1            AN ACT Relating to American Indian scholarships; and amending RCW  
2 28B.108.060 and 28B.108.070.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.108.060 and 1991 sp.s. c 13 s 110 are each amended  
5 to read as follows:

6            The American Indian scholarship endowment fund is established. The  
7 endowment fund shall be administered by the state treasurer.

8            (1) Moneys received from the higher education coordinating board,  
9 private donations, state matching moneys, and funds received from any  
10 other source may be deposited into the endowment fund. Private moneys  
11 received as a gift subject to conditions may be deposited into the  
12 fund.

13            (2) At the request of the higher education coordinating board, the  
14 treasurer shall release earnings from the endowment fund to the board  
15 for scholarships. No appropriation is required for expenditures from  
16 the endowment fund.

17            (3) When notified by the higher education coordinating board or by  
18 court order that a condition attached to a gift of private moneys in

1 the fund has failed, the treasurer shall release those moneys to the  
2 donors according to the terms of the conditional gift.

3 (4) The principal of the endowment fund shall not be invaded. The  
4 release of moneys under subsection (3) of this section shall not  
5 constitute an invasion of corpus.

6 (5) The earnings on the fund shall be used solely for the purposes  
7 set forth in RCW 28B.108.040, except when the terms of a conditional  
8 gift of private moneys in the fund require that a portion of earnings  
9 on such moneys be reinvested in the fund.

10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.108.070 and 1991 c 228 s 12 are each amended to  
11 read as follows:

12 The higher education coordinating board may request that the  
13 treasurer deposit fifty thousand dollars of state matching funds into  
14 the American Indian scholarship endowment fund when the board can match  
15 the state funds with an equal amount of private cash donations,  
16 including conditional gifts. Private cash donations means moneys from  
17 nonstate sources that include, but are not limited to, federal moneys,  
18 tribal moneys, and assessments by commodity commissions authorized to  
19 conduct research activities, including but not limited to research  
20 studies authorized under RCW 15.66.030 and 15.65.040.
