AN ACT Relating to transportation funding and appropriations; amending RCW 82.36.025, 46.16.070, 46.68.035, 46.16.060; reenacting and amending RCW 46.68.090 and 43.84.092; adding a new section to chapter 82.36 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 47.08 RCW; creating new sections; making appropriations; providing an effective date; and providing for submission of this act to a vote of the people.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

TRANSPORTATION FUNDING

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. PURPOSE OF ENHANCED STATE AND LOCAL 10 TRANSPORTATION FUNDING PROGRAM. (1) The legislature finds and declares 11 that it is essential for the economic, social, and environmental well-12 being of the state and the maintenance of a high quality of life that 13 the people of the state have an efficient and effective transportation 14 system.

Increasing congestion and deteriorating conditions of public highways, streets, and roads threatens the safety and quality of life enjoyed by the citizens of the state and impairs the efficient movement of freight and goods vital to the state's economy.

1 Unlike other state taxes, the motor fuel tax does not rise with 2 inflation. Therefore, periodic adjustments to the tax rate are 3 necessary to keep pace with inflation and ensure that public highways 4 are maintained, preserved, and improved.

5 Cost effective solutions to current deficiencies and future needs 6 for state transportation systems and facilities are critical to address 7 essential multimodal, motorized and nonmotorized, urban, suburban and 8 rural transportation demands.

9 Increased investment in state and local transportation programs is 10 necessary to preserve and maintain the existing statewide, multimodal 11 transportation system and to provide safety and capacity improvements 12 that increase accessibility, mobility, safety, security, and service to 13 the travelling and commuting public. A new transportation funding 14 program is needed to accomplish the following objectives:

15 (a) State-wide System: Provide for preservation of the existing state-wide system and improvements for current and future capacity 16 17 needs in established urban and growing suburban areas to alleviate congestion attributable to economic development and growth; promote 18 19 economic growth through a transportation system that attracts, 20 supports, and increases commercial activity and productivity and enhances the state's ability to compete effectively in the global 21 market place; support the transportation needs of the rural areas of 22 the state through the preservation and improvement of transportation 23 24 systems and facilities that support agricultural activity and the 25 movement of agricultural products; and produce critical revenue to advance the construction of overdue capacity and safety improvements on 26 27 high cost projects needed to reduce accidents and safely move people and goods at reasonable speeds; 28

(b) Passenger Only Ferries: Provide multiple transportation opportunities through the expanded use of high speed passenger-only ferry service between the Olympic Peninsula and the greater metropolitan area of Puget Sound; and reduce dependence on single occupancy vehicle usage, and facilitate and promote attainment of federal and state clean air requirements and regional land use policies;

36 (c) Regional Transportation Solutions: Support joint 37 interjurisdictional transportation projects between the Washington 38 state department of transportation and cities and counties that

prioritize regional solutions for improving safety and increasing
 mobility on city streets and county roads; and

3 (d) Washington State Patrol: Ensure continuation of vital state 4 patrol services essential to the safety of the motoring public by 5 increasing state troopers and providing equitable salaries commensurate 6 with city and county law enforcement personnel; and maintaining 7 Washington state patrol officers on state highways to promote a safe 8 driving environment, provide motorist assistance services, and ensure 9 statewide emergency response services.

10 (2) The legislature further recognizes that the revenues currently 11 available to the state for improved cross sound transportation, the 12 preservation, safety, and capacity improvements on state highways, city 13 streets, and county roads fall far short of the identified need.

14 (3) The legislature further recognizes that the preservation and 15 enhancement of a comprehensive transportation network that is 16 responsive to the needs of the public and unique regional requirements 17 is dependent on statewide public support.

18 (4) The legislature further recognizes that although state law does 19 not require public approval for legislative measures raising 20 transportation revenues for highway purposes under Article II, section 21 40 of the state Constitution, it is in the best interest of the 22 citizens of Washington, to submit this measure for public approval at 23 the next November general election.

