1 AN ACT Relating to the award for excellence in education program;
2 amending RCW 28A.625.041, 28B.80.255, and 28A.625.060; creating a new
3 section; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.625.041 and 1991 c 255 s 3 are each amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (1) All recipients of the Washington award for excellence in
8 education shall receive a certificate presented by the governor and the
9 superintendent of public instruction, or their designated
10 representatives, at a public ceremony or ceremonies in appropriate
11 locations.

12 (2) In addition to certificates under subsection (1) of this
13 section, awards for teachers, classified employees, and principals or
14 administrators shall include one of the following:

1 (a) Except as provided under RCW 28B.80.255, an academic grant
2 which shall be used to take courses at a state institution of higher
3 education. The academic grant shall not exceed the current academic
4 year full-time resident graduate tuition for courses taken at one of
5 the state's research universities and shall not exceed the current
6 academic year full-time resident graduate tuition for courses taken at
7 one of the state's regional universities or The Evergreen State
8 College. The academic grant shall not be considered compensation for
9 the purposes of RCW 28A.400.200; or

10 (b) A recognition stipend not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
11 stipend shall not be considered compensation for the purposes of RCW
12 28A.400.200; or

13 (c) An educational grant not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
14 educational grant shall be awarded under RCW 28A.625.060 and shall not
15 be considered compensation for the purposes of RCW 28A.400.200.

16 (3) In addition to certificates under subsection (1) of this
17 section, the award for the superintendent shall include one of the
18 following:

19 (a) A recognition stipend not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
20 stipend shall not be considered compensation for the purposes of RCW
21 28A.400.200; or

22 (b) An educational grant not to exceed one thousand dollars. The
23 educational grant shall be awarded under RCW 28A.625.060 and shall not
24 be considered compensation for the purposes of RCW 28A.400.200.

25 (4) In addition to certificates under subsection (1) of this
26 section, the award for the school board shall include an educational
27 grant not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars. The educational
28 grant shall be awarded under RCW 28A.625.060.

29 (5) Within one year of receiving the Washington award for
30 excellence in education, teachers, classified employees, principals or

1 administrators, and the school district superintendent shall notify the
2 superintendent of public instruction in writing of their decision to
3 apply for an academic grant, a recognition stipend, or an educational
4 grant as provided under subsections (2) and (3) of this section. The
5 superintendent shall notify the higher education coordinating board of
6 those recipients who select the academic grant.

7 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.80.255 and 1991 c 255 s 6 are each amended to read
8 as follows:

9 (1) Teachers, classified employees, and principals or
10 administrators who select an academic grant under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a)
11 shall use the grant to attend a state public institution of higher
12 education located in the state of Washington, except that the academic
13 grant may be used for courses at a private institution of higher
14 education in the state of Washington if the conditions in subsection
15 (3) of this section are met, and the academic grant may be used for
16 courses at a public or a private institution of higher education in
17 another state or country if the conditions in subsection (4) of this
18 section are met.

19 (2) "Institution of higher education" means:

20 (a) Any public university, college, community college, or
21 vocational-technical institute operated by the state of Washington or
22 any political subdivision thereof; or

23 (b) Any other university, college, school, or institute in the
24 state of Washington offering instruction beyond the high school level
25 which is a member institution of an accrediting association recognized
26 by rule of the board. Any institution, branch, extension, or facility
27 operating within the state of Washington which is affiliated with an
28 institution operating in another state must be a separately accredited

1 member institution of an accrediting association recognized by the
2 board.

3 (3) Teachers, classified employees, and principals or
4 administrators who select an academic grant under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a)
5 may use the grant for courses at any private institution as defined in
6 subsection (2)(b) of this section subject to the following conditions:

7 (a) The academic grant shall not exceed the current academic year
8 full-time resident graduate tuition and the services and activities
9 fees in effect at the state-funded research universities;

10 (b) The academic grant shall be contingent on the private
11 institution matching on at least a dollar-for-dollar basis, either with
12 actual money or by waiver of fees, the amount of the academic grant
13 received by the recipient from the state; and

14 (c) The academic grant may not be used for any courses that include
15 any religious worship or exercise, or apply to any degree in religious,
16 seminarian, or theological academic studies.

17 (4) Teachers, classified employees, and principals or
18 administrators who select an academic grant under RCW 28A.625.041(2)(a)
19 may use the grant for courses at a public or private higher education
20 institution in another state or country subject to the following
21 conditions:

22 (a) The institution has an exchange program with a public or
23 private higher education institution in Washington and the exchange
24 program is approved or recognized by the higher education coordinating
25 board; or

26 (b) The institution is approved or recognized by the higher
27 education coordinating board; and

28 (c) The recipient of the Washington award for excellence in
29 education has submitted in writing to the higher education coordinating

1 board an explanation of why the preferred course or courses are not
2 available at a public or private institution in Washington; and

3 (d) The academic grant may not be used for any courses that include
4 any religious worship or exercise, or apply to any degree in religious,
5 seminarian, or theological academic studies.

6 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.625.060 and 1991 c 255 s 9 are each amended to
7 read as follows:

8 Teachers, classified employees, principals or administrators, and
9 superintendents who have received an award for excellence in education
10 and choose to apply for an educational grant under RCW 28A.625.041
11 shall be awarded the grant by the superintendent of public instruction
12 as long as a written grant application is submitted to the
13 superintendent within one year after the award was received. The grant
14 application shall identify the educational purpose toward which the
15 grant shall be used.

16 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** This act shall take effect June 30,
17 1993.

18 *NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** *If specific funding for the purposes of*
19 *this act, referencing this act by bill number, is not provided in the*
20 *appropriations act of 1993, this act is null and void.*

22 *Sec. 5 was vetoed, see message at end of chapter.

Note: Governor's explanation of partial veto is as follows:

"I am returning herewith, without my approval as to section 5, Substitute Senate Bill No. 6327 entitled:

"AN ACT Relating to the award for excellence in education program."

Substitute Senate Bill No. 6327 adds classified school employees to those eligible to receive recognition, and a stipend or tuition reimbursement, for outstanding performance and contribution to our public education system. The work of classified school staff is vital to an effective school program. They are deserving of this recognition.

Section 5 puts this recognition in jeopardy by providing that if specific funding is not included in the 1993 appropriations act, the act will become null and void. In recognition of the important service rendered by classified school employees, I am eliminating this "null and void" provision to ensure full participation in the award for excellence in education program. For this reason, I have vetoed section 5 of Substitute Senate Bill No. 6327.

With the exception of section 5, Substitute Senate Bill No. 6327 is approved."
