AN ACT Relating to candidates filing for election; amending RCW 29.15.020, 29.15.120, 29.15.160, 29.27.020, and 29.42.050; and repealing RCW 29.18.150.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29.15.020 and 1990 c 59 s 81 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 Except where otherwise provided by this title, declarations of 8 candidacy for the following offices shall be filed during regular 9 business hours with the filing officer no earlier than the ((fourth)) 10 <u>second Monday in July and no later than the ((following)) second Friday</u> 11 <u>after the first day of filing</u> in the year in which the office is 12 scheduled to be voted upon:

(1) Offices that are scheduled to be voted upon for full terms or
both full terms and short terms at, or in conjunction with, a state
general election; and

(2) Offices where a vacancy, other than a short term, exists that has not been filled by election and for which an election to fill the vacancy is required in conjunction with the next state general election. 1 This section supersedes all other statutes that provide for a 2 different filing period for these offices.

3 Sec. 2. RCW 29.15.120 and 1994 c 223 s 6 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

A candidate may withdraw his or her declaration of candidacy at any 5 time before the close of business on the ((Thursday following the)) б 7 last day for candidates to file under RCW 29.15.020 by filing, with the officer with whom the declaration of candidacy was filed, a signed 8 9 request that his or her name not be printed on the ballot. There shall be no withdrawal period for declarations of candidacy filed during 10 special filing periods held under this title. The filing officer may 11 permit the withdrawal of a filing for the office of precinct committee 12 officer at the request of the candidate at any time if no absentee 13 14 ballots have been issued for that office and the general election 15 ballots for that precinct have not been printed. The filing officer may permit the withdrawal of a filing for any elected office of a city, 16 town, or special district at the request of the candidate at any time 17 18 before a primary if the primary ballots for that city, town, or special district have not been ordered. No filing fee may be refunded to any 19 candidate who withdraws under this section. Notice of the deadline for 20 21 withdrawal of candidacy and that the filing fee is not refundable shall 22 be given to each candidate at the time he or she files.

23 **Sec. 3.** RCW 29.15.160 and 1975-'76 2nd ex.s. c 120 s 9 are each 24 amended to read as follows:

A void in candidacy for a nonpartisan office occurs when an election for such office, except for the short term, has been scheduled and ((no valid declaration of candidacy has been filed for the position or)) all persons filing ((such)) valid declarations of candidacy have died or been disqualified.

30 Sec. 4. RCW 29.27.020 and 1990 c 59 s 8 are each amended to read 31 as follows:

On or before the day following the last day for ((political parties to fill vacancies in the ticket as provided by RCW 29.18.150)) filing, the secretary of state shall certify to each county auditor a list of the candidates who have filed declarations of candidacy in his or her office for the primary. For each office, the certificate shall include

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1 the name of each candidate, his or her address, and his or her party 2 designation, if any.

3 Sec. 5. RCW 29.42.050 and 1991 c 363 s 34 are each amended to read 4 as follows:

The statutory requirements for filing as a candidate at the 5 primaries shall apply to candidates for precinct committee officer 6 7 ((except that the filing period for this office alone shall be extended 8 to and include the Friday immediately following the last day for 9 political parties to fill vacancies in the ticket as provided by RCW 29.18.150,)) and the office shall not be voted upon at the primaries, 10 but the names of all candidates must appear under the proper party and 11 office designations on the ballot for the general November election for 12 13 each even-numbered year and the one receiving the highest number of 14 votes shall be declared elected: PROVIDED, That to be declared 15 elected, a candidate must receive at least ten percent of the number of votes cast for the candidate of the candidate's party receiving the 16 greatest number of votes in the precinct. Any person elected to the 17 18 office of precinct committee officer who has not filed a declaration of candidacy shall pay the fee of one dollar to the county auditor for a 19 certificate of election. The term of office of precinct committee 20 officer shall be for two years, commencing upon completion of the 21 official canvass of votes by the county canvassing board of election 22 23 returns. Should any vacancy occur in this office by reason of death, 24 resignation, or disqualification of the incumbent, or because of 25 failure to elect, the respective county chair of the county central committee shall be empowered to fill such vacancy by appointment: 26 PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That in legislative districts having a majority of 27 its precincts in a county with a population of one million or more, 28 29 such appointment shall be made only upon the recommendation of the 30 legislative district chair: PROVIDED, That the person so appointed shall have the same qualifications as candidates when filing for 31 election to such office for such precinct: PROVIDED FURTHER, That when 32 33 a vacancy in the office of precinct committee officer exists because of 34 failure to elect at a state general election, such vacancy shall not be filled until after the organization meeting of the county central 35 36 committee and the new county chair selected as provided by RCW 29.42.030. 37