24 (5) The legislature, therefore, declares a need for the funding 25 program embodied in this act for: (a) Statewide funding for capacity, 26 safety, and mobility improvements on state highways; (b) funding to support bonds for improvements to State Route 18; (c) funding for 27 expanded passenger-only ferry service; (d) funding for regional 28 29 transportation solutions for cities and counties; (e) funding for 30 additional Washington state troopers and support personnel; and (f) equitable salary adjustments for state troopers. 31

32 **Sec. 2.** RCW 82.36.025 and 1994 c 179 s 30 are each amended to read 33 as follows:

The motor vehicle fuel tax rate shall be computed as the sum of the tax rate provided in subsection (1) of this section and the additional tax rates provided in subsections (2) through (((5))) (6) of this section.

1 (1) A motor vehicle fuel tax rate of seventeen cents per gallon 2 shall apply to the sale, distribution, or use of motor vehicle fuel.

3 (2) An additional motor vehicle fuel tax rate of one-third cent per 4 gallon shall apply to the sale, distribution, or use of motor vehicle 5 fuel, and the proceeds from this additional tax rate, reduced by an amount equal to the sum of the payments under RCW 46.68.090 (1) (a), 6 7 (b), and (c) multiplied by the additional tax rate prescribed by this 8 subsection divided by the motor vehicle fuel tax rate provided in this 9 section, shall be deposited in the rural arterial trust account in the 10 motor vehicle fund for expenditures under RCW 36.79.020.

(3) An additional motor vehicle fuel tax rate of one-third cent per 11 gallon shall apply to the sale, distribution, or use of motor vehicle 12 13 fuel, and the proceeds from this additional tax rate, reduced by an amount equal to the sum of the payments under RCW 46.68.090 (1) (a), 14 15 (b), and (c) multiplied by the additional tax rate prescribed by this 16 subsection divided by the motor vehicle fuel tax rate provided in this 17 section, shall be deposited in the urban arterial trust account in the motor vehicle fund. After June 30, 1995, ninety-five percent of this 18 19 revenue shall be deposited in the urban arterial trust account in the 20 motor vehicle fund and five percent shall be deposited in the small city account in the motor vehicle fund. 21

(4) An additional motor vehicle fuel tax rate of one-third cent per 22 gallon shall be applied to the sale, distribution, or use of motor 23 vehicle fuel, and the proceeds from this additional tax rate, reduced 24 25 by an amount equal to the sum of the payments under RCW 46.68.090 (1) (a), (b), and (c) multiplied by the additional tax rate prescribed by 26 27 this subsection divided by the motor vehicle fuel tax rate provided in this section, shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund to be 28 expended for highway purposes of the state as defined in RCW 46.68.130. 29

30 (5) An additional motor vehicle fuel tax rate of four cents per gallon from April 1, 1990, through March 31, 1991, and five cents per 31 gallon from April 1, 1991, applies to the sale, distribution, or use of 32 33 motor vehicle fuel. The proceeds from the additional tax rate under this subsection, reduced by an amount equal to the sum of the payments 34 35 under RCW 46.68.090 (1) (a), (b), and (c) multiplied by the additional tax rate prescribed by this subsection divided by the motor fuel tax 36 37 rate provided in this section, shall be deposited in the motor vehicle fund and shall be distributed by the state treasurer according to RCW 38 39 46.68.095.

(6) An additional motor vehicle fuel tax rate of four cents per 1 gallon beginning January 1, 1996, is imposed on the sale, distribution, 2 or use of motor vehicle fuel. The proceeds from the additional tax 3 4 rate imposed under this subsection, reduced by an amount equal to the sum of payments under RCW 46.68.090(1)(a) and (b) multiplied by the 5 additional tax rate prescribed by this subsection divided by the motor б 7 vehicle fuel tax rate provided in this section, shall be deposited in 8 the motor vehicle fund and shall be distributed by the state treasurer 9 according to RCW 46.68.090.

