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1 AN ACT Relating to armed crimes; amending RCW 9.41.040, 9.41.047,
2 9.41.050, 9.41.098, 9.41.110, 9.41.135, 9.41.170, and 9.41.800;
3 reenacting and amending RCW 9.41.010 and 9.41.070; repealing RCW
4 9.41.240; and prescribing penalties.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9.41.010 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 401 and 1994 c 121 s 1
7 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in
9 this section apply throughout this chapter.

10 (1) "Firearm" means a weapon or device from which a projectile may
11 be fired by ((an explosive)) a propellant such as gunpowder.

12 (2) "Pistol" means any firearm with a barrel less than twelve
13 inches in length measured from muzzle to breech when closed, or is
14 designed to be held and fired by the use of a single hand.

15 (3) "Rifle" means a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade,
16 and intended to be fired from the shoulder and designed or redesigned,
17 made or remade, and intended to use the energy of the ((explosive))
18 propellant in a fixed metallic cartridge to fire ((only)) a ((single))
19 projectile through a rifled bore for each single pull of the trigger.

1 (4) "Short-barreled rifle" means a rifle having one or more barrels
2 less than sixteen inches in length measured from muzzle to breech when
3 closed and any weapon made from a rifle by any means of modification if
4 such modified weapon has an overall length of less than twenty-six
5 inches.

6 (5) "Shotgun" means a weapon with one or more barrels, designed or
7 redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the shoulder
8 and designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to use the
9 energy of the ((~~explosive~~)) propellant in a fixed shotgun shell to fire
10 through a smooth bore either a number of ball shot or a single
11 projectile for each single pull of the trigger.

12 (6) "Short-barreled shotgun" means a shotgun having one or more
13 barrels less than eighteen inches in length measured from muzzle to
14 breech when closed and any weapon made from a shotgun by any means of
15 modification if such modified weapon has an overall length of less than
16 twenty-six inches.

17 (7) "Machine gun" means any firearm known as a machine gun,
18 ((~~mechanical~~)) automatic rifle, submachine gun, or any other mechanism
19 or instrument not requiring that the trigger be pressed for each shot
20 and having a ((~~reservoir-clip~~)) magazine, disc, drum, belt, or other
21 separable mechanical device for storing, carrying, or supplying
22 ammunition which can be loaded into the firearm, mechanism, or
23 instrument, and fired therefrom at the rate of five or more shots per
24 second.

25 (8) "Antique firearm" means a firearm or replica of a firearm not
26 designed or redesigned for using rim fire or conventional center fire
27 ignition with fixed ammunition and manufactured in or before 1898,
28 including any matchlock, flintlock, percussion cap, or similar type of
29 ignition system and also any firearm using fixed ammunition
30 manufactured in or before 1898, for which ammunition is no longer
31 manufactured in the United States ((~~and~~)) or is not readily available
32 in the ordinary channels of commercial trade.

33 (9) "Loaded" means:

34 (a) There is a cartridge in the chamber of the firearm;

35 (b) ((~~Bullets~~)) Cartridges are in a ((~~clip~~)) magazine that is
36 locked in place in the firearm;

37 (c) There is a cartridge in the cylinder of the firearm, if the
38 firearm is a revolver; ((~~or~~))

1 (d) There is a cartridge in the tube(~~()~~) or magazine(~~() or other~~
2 ~~compartment~~) of the firearm ; or

3 (e) There is a ball in the barrel and the firearm is capped or
4 primed if the firearm is a muzzle loader.

5 (10) "Dealer" means a person engaged in the business of selling
6 firearms (~~or ammunition~~) at wholesale or retail who (~~has, or~~) is
7 required to have(~~()~~) a federal firearms license under 18 U.S.C. Sec.
8 923(a). A person who does not have, and is not required to have, a
9 federal firearms license under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 923(a)(~~()~~) is not a
10 dealer if that person makes only occasional sales, exchanges, or
11 purchases of firearms for the enhancement of a personal collection or
12 for a hobby, or sells all or part of his or her personal collection of
13 firearms.

