Background: The state government operates on the basis of a fiscal biennium that begins on July 1 of each odd-numbered year.

Summary of Bill: The 1995-97 omnibus appropriations act.

EFFECT OF SENATE AMENDMENT(S):

The Senate amendments increase the total appropriations by \$809 million, of which \$617 million is general fund-state.

Appropriation: \$26,225,028,000 from all funds; \$17,279,236,000 from General Fund-State.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date of Bill: The bill contains an emergency clause and takes effect on July 1, 1995.
