1 AN ACT Relating to licenses; amending RCW 77.32.101; and creating
2 a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that people who
5 provide hunter education training instruction merit recognition on
6 behalf of their efforts to promote safe and responsible hunting
7 practices. Therefore, it is the intent of the legislature that
8 volunteer instructors who have been certified for at least three years
9 receive Washington state department of fish and wildlife hunting
10 licenses free of charge.

11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 77.32.101 and 1994 c 255 s 11 are each amended to read
12 as follows:

13 (1) A combination hunting and fishing license allows a resident
14 holder to hunt, and to fish for game fish throughout the state. The
15 fee for this license is twenty-nine dollars.

16 (2) A hunting license allows the holder to hunt throughout the
17 state. The fee for this license is fifteen dollars for residents and
18 one hundred fifty dollars for nonresidents. Residents who have been

1 authorized and active instructors for at least three years and who
2 remain active instructors under RCW 77.32.155 shall receive a hunting
3 license free of charge.

4 (3) A fishing license allows the holder to fish for game fish
5 throughout the state. The fee for this license is seventeen dollars
6 for residents fifteen years of age or older and under seventy years of
7 age, three dollars for residents seventy years of age or older, twenty
8 dollars for nonresidents under fifteen years of age, and forty-eight
9 dollars for nonresidents fifteen years of age or older.

10 (4) A steelhead fishing license allows the holder of a combination
11 hunting and fishing license or a fishing license issued under this
12 section to fish for steelhead throughout the state. The fee for this
13 license is eighteen dollars.

14 (5) A juvenile steelhead license allows residents under fifteen
15 years of age and nonresidents under fifteen years of age who hold a
16 fishing license to fish for steelhead throughout the state. The fee
17 for this license is six dollars and entitles the holder to take up to
18 five steelhead at which time another juvenile steelhead license may be
19 purchased. Any person who purchases a juvenile steelhead license is
20 prohibited from purchasing a steelhead license for the same calendar
21 year.