14 (11) "Crime of violence" means:

15 (a) Any of the following felonies, as now existing or hereafter
16 amended: Any felony defined under any law as a class A felony or an
17 attempt to commit a class A felony, criminal solicitation of or
18 criminal conspiracy to commit a class A felony, manslaughter in the
19 first degree, manslaughter in the second degree, indecent liberties if
20 committed by forcible compulsion, rape in the second degree, kidnapping
21 in the second degree, arson in the second degree, assault in the second
22 degree, assault of a child in the second degree, extortion in the first
23 degree, burglary in the second degree, residential burglary, and
24 robbery in the second degree;

25 (b) Any conviction for a felony offense in effect at any time prior
26 to July 1, 1976, which is comparable to a felony classified as a crime
27 of violence in (a) of this subsection; and

28 (c) Any federal or out-of-state conviction for an offense
29 comparable to a felony classified as a crime of violence under (a) or
30 (b) of this subsection.

31 (12) "Serious offense" means any (~~of the following felonies or a~~
32 ~~felony attempt to commit any of the following felonies, as now existing~~
33 ~~or hereafter amended:~~

34 ~~(a) Any crime of violence;~~

35 ~~(b) Child molestation in the second degree;~~

36 ~~(c) Controlled substance homicide;~~

37 ~~(d) Incest when committed against a child under age fourteen;~~

38 ~~(e) Indecent liberties;~~

39 ~~(f) Leading organized crime;~~

1 ~~(g) Promoting prostitution in the first degree;~~
2 ~~(h) Rape in the third degree;~~
3 ~~(i) Sexual exploitation;~~
4 ~~(j) Vehicular assault;~~
5 ~~(k) Vehicular homicide, when proximately caused by the driving of~~
6 ~~any vehicle by any person while under the influence of intoxicating~~
7 ~~liquor or any drug as defined by RCW 46.61.502, or by the operation of~~
8 ~~any vehicle in a reckless manner;~~

9 ~~(l) Any other class B felony offense with a finding of sexual~~
10 ~~motivation, as "sexual motivation" is defined under RCW 9.94A.030;~~

11 ~~(m) Any other felony with a deadly weapon verdict under RCW~~
12 ~~9.94A.125; or~~

13 ~~(n) Any felony offense in effect at any time prior to July 1, 1994,~~
14 ~~that is comparable to a serious offense, or any federal or out-of-state~~
15 ~~conviction for an offense that under the laws of this state would be a~~
16 ~~felony classified as a serious offense)) crime of violence or a felony~~
17 ~~in which a firearm was used or displayed or the person was illegally~~
18 ~~armed with a firearm.~~

19 (13) "Sell" refers to the actual approval of the delivery of a
20 firearm in consideration of payment or promise of payment of a certain
21 price in money.

22 **Sec. 2.** RCW 9.41.040 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 402 are each amended to
23 read as follows:

24 (1) A person, whether an adult or juvenile, is guilty of the crime
25 of unlawful possession of a firearm if the person owns, has in his or
26 her possession, or has in his or her control any firearm:

27 (a) After having previously been convicted or, as a juvenile,
28 adjudicated in this state or elsewhere of a (~~serious offense, a~~
29 ~~domestic violence offense enumerated in RCW 10.99.020(2), a harassment~~
30 ~~offense enumerated in RCW 9A.46.060, or of)) crime of violence or a
31 felony in which a firearm was used or displayed, except as otherwise
32 provided in subsection (3) ((~~or (4)~~)) of this section;~~

33 (b) After having previously been convicted of any felony violation
34 of the uniform controlled substances act, chapter 69.50 RCW, or
35 equivalent statutes of another jurisdiction, except as otherwise
36 provided in subsection (3) ((~~or (4)~~)) of this section;

37 (c) (~~After having previously been convicted on three occasions~~
38 ~~within five years of driving a motor vehicle or operating a vessel~~

1 while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug, unless
2 his or her right to possess a firearm has been restored as provided in
3 RCW 9.41.047;

4 (e)) If the person is under eighteen years of age, except as
5 provided in RCW 9.41.042.

6 (2) Unlawful possession of a firearm is a class ((C)) B felony,
7 punishable under chapter 9A.20 RCW.

8 (3) As used in this section, a person has been "convicted" at such
9 time as a plea of guilty has been accepted or a verdict of guilty has
10 been filed, notwithstanding the pendency of any future proceedings
11 including but not limited to sentencing or disposition, post-trial or
12 post-factfinding motions, and appeals. A person shall not be precluded
13 from possession of a firearm if the conviction has been the subject of
14 a pardon, annulment, certificate of rehabilitation, or other equivalent
15 procedure based on a finding of the rehabilitation of the person
16 convicted or the conviction or disposition has been the subject of a
17 pardon, annulment, or other equivalent procedure based on a finding of
18 innocence.

