Background: There is presently no coordinated legislative effort to examine and make recommendations on programs and services for veterans and military personnel.

Summary of Bill: A Joint Select Committee on Veterans and Military Personnel Affairs is created. The committee consists of four members, one from each caucus of the Senate and House. The committee must report to the Legislature before the 1997 legislative session on the current status of veteran and military personnel affairs in the state of Washington. The committee is required to establish an advisory group of all interested parties.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Testimony For: It is about time a complete overview of veterans and military personnel affairs was undertaken. There are some serious problems, e.g., homelessness.