10 Sec. 3. RCW 46.68.090 and 1994 c 225 s 2 and 1994 c 179 s 3 are 11 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) All moneys that have accrued or may accrue to the motor vehicle fund from the motor vehicle fuel tax and special fuel tax shall be first expended for the following purposes:

(a) For payment of refunds of motor vehicle fuel tax and specialfuel tax that has been paid and is refundable as provided by law;

17 (b) For payment of amounts to be expended pursuant to 18 appropriations for the administrative expenses of the offices of state 19 treasurer, state auditor, and the department of licensing of the state 20 of Washington in the administration of the motor vehicle fuel tax and 21 the special fuel tax, which sums shall be distributed monthly;

(c) From April 1, 1992, through March 31, 1996, for distribution to the transfer relief account, hereby created in the motor vehicle fund, an amount not to exceed three hundred twenty-five one-thousandths of one percent;

(d) For distribution to the rural arterial trust account in the motor vehicle fund, an amount as provided in RCW 82.36.025(2) and 46.68.095(3);

(e) For distribution to the urban arterial trust account in the motor vehicle fund, an amount as provided in RCW 46.68.100(4) and 82.36.025(3);

(f) For distribution to the transportation improvement account inthe motor vehicle fund, an amount as provided in RCW 46.68.095(1);

34 (g) For distribution to the special category C account, hereby 35 created in the motor vehicle fund, an amount as provided in RCW 36 46.68.095(2);

(h) For distribution to the county arterial preservation account,
 hereby created in the motor vehicle fund, an amount as provided in RCW
 46.68.095(4);

4 (i) For distribution to the motor vehicle fund to be allocated to 5 cities and towns as provided in RCW 46.68.110, an amount as provided in 6 RCW 46.68.095(5);

7 (j) For distribution to the motor vehicle fund to be allocated to 8 counties as provided in RCW 46.68.120, an amount as provided in RCW 9 46.68.095(6);

10 (k) For expenditure for highway purposes of the state as defined in 11 RCW 46.68.130, an amount as provided in RCW 82.36.025(4) and 12 46.68.095(7);

(1) From July 1, 1994, through June 30, 1995, for distribution to the gasohol exemption holding account, hereby created in the motor vehicle fund, an amount equal to five and thirty-four one-hundredths of one percent of the amount available prior to distributions provided under (a) through (k) of this subsection, to be used only for highway construction;

(m) For distribution to the small city account, hereby created in
the motor vehicle fund, an amount as provided for in RCW 46.68.095(1),
46.68.100(9), and 82.36.025(3).

(n) For distribution to the Puget Sound ferry operation account, an
 amount as provided in section 4(1) of this act;

24 (o) For distribution to the special category C account, an amount 25 as provided in section 4(2) of this act, provided solely for the 26 location, design, right of way acquisition, and related construction 27 costs on State Route 18;

28 (p) For distribution to the regional transportation fund created 29 under section 8 of this act, an amount as provided in section 4(3) of 30 this act;

31 (q) For expenditures for the location, design, right of way 32 acquisition, and construction costs of highway construction projects as 33 prioritized under chapter 47.05 RCW, an amount as provided in section 34 <u>4(4) of this act.</u>

(2) The amount accruing to the motor vehicle fund by virtue of the motor vehicle fuel tax and the special fuel tax and remaining after payments, distributions, and expenditures as provided in this section shall, for the purposes of this chapter, be referred to as the "net tax amount." <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 82.36 RCW
 to read as follows:

All moneys that have accrued or may accrue to the motor vehicle fund from the motor vehicle fuel tax and special fuel tax imposed by RCW 82.36.025(6) shall be distributed monthly by the state treasurer in the following proportions:

7 (1) Twenty-five one-hundredths of one cent shall be deposited in8 the Puget Sound ferry operations account in the motor vehicle fund;

9 (2) Twenty-five one-hundredths of one cent shall be deposited in 10 the special category C account in the motor vehicle fund to be used 11 solely for those purposes enumerated in RCW 46.68.090(1)(o);

12 (3) Seventy-five one-hundredths of one cent shall be deposited in13 the regional transportation fund; and

14 (4) Two and seventy-five one-hundredths of one cent shall be
15 deposited in the motor vehicle fund and expended for highway
16 construction projects as authorized in RCW 46.68.090(1)(q).