19 (4) ((Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, a person
20 convicted of an offense other than murder, manslaughter, robbery, rape,
21 indecent liberties, arson, assault, kidnapping, extortion, burglary, or
22 violations with respect to controlled substances under RCW 69.50.401(a)
23 and 69.50.410, who received a probationary sentence under RCW 9.95.200,
24 and who received a dismissal of the charge under RCW 9.95.240, shall
25 not be precluded from possession of a firearm as a result of the
26 conviction.

27 (6)))(a) A person who has been committed by court order for
28 treatment of mental illness under RCW 71.05.320 or chapter 10.77 RCW,
29 or equivalent statutes of another jurisdiction, may not possess, in any
30 manner, a firearm as defined in RCW 9.41.010.

31 (b) At the time of commitment, the court shall specifically state
32 to the person under (a) of this subsection and give the person notice
33 in writing that the person is barred from possession of firearms.

34 ((c) The secretary of social and health services shall develop
35 appropriate rules to create an approval process under this subsection.
36 The rules must provide for)) The immediate restoration of the right to
37 possess a firearm shall be established upon a showing in a superior
38 court ((of competent jurisdiction)) that a person no longer is required
39 to participate in an inpatient or outpatient treatment program, and is

1 no longer required to take medication to treat any condition related to
2 the commitment. Unlawful possession of a firearm under this subsection
3 shall be punished as a class C felony under chapter 9A.20 RCW.

4 (5) In addition to any other penalty provided for by law, if a
5 person under the age of eighteen years is found by a court to have
6 possessed a firearm in a vehicle in violation of subsection (1) of this
7 section or to have committed an offense while armed with a firearm
8 during which offense a motor vehicle served an integral function, the
9 court shall notify the department of licensing within twenty-four hours
10 and the person's privilege to drive shall be revoked under RCW
11 46.20.265.

12 **Sec. 3.** RCW 9.41.047 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 404 are each amended to
13 read as follows:

14 (1)((~~a~~)) At the time a person is convicted of an offense making
15 the person ineligible to possess a firearm, or at the time a person is
16 committed by court order under RCW 71.05.320, 71.34.090, or chapter
17 10.77 RCW for mental health treatment, the convicting or committing
18 court shall notify the person, orally and in writing, that the person
19 may not possess a firearm unless his or her right to do so is restored
20 by a superior court ((~~of record~~)).

21 The convicting or committing court also shall forward a copy of the
22 person's driver's license or identicard, or comparable information, to
23 the department of licensing, along with the date of conviction or
24 commitment.

25 (2) Upon receipt of the information provided for by subsection (1)
26 of this section, the department of licensing shall determine if the
27 convicted or committed person has a concealed pistol license. If the
28 person does have a concealed pistol license, the department of
29 licensing shall immediately notify the license-issuing authority.

33 of intoxicating liquor or any drug may, after five continuous years
34 without further conviction for any alcohol-related offense, petition a
35 court of record to have his or her right to possess a firearm restored.~~

36 (~~4~~))(a) A person who is prohibited from possessing a firearm, by
37 reason of having been ((~~either~~:

1 ~~(ii))~~ involuntarily committed for mental health treatment under
2 RCW 71.05.320, 71.34.090, chapter 10.77 RCW, or equivalent statutes of
3 another jurisdiction, may, upon discharge, petition a court of record
4 to have his or her right to possess a firearm restored.

5 (b) At a minimum, a petition under this subsection ~~((+4))~~ (3)
6 shall include the following:

7 (i) The fact, date, and place of commitment;

8 (ii) The place of treatment;

9 (iii) The fact and date of release from commitment;

10 (iv) A certified copy of the most recent order, if one exists, of
11 commitment, with the findings of fact and conclusions of law; and

12 (v) A statement by the ~~((person))~~ person's doctor of record that he
13 or she is no longer required to participate in an inpatient or
14 outpatient treatment program, is no longer required to take medication
15 to treat any condition related to the commitment~~((, and does not
16 present a substantial danger to himself or herself, to others, or to
17 the public safety))~~.

18 (c) A person petitioning the court under this subsection ~~((+4))~~
19 (3) shall bear the burden of proving by a preponderance of the evidence
20 that the circumstances resulting in the commitment no longer exist and
21 are not reasonably likely to recur.

22 **Sec. 4.** RCW 9.41.050 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 405 are each amended to
23 read as follows:

24 (1) Except in the person's place of abode or fixed place of
25 business, a person shall not carry a pistol concealed on his or her
26 person without a license to carry a concealed pistol.

