Majority Report: The substitute bill be substituted therefor and the substitute bill do pass. Signed by 22 members: Representatives K. Background: The Department of Licensing (DOL) has limited authority to issue motor vehicle excise tax refunds or refunds of vessel registration fees.

Summary of Bill: The Department of Licensing may refund motor vehicle excises taxes and vessel registration fees in the following circumstances:

- (1) if the vehicle or vessel for which the renewal license is purchased is destroyed before the beginning date of the registration period;
- (2) if the registered vehicle or vessel is permanently moved from the state either before the registration period begins or during the registration period (in the latter case, only a pro rata share of the taxes and fees is refunded); or

- (3) if the vehicle or vessel license is purchased after the owner sold the vehicle or vessel.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Available.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: DOL issues refunds in very narrow circumstances. This bill is a fairness issue and allows refunds when people move out of state.

Testimony Against: None.