17 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.16.070 and 1994 c 262 s 8 are each amended to read 18 as follows:

all other vehicle licensing 19 (1) In lieu of fees, unless specifically exempt, and in addition to the excise tax prescribed in 20 chapter 82.44 RCW and the mileage fees prescribed for buses and stages 21 in RCW 46.16.125, there shall be paid and collected annually for each 22 23 truck, motor truck, truck tractor, road tractor, tractor, bus, auto 24 stage, or for hire vehicle with seating capacity of more than six, based upon the declared combined gross weight or declared gross weight 25 26 thereof pursuant to the provisions of chapter 46.44 RCW, the following licensing fees by such gross weight: 27

 logs or that do not tow trailers. Schedule B applies to vehicles that
 tow trailers and are not covered under Schedule A.

4 Every truck, motor truck, truck tractor, and tractor exceeding 5 6,000 pounds empty scale weight registered under chapter 46.16, 46.87, or 46.88 RCW shall be licensed for not less than one hundred fifty 6 percent of its empty weight unless the amount would be in excess of the 7 legal limits prescribed for such a vehicle in RCW 46.44.041 or 8 9 46.44.042, in which event the vehicle shall be licensed for the maximum 10 weight authorized for such a vehicle or unless the vehicle is used only for the purpose of transporting any well drilling machine, air 11 compressor, rock crusher, conveyor, hoist, donkey engine, cook house, 12 13 tool house, bunk house, or similar machine or structure attached to or made a part of such vehicle. 14

The following provisions apply when increasing gross or combined for a vehicle licensed under this section:

(a) The new license fee will be one-twelfth of the fee listed above for the new gross weight, multiplied by the number of months remaining in the period for which licensing fees have been paid, including the month in which the new gross weight is effective.

(b) Upon surrender of the current certificate of registration or cab card, the new licensing fees due shall be reduced by the amount of the licensing fees previously paid for the same period for which new fees are being charged.

(2) The proceeds from the fees collected under subsection (1) ofthis section shall be distributed in accordance with RCW 46.68.035.

27 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.68.035 and 1993 c 102 s 7 are each amended to read 28 as follows:

All proceeds from combined vehicle licensing fees received by the director for vehicles licensed under RCW 46.16.070 and 46.16.085 shall be forwarded to the state treasurer to be distributed into accounts according to the following method:

(1) The sum of two dollars for each vehicle shall be deposited into the highway safety fund, except that for each vehicle registered by a county auditor or agent to a county auditor pursuant to RCW 46.01.140, the sum of two dollars shall be credited to the current county expense fund.

38 (2) The remainder shall be distributed as follows:

(a) ((23.677)) <u>26.182</u> percent shall be deposited into the state
 patrol highway account of the motor vehicle fund;

3 (b) ((1.521)) <u>1.471</u> percent shall be deposited into the Puget Sound 4 ferry operations account of the motor vehicle fund; and

7 Sec. 7. RCW 46.16.060 and 1992 c 216 s 4 are each amended to read 8 as follows:

9 (1) Except for vehicles already so taxed in RCW 46.16.070 and 46.16.085 or as otherwise specifically provided by law for the 10 licensing of vehicles, there shall be paid and collected annually for 11 12 each registration year or fractional part thereof and upon each vehicle 13 a license fee of ((twenty-three)) twenty-seven dollars and seventy-five 14 cents, but effective with initial motor vehicle registrations that 15 expire in January, ((1989)) 1997, and thereafter, the license fee shall be ((twenty-seven)) thirty dollars and seventy-five cents; however, if 16 the vehicle was previously licensed in this state and has not been 17 18 registered in another jurisdiction in the intervening period, the renewal license fee shall be ((nineteen dollars)) twenty-three dollars 19 and seventy-five cents, but effective with vehicle license renewals 20 that expire in January, ((1989)) <u>1997</u>, and thereafter, the renewal 21 22 license fee shall be ((twenty-three)) twenty-six dollars and seventy-23 five cents. On all new and renewal license fees, an additional fifty 24 cents shall be collected and remitted to the department for deposit into the department of licensing services account of the motor vehicle 25 The proceeds of such fees shall be distributed in accordance 26 fund. with RCW 46.68.030. The fee for licensing each house-moving dolly 27 which is used exclusively for moving buildings or homes on the highway 28 29 under special permit as provided for in chapter 46.44 RCW shall be 30 ((twenty-five dollars)) twenty-nine dollars and seventy-five cents, but effective with licenses that expire in January, ((1989)) 1997, and 31 thereafter, the fee shall be ((twenty-nine)) thirty-two dollars and 32 33 seventy-five cents, and no other fee shall be charged for the load 34 carried thereon.