27 (2) A person shall not carry or place a loaded pistol in any
28 vehicle unless the person has a license to carry a concealed pistol
29 and: (a) The pistol is on the licensee's person, (b) the licensee is
30 within the vehicle at all times that the pistol is there, or (c) the
31 licensee is away from the vehicle and the pistol is locked within the
32 vehicle and concealed from view from outside the vehicle.

33 (3) A person at least eighteen years of age who is in possession of
34 an unloaded pistol shall not leave the unloaded pistol in a vehicle
35 unless the unloaded pistol is locked within the unoccupied vehicle and
36 concealed from view from outside the vehicle.

1 ~~(4) ((Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person may~~
2 ~~carry a firearm unless it is unloaded and enclosed in an opaque case or~~

1 **Sec. 5.** RCW 9.41.070 and 1994 sp.s. c 7 s 407 and 1994 c 190 s 2
2 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

3 (1) The judge of a court of record, the chief of police of a
4 municipality, or the sheriff of a county, shall within thirty days
5 after the filing of an application of any person issue a license to
6 such person to carry a pistol concealed on his or her person within
7 this state for four years from date of issue, for the purposes of
8 protection or while engaged in business, sport, or while traveling.
9 However, if the applicant does not have a valid permanent Washington
10 driver's license or Washington state identification card or has not
11 been a resident of the state for the previous consecutive ninety days,
12 the issuing authority shall have up to sixty days after the filing of
13 the application to issue a license. The issuing authority shall not
14 refuse to accept completed applications for concealed pistol licenses
15 during regular business hours.

16 The applicant's (~~constitutional~~) right to (~~bear arms~~) obtain a
17 concealed pistol license shall not be denied, unless he or she:

18 (a) Is ineligible to possess a firearm under the provisions of RCW
19 9.41.040;

20 (b) Is under twenty-one years of age;

21 (c) Is subject to a court order or injunction regarding firearms
22 pursuant to RCW 9A.46.080, 10.14.080, 10.99.040, 10.99.045, 26.09.050,
23 26.09.060, 26.10.040, 26.10.115, 26.26.130, 26.26.137, 26.50.060, or
24 26.50.070;

25 (d) Is free on bond or personal recognizance pending trial, appeal,
26 or sentencing for a (~~serious offense~~) crime of violence;

27 (e) Has an outstanding warrant for his or her arrest from any court
28 of competent jurisdiction for a felony or misdemeanor;

29 (f) Has been ordered to forfeit a firearm under RCW
30 9.41.098(1)(~~d~~) (e) within one year before filing an application to
31 carry a pistol concealed on his or her person; or

32 (g)(i) Has been convicted of any crime against a child or other
33 person listed in RCW 43.43.830(5).

34 (ii) Except as provided in (g)(iii) of this subsection, any person
35 who becomes ineligible for a concealed pistol license as a result of a
36 conviction for a crime listed in (g)(i) of this subsection and then
37 successfully completes all terms of his or her sentence, as evidenced
38 by a certificate of discharge issued under RCW 9.94A.220 in the case of
39 a sentence under chapter 9.94A RCW, and has not again been convicted of

1 any crime and is not under indictment for any crime, may, one year or
2 longer after such successful sentence completion, petition a court of
3 record for a declaration that the person is no longer ineligible for a
4 concealed pistol license under (g)(i) of this subsection.

5 (iii) No person convicted of a (~~serious offense~~) crime of
6 violence as defined in RCW 9.41.010 may have his or her right to
7 possess firearms restored, unless the person has been granted relief
8 from disabilities by the secretary of the treasury under 18 U.S.C. Sec.
9 925(c), or RCW 9.41.040 (3) or (4) applies.

10 (2) The issuing authority shall check with the national crime
11 information center, the Washington state patrol electronic data base,
12 the department of social and health services electronic data base, and
13 with other agencies or resources as appropriate, to determine whether
14 the applicant is ineligible under RCW 9.41.040 to possess a pistol and
15 therefore ineligible for a concealed pistol license. This subsection
16 applies (~~whether~~) when the applicant is applying for a new concealed
17 pistol license (~~or to renew a concealed pistol license~~).

18 (3) Any person whose firearms rights have been restricted and who
19 has been granted relief from disabilities by the secretary of the
20 treasury under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 925(c) or who is exempt under 18 U.S.C.
21 Sec. 921(a)(20)(A) shall have his or her right to acquire, receive,
22 transfer, ship, transport, carry, and possess firearms in accordance
23 with Washington state law restored except as otherwise prohibited by
24 this chapter.

