# HOUSE BILL REPORT SHB 1809

## As Amended by Senate

**Title:** An act relating to naturopath's authority to give direction to persons licensed under chapter 18.79 RCW.

**Brief Description:** Authorizing naturopaths to give direction to registered nurses.

**Sponsors:** By House Committee on Health Care (originally sponsored by Representatives Dyer and Dickerson).

#### HOUSE COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

**Majority Report:** The substitute bill be substituted therefor and the substitute bill do pass. Signed by 13 members: Representatives Dyer, Chairman; Backlund, Vice Chairman; Hymes, Vice Chairman; Dellwo, Ranking Minority Member; Cody, Assistant Ranking Minority Member; Campbell; Casada; Conway; Crouse; Kessler; Morris; Sherstad and Skinner.

**Background:** Currently, nurses and licensed practical nurses may work under the direction of a physician, dentist, osteopathic or podiatric physician or physician assistant, or advanced nurse practitioner.

Current law, however, does not authorize the nurse or licensed practical nurse to work under the direction of a naturopathic physician.

**Summary of Bill:** Nurses and licensed practical nurses are authorized to work under the direction of a naturopathic physician, consistent with their scopes of practice.

### **EFFECT OF SENATE AMENDMENT(S):**

The Nursing Care Quality Assurance Commission must develop rules for nursing practice under the direction of naturopathic physicians.

The act takes effect August 1, 1996.

Effective Date of Bill: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is

passed.
