Background: All agreements made pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act must be filed with the county auditor and with the Secretary of State. If an agreement relates to land use planning or building codes, it must also be submitted to the Department of Community, Trade and Economic Development. Currently, neither of these requirements are followed and questions have been raised as to the legality of the interlocal agreements.

Summary of Bill: The requirements to file interlocal agreements with the Secretary of State and the Department of Community, Trade and Economic Development are eliminated.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: This legislation eliminates a superfluous requirement.