25 (4) The license application shall be in triplicate, in form to be
26 prescribed by the department of licensing, and shall bear the full
27 name, street address, date and place of birth, race, gender,
28 description, fingerprints, and signature of the licensee, and the
29 licensee's driver's license number or state identification card number
30 if used for identification in applying for the license. A signed
31 application for a concealed pistol license shall constitute a waiver of
32 confidentiality and written request that the department of social and
33 health services, mental health institutions, and other health care
34 facilities release information relevant to the applicant's eligibility
35 for a concealed pistol license to an inquiring court or law enforcement
36 agency.

37 The license application shall contain a warning substantially as
38 follows:

1 CAUTION: Although state and local laws do not differ, federal
2 law and state law on the possession of firearms differ. If you
3 are prohibited by federal law from possessing a firearm, you
4 may be prosecuted in federal court. A state license is not a
5 defense to a federal prosecution.

6 The license application shall contain a description of the major
7 differences between state and federal law and an explanation of the
8 fact that local laws and ordinances on firearms are preempted by state
9 law and must be consistent with state law. The application shall
10 contain questions about the applicant's eligibility under RCW 9.41.040
11 to possess a pistol, the applicant's place of birth, whether the
12 applicant is a United States citizen, and whether he or she has been
13 required to register with the state or federal government and has an
14 identification or registration number. The applicant shall not be
15 required to produce a birth certificate or other evidence of
16 citizenship. A person who is not a citizen of the United States shall
17 meet the additional requirements of RCW 9.41.170.

18 The original thereof shall be delivered to the licensee, the
19 duplicate shall within seven days be sent by registered mail to the
20 director of licensing and the triplicate shall be preserved for six
21 years, by the authority issuing the license.

22 The department of licensing shall make available to law enforcement
23 and corrections agencies, in an on-line format, all information
24 received under this subsection.

25 (5) The nonrefundable fee for the original (~~issuance of a~~)
26 four-year license shall be fifty dollars. No other state or local
27 branch or unit of government may impose any additional charges on the
28 applicant for the issuance of the license. Additional charges imposed
29 by the federal bureau of investigation for fingerprint-based background
30 checking may be passed on to the applicant.

31 The fee shall be distributed as follows:

32 (a) Fifteen dollars shall be paid to the state general fund;

33 (b) Ten dollars shall be paid to the agency taking the fingerprints
34 of the person licensed;

35 (c) Fifteen dollars shall be paid to the issuing authority for the
36 purpose of enforcing this chapter; and

37 (d) Ten dollars to the firearms range account (~~in the general~~
38 ~~fund~~) established in RCW 77.12.720.

1 (6) The fee for the renewal of such license shall be (~~fifty~~)
2 twenty-five dollars. No other branch or unit of government may impose
3 any additional charges on the applicant for the renewal of the license.

4 The renewal fee shall be distributed as follows:

5 (a) (~~Twenty~~) Ten dollars shall be paid to the state general fund;

6 (b) (~~Twenty~~) Ten dollars shall be paid to the issuing authority
7 for the purpose of enforcing this chapter; and

8 (c) (~~Ten~~) Five dollars to the firearms range account in the
9 general fund.

10 (7) Payment shall be by cash, check, or money order at the option
11 of the applicant. Additional methods of payment may be allowed at the
12 option of the issuing authority.

13 (8) A licensee may renew a license if the licensee applies for
14 renewal within ninety days before or after the expiration date of the
15 license. A license so renewed shall take effect on the expiration date
16 of the prior license. A licensee renewing after the expiration date of
17 the license must pay a late renewal penalty of twenty dollars in
18 addition to the renewal fee specified in subsection (6) of this
19 section. The fee shall be distributed as follows:

20 (a) Ten dollars shall be deposited in the state wildlife fund and
21 used exclusively for the printing and distribution of a pamphlet on the
22 legal limits of the use of firearms, firearms safety, and the
23 preemptive nature of state law. The pamphlet shall be given to each
24 applicant for a license; and

25 (b) Ten dollars shall be paid to the issuing authority for the
26 purpose of enforcing this chapter.

27 (9) Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections (1) through (8)
28 of this section, the chief of police of the municipality or the sheriff
29 of the county of the applicant's residence may issue a temporary
30 emergency license for good cause pending review under subsection (1) of
31 this section.

32 (10) A political subdivision of the state shall not modify the
33 requirements of this section or chapter, nor may a political
34 subdivision ask the applicant to voluntarily submit any information not
35 required by this section.

36 (11) A person who knowingly makes a false statement regarding
