home equity and shield a reasonable portion of
3 farm or business net worth, in determining eligibility for state
4 financial aid programs;

5 (7) Create new ways of delivering clear, timely, and understandable
6 information about academic and financial preparation for college
7 students and their parents. The information should inform students of
8 their responsibilities, and of the state's commitment to assist them
9 with student financial aid when they apply and demonstrate financial
10 need;

11 (8) Include teachers pursuing master's degrees for continuing
12 certification in the teachers conditional scholarship program; and

13 (9) Facilitates financial aid for needy students whose parents did
14 not obtain a higher education certificate or degree.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 46.** (1) In developing college promise, the
16 higher education coordinating board shall be guided by the following

8 section, family income shall be updated, and adjusted for family size,

8 (2) "Institution of higher education" or "institution" means a
9 college or university in the state of Washington which is accredited by
10 an accrediting association recognized as such by rule of the higher
11 education coordinating board.

12 (3) "Board" means the higher education coordinating board.

13 (4) "Eligible student" means a student who is registered for at
14 least ten credit hours or the equivalent, demonstrates achievement of
15 at least a 3.30 grade point average for students entering an
16 institution of higher education directly from high school or maintains
17 at least a 3.00 grade point average or the equivalent for each academic
18 year in an institution of higher education, is a resident student as
19 defined by RCW 28B.15.012 through 28B.15.015, and has a declared
20 intention to complete an approved preparation program leading to
21 initial teacher certification or required for earning an additional
22 endorsement, or a college or university graduate who meets the same
23 credit hour requirements and is seeking an additional teaching
24 endorsement or initial teacher certification. "Eligible student" also
25 means a teacher seeking a master's degree if the degree is required for
26 continuing certification.

27 (5) "Public school" means an elementary school, a middle school,
28 junior high school, or high school within the public school system
29 referred to in Article IX of the state Constitution.

1 (6) "Forgiven" or "to forgive" or "forgiveness" means to render
2 service as a teacher at a public school in the state of Washington in
3 lieu of monetary repayment.

4 (7) "Satisfied" means paid-in-full.

5 (8) "Participant" means an eligible student who has received a
6 conditional scholarship under this chapter.

7 (9) "Targeted ethnic minority" means a group of Americans with a
8 common ethnic or racial heritage selected by the board for program
9 consideration due to societal concerns such as high dropout rates or
10 low rates of college participation by members of the group.

11 **Sec. 52.** RCW 28B.102.050 and 1987 c 437 s 5 are each amended to
12 read as follows:

13 The board may award conditional scholarships to eligible students
14 from ~~((the funds))~~ moneys appropriated to the board for this purpose,
15 or from any private donations, or any other ~~((funds))~~ moneys given to
16 the board for this program. The amount of the conditional scholarship
17 awarded an individual shall not exceed three thousand dollars per
18 academic year. Students are eligible to receive conditional
19 scholarships for a maximum of five years. The amount of the
20 conditional scholarship awarded to any eligible student pursuing a
21 master's degree for continuing certification shall not exceed the
22 lesser of the student's cost of tuition or twenty-five hundred dollars
23 per year. Grants awarded to any one student pursuing a master's degree
24 for continuing certification shall not exceed a total of five thousand
25 dollars.

26 **Sec. 53.** RCW 28B.101.040 and 1990 c 288 s 6 are each amended to
27 read as follows:

1 Grants may be used by eligible participants to attend any public or
2 private college or university in the state of Washington that is
3 accredited by an accrediting association recognized by rule of the
4 higher education coordinating board and that has an existing unused
5 capacity. Grants shall not be used to attend any branch campus or
6 educational program established under chapter 28B.45 RCW. The
7 participant shall not be eligible for a grant if it will be used for
8 any programs that include religious worship, exercise, or instruction
9 or to pursue a degree in theology. Each participating student may
10 receive up to two thousand five hundred dollars per academic year, not
11 to exceed the student's demonstrated financial need for the course of
12 study.

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 54.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.80
14 RCW to read as follows:

15 With the exception of institutions of higher education as defined
16 in RCW 28B.10.016, an institution of postsecondary education that
17 enrolls students receiving state-funded financial aid shall match the
18 total amount of the state financial aid funds received by all enrolled
19 students at that institution with an equal amount of institutionally
20 raised funds from private sources. The higher education coordinating
21 board shall adopt rules to implement this requirement. The rules shall
22 ensure that all institutional matching funds go to students who are
23 residents of the state as defined in RCW 28B.15.011 through 28B.15.013
24 and are needy as defined in RCW 28B.10.802(3).

25 **Sec. 55.** RCW 28B.12.040 and 1985 c 370 s 58 are each amended to
26 read as follows:

27 The higher education coordinating board shall develop and
28 administer the college work-study program and shall be authorized to

1 enter into agreements with employers and eligible institutions for the
2 operation of the program. These agreements shall include such
3 provisions as the higher education coordinating board may deem
4 necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

5 With the exception of off-campus community service placements, the
6 share from ~~((funds))~~ moneys disbursed under the college work-study
7 program of the compensation of students employed under such program in
8 accordance with such agreements shall not exceed eighty percent of the
9 total such compensation paid such students.

10 By rule, the board shall define community service placements and
11 may determine any salary matching requirements for any community
12 service employers.

13 NEW SECTION. Sec. 56. Sections 45 through 47 of this act are
14 each added to chapter 28B.10 RCW.

15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 57. (1) Sections 1 through 49 of this act
16 shall take effect July 1, 1992.

17 (2) Sections 50 through 55 of this act shall take effect July 1,
18 1993.
