- 1 AN ACT Relating to the sale of salmon and salmon eggs by the
- 2 department of fish and wildlife; amending RCW 75.08.230; adding a new
- 3 section to chapter 75.50 RCW; providing an effective date; and
- 4 declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 75.50 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 The salmon enhancement account is created in the state treasury.
- 9 All receipts from the sale of salmon and salmon eggs by the department,
- 10 except for the proceeds identified under RCW 75.08.230(5) and
- 11 75.50.100, shall be deposited into the account. Moneys in the account
- 12 may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures from the account
- 13 may be used only to support regional fisheries enhancement groups'
- 14 enhancement projects.
- 15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 75.08.230 and 1993 c 340 s 48 are each amended to read
- 16 as follows:

p. 1 HB 1124

- 1 (1) Except as provided in this section, state and county officers 2 receiving the following moneys shall deposit them in the state general 3 fund:
- 4 (a) The sale of licenses required under this title;
- 5 (b) The sale of property seized or confiscated under this title;
  - (c) Fines and forfeitures collected under this title;
- 7 (d) The sale of real or personal property held for department 8 purposes;
  - (e) Rentals or concessions of the department;
- 10 (f) Moneys received for damages to food fish, shellfish, or 11 department property; and
- 12 (g) Gifts.

- 13 (2) The director shall make weekly remittances to the state 14 treasurer of moneys collected by the department.
- 15 (3) All fines and forfeitures collected or assessed by a district 16 court for a violation of this title or rule of the director shall be 17 remitted as provided in chapter 3.62 RCW.
- (4) Proceeds from the sale of food fish or shellfish taken in test fishing conducted by the department, to the extent that these proceeds exceed the estimates in the budget approved by the legislature, may be allocated as unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.270 to reimburse the department for unanticipated costs for test fishing operations in excess of the allowance in the budget approved by the legislature.
  - (5) Proceeds from the sale of salmon and salmon eggs by the department shall be deposited in the salmon enhancement account created in section 1 of this act, except, to the extent these proceeds exceed estimates in the budget approved by the legislature, proceeds may be allocated as unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.270. Allocations under this subsection shall be made only for hatchery operations partially or wholly financed by sources other than state general revenues or for purposes of processing human consumable salmon for disposal.
- 33 (6) Moneys received by the director under RCW 75.08.045, to the 34 extent these moneys exceed estimates in the budget approved by the 35 legislature, may be allocated as unanticipated receipts under RCW 36 43.79.270. Allocations under this subsection shall be made only for 37 the specific purpose for which the moneys were received, unless the 38 moneys were received in settlement of a claim for damages to food fish

1 or shellfish, in which case the moneys may be expended for the 2 conservation of these resources.

- 3 (7) Proceeds from the sale of herring spawn on kelp fishery 4 licenses by the department, to the extent those proceeds exceed 5 estimates in the budget approved by the legislature, may be allocated 6 as unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.270. Allocations under this 7 subsection shall be made only for herring management, enhancement, and 8 enforcement.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate 10 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 11 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take 12 effect July 1, 1995.
