
HOUSE BILL 1336

State of Washington 54th Legislature 1995 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to accountability and collaboration in higher
2 education and K-12 education; and adding new sections to chapter 28B.10
3 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 The legislature finds that some college students who have recently
8 graduated from high school must immediately enroll in one or more
9 precollege classes before they can proceed successfully through
10 college. The legislature also finds that these students should have
11 received basic skills in English, reading, spelling, grammar, and
12 mathematics including intermediate algebra, before graduating from high
13 school. It is the intent of the legislature that colleges and
14 universities provide information to school districts about recent
15 graduates who enroll in precollege classes. It is also the intent of
16 the legislature to encourage institutions of higher education and the
17 common schools to work together to solve problems of common concern.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW
2 to read as follows:

3 By June 30th of each year, each state university, each regional
4 university, The Evergreen State College, and, for community colleges
5 and technical colleges, the state board for community and technical
6 colleges shall provide a report to the office of the superintendent of
7 public instruction and to the commission on student learning under RCW
8 28A.630.885. The report shall contain the following information on
9 students who, within three years of graduating from a Washington high
10 school, enrolled in a state-supported precollege level class at the
11 baccalaureate institution or at a community college or a technical
12 college: (1) The number of such students enrolled in a state-supported
13 precollege level class in mathematics including intermediate algebra,
14 reading, grammar, spelling, writing, or English; (2) the types of
15 precollege classes in which each student was enrolled; and (3) the name
16 of the Washington high school from which each student graduated.

17 For students who enrolled in a precollege class within three years
18 of graduating from a Washington high school, each institution of higher
19 education shall also report to the Washington high school from which
20 the student graduated. The report shall include information on the
21 number of students from that high school enrolled in precollege
22 classes, and the types of classes taken by the students.

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
