- 1 AN ACT Relating to port district fire fighters; adding a new
- 2 section to chapter 53.08 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature recognizes that it passed
- 5 comprehensive legislation in 1986 to provide protection to fire
- 6 fighters who risk losing their jobs as a result of an annexation,
- 7 incorporation, merger, or consolidation by a city, town, or fire
- 8 protection district. The legislation did not, however, grant these
- 9 same protections to fire fighters who are employed by port districts.
- 10 It is the intent of the legislature that fire fighters who are employed
- 11 by port districts should have the same transfer rights as other local
- 12 government fire fighters in the event of an annexation, consolidation,
- 13 merger, or incorporation by a city, town, or fire protection district.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 53.08 RCW
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 (1) When a port district provides its own fire protection services
- 17 with port district employees, and port district property is included as
- 18 part of an annexation, incorporation, consolidation, or merger by a

- 1 city, town, or fire protection district, and fire protection services
- 2 for this port district property will be furnished by the city, town, or
- 3 fire protection district, an eligible employee may transfer employment
- 4 to the city, town, or fire protection district in the same manner and
- 5 under the same conditions that a fire fighter may transfer employment
- 6 into a fire protection district pursuant to RCW 52.04.111, 52.04.121,
- 7 and 52.04.131.
- 8 (2) "Eligible employee" means an employee of the port district who
- 9 (a) was at the time of the annexation, merger, consolidation, or
- 10 incorporation employed exclusively or principally in performing the
- 11 powers, duties, and functions which are to be performed by the fire
- 12 department of the city, town, or fire protection district, (b) will, as
- 13 a direct consequence of the annexation, merger, consolidation, or
- 14 incorporation, be separated from the employ of the port district, and
- 15 (c) can perform the duties and meet the minimum requirements of the
- 16 position to be filled.