35 (2) The department of licensing, county auditors, and other 36 authorized agents shall collect for any registration year any increase 37 in the fees authorized by this section for the months of that 38 registration year in which any such increase is effective in the same

manner and at the same time as such fees for that registration year
 would otherwise be collected as provided by law.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. A new section is added to chapter 47.08 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) The regional transportation fund is hereby created. Moneys may 6 be used for regionally significant transportation projects that 7 constitute "highway purposes" under Article II, section 40 of the state 8 Constitution.

9 (2) The transportation improvement board shall administer the fund. 10 The board is authorized to adopt rules to carry out the purposes of 11 section 1 of this act. In administering projects that receive grants 12 from the regional transportation fund, the board shall ensure that:

(a) Regionally significant transportation projects be included in
 a regional transportation improvement program that has been adopted by
 a regional transportation planning organization constituted under
 chapter 47.80 RCW;

(b) Regional transportation projects proposing to use matching funds provided by the state department of transportation, transit district, city, town, county, port district, or other local source of funding should be given weight in any project funding criteria developed by the board;

(c) Regional transportation projects that would enable transportation facilities to meet concurrency requirements and adopted level of service standards should be given weight in any project funding criteria developed by the board; and

(d) Regional transportation projects that address complex, cross jurisdictional transportation problems should be given weight in any
 project funding criteria developed by the board.

(3) The transportation improvement board shall present its proposedrules to the legislative transportation committee prior to adoption.

problem or opportunity that the information systems project is intended 1 2 to address; a statement of project objectives and assumptions; definition of phases, tasks, and activities to be accomplished and the 3 4 estimated cost of each phase; a description of how the agency will 5 facilitate responsibilities of oversight agencies; a description of key decision points in the project life cycle; a description of variance 6 7 control measures; a definitive schedule that shows the elapsed time 8 estimated to complete the project and when each task is to be started 9 and completed; and a description of resource requirements to accomplish 10 the activities within specified time, cost, and functionality 11 constraints.

(3) A copy of each feasibility study and project management plan shall be provided to the department of information services, the office of financial management, and legislative transportation committees. Authority to expend any funds for individual information systems projects is conditioned on approval of the relevant feasibility study and project management plan by the department of information services and the office of financial management.

19 (4) A bimonthly project status report shall be submitted to the department of information services, the office of financial management, 20 and legislative transportation committees for each project prior to 21 22 reaching key decision points identified in the project management plan. 23 Project status reports include: Project name, agency undertaking the project, a description of the project, key project activities or 24 25 accomplishments during the next sixty to ninety days, baseline cost 26 data, costs to date, baseline schedule, schedule to date, risk 27 assessments, risk management, any deviations from the project feasibility study, and recommendations. 28

Work shall not commence on any task in a subsequent phase of a project until the status report for the preceding key decision point has been approved by the department of information services and the office of financial management.

33 (5) If a project review is requested in accordance with department 34 of information services policies, the reviews shall examine and 35 evaluate: System requirements specifications; scope; system architecture; change controls; documentation; user involvement; 36 37 training; availability and capability of resources; programming languages and techniques; system inputs and outputs; plans for testing, 38 39 conversion, implementation, and postimplementation; and other aspects
