1 AN ACT Relating to the Washington technology center; amending RCW 2 28B.20.285; and adding new sections to chapter 28B.20 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the 5 development and commercialization of new technology is a vital part of 6 economic development.

7 The legislature also finds that it is in the interests of the state 8 of Washington to provide a mechanism to transfer and apply research and 9 technology developed at the institutions of higher education to the 10 private sector in order to create new products and technologies which 11 provide job opportunities in advanced technology for the citizens of 12 this state.

13 It is the intent of the legislature that the University of 14 Washington, the Washington State University, and the department of

trade and economic development work cooperatively with the private 1 sector in the development and implementation of a world class 2 3 technology transfer program.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. Unless the context clearly requires 4 5 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout RCW 6 28B.20.285 and sections 3 through 8 of this act.

7 (1) "Technology center" means the Washington technology center, including the affiliated staff, faculty, facilities, and research 8 9 centers operated by the technology center.

10 (2) "Board" means the board of directors of the Washington technology center. 11

(3) "High technology" or "technology" includes but is not limited 12 13 to the modernization, miniaturization, integration, and computerization of electronic, hydraulic, pneumatic, laser, mechanical, robotics, 14 15 nuclear, chemical, telecommunication, and other technological applications to enhance productivity in areas including but not limited 16 to manufacturing, communications, medicine, bioengineering, and 17 18 commerce.

19 Sec. 3. RCW 28B.20.285 and 1983 1st ex.s. c 72 s 11 are each 20 amended to read as follows:

A Washington ((high-technology)) technology center is created ((at 21 the University of Washington. The Washington high-technology center 22 23 shall provide: (1) An interdisciplinary program to support major hightechnology education and research initiatives within the state; (2) the 24 25 resources necessary for research and development programs in high 26 technology; (3) quality training for advanced undergraduate and 27 graduate students in high technology; and (4) interdisciplinary approaches to instruction and research in high-technology fields. 28 HB 2932.SL

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1 The Washington high-technology center shall be administered by the 2 board of regents with the advice of the high-technology coordinating board. The University of Washington shall make the facilities of the 3 Washington high-technology center available to other institutions of 4 higher education when specific program needs so require)) to be a 5 collaborative effort between the state's universities, private б 7 industry, and government. The technology center shall be headquartered at the University of Washington. The mission of the technology center 8 9 shall be to perform and commercialize research on a state-wide basis that benefits the intermediate and long-term economic vitality of the 10 state of Washington, and to develop and strengthen university-industry 11 12 relationships through the conduct of research that is primarily of interest to Washington-based companies or state economic development 13 14 programs. The technology center shall:

15 (1) Perform and/or facilitate research supportive of state science 16 and technology objectives, particularly as they relate to state 17 industries;

18 (2) Provide leading edge collaborative research and technology
 19 transfer opportunities primarily to state industries;

20 (3) Provide substantial opportunities for training undergraduate
21 and graduate students through direct involvement in research and
22 industry interactions;

23 (4) Emphasize and develop nonstate support of the technology 24 center's research activities; and

25 (5) Provide a forum for effective interaction between the state's 26 technology-based industries and its academic research institutions 27 through promotion of faculty collaboration with industry, particularly 28 within the state. <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. (1) The technology center shall be
 administered by the board of directors of the technology center.

(2) The board shall consist of the following members: 3 Fourteen 4 members from among individuals who are associated with or employed by technology-based industries and have broad business experience and an 5 б understanding of high technology; eight members from the state's universities with graduate science and engineering programs; the 7 executive director of the Spokane Intercollegiate Research 8 and 9 Technology Institute or his or her designated representative; the 10 provost of the University of Washington or his or her designated representative; the provost of the Washington State University or his 11 12 or her designated representative; and the director of the state department of trade and economic development or his or her designated 13 14 representative. The term of office for each board member, excluding 15 the executive director of the Spokane Intercollegiate Research and Technology Institute, the provost of the University of Washington, the 16 17 provost of the Washington State University, and the director of the 18 state department of trade and economic development, shall be three 19 years. The executive director of the technology center shall be an ex 20 officio, nonvoting member of the board. The board shall meet at least quarterly. Board members shall be appointed by the governor based on 21 the recommendations of the existing board of the technology center, and 22 the research universities. The governor shall stagger the terms of the 23 24 first group of appointees to ensure the long term continuity of the board. 25

26 (3) The duties of the board include:

27 (a) Developing the general operating policies for the technology28 center;

(b) Appointing the executive director of the technology center;
 (c) Approving the annual operating budget of the technology center;

1 (d) Establishing priorities for the selection and funding of 2 research projects that guarantee the greatest potential return on the 3 state's investment;

4 (e) Approving and allocating funding for research projects 5 conducted by the technology center, based on the recommendations of the 6 advisory committees for each of the research centers;

(f) In cooperation with the department of trade and economic
development, developing a biennial work plan and five-year strategic
plan for the technology center that are consistent with the state-wide
technology development and commercialization goals;

(g) Coordinating with the University of Washington, Washington State University, and other participating institutions of higher education in the development of training, research, and development programs to be conducted at the technology center that shall be targeted to meet industrial needs;

(h) Assisting the department of trade and economic development in the department's efforts to develop state science and technology public policies and coordinate publicly funded programs;

(i) Reviewing annual progress reports on funded research projects that are prepared by the advisory committees for each of the research centers;

(j) Providing an annual report to the governor and the legislature detailing the activities and performance of the technology center; and (k) Submitting annually to the department of trade and economic development an updated strategic plan and a statement of performance measured against the mission, roles, and contractual obligations of the technology center.

28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The University of Washington, Washington 29 State University, and other participating institutions of higher

education shall provide the affiliated staff, faculty, and facilities
 required to support the operation of the technology center.

3 The department of trade and economic <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. development shall contract with the University of Washington for the 4 5 expenditure of state-appropriated funds for the operation of the Washington technology center. The department of trade and economic б development shall provide guidance to the technology center regarding 7 8 expenditure of state-appropriated funds and the development of the 9 center's strategic plan. The director of the department of trade and 10 economic development shall not withhold funds appropriated for the technology center if the technology center complies with the provisions 11 of its contract with the department of trade and economic development. 12 13 The department shall be responsible to the legislature for the contractual performance of the center. 14

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. The facilities of the technology center 16 shall be made available to other institutions of higher education 17 within the state when this would benefit specific program needs.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. Sections 1, 2, and 4 through 7 of this 19 act are each added to chapter 28B.20 RCW.
