- 1 AN ACT Relating to compensation for occupational disease; and
- 2 amending RCW 51.32.100.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 51.32.100 and 1977 ex.s. c 350 s 49 are each amended 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) If it is determined that an injured worker had, at the time of
- 7 his or her injury, a preexisting disease and that such disease delays
- 8 or prevents complete recovery from such injury, it shall be
- 9 ascertained, as nearly as possible, the period over which the injury
- 10 would have caused disability were it not for the diseased condition and
- 11 the extent of permanent partial disability which the injury would have
- 12 caused were it not for the disease, and compensation shall be awarded
- 13 only therefor.
- 14 (2) If a worker has an occupational disease that is caused in part
- 15 by nonoccupational exposure or by occupational exposure during the
- 16 course of employment not covered by this title, the worker or the
- 17 worker's beneficiaries must receive compensation and benefits only to
- 18 the extent and in the proportion to which the exposure during
- 19 employment covered by this title contributed to the development of the

- 1 disease. For purposes of this section, it is presumed that injurious
- 2 <u>occupational exposure contributed to the disease only in the proportion</u>
- 3 to which the period of occupational exposure covered by this title
- 4 bears to the total period of injurious exposure from an occupational or
- 5 <u>nonoccupational source.</u>
