1 AN ACT Relating to common school construction funding; amending
2 1994 c 308 s 74 (uncodified); making appropriations; and declaring an
3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The sum of two hundred ten million dollars
6 is appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1995, from the general
7 fund to the common school construction fund for the purposes under RCW
8 28A.515.320.

9 **Sec. 2.** 1994 c 308 s 74 (uncodified) is amended to read as
10 follows:

11 **FOR THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION**

12 **Common schools: Design and construction (94-2-001)**

13 The appropriations in this subsection are subject to the following
14 conditions and limitations:

15 (1) Not more than \$106,000,000 from this appropriation and the
16 appropriation for common school construction in Substitute Senate Bill
17 No. 6244 combined may be obligated in fiscal year 1994 for school
18 district project design and construction.

1 (2) A maximum of \$1,250,000 may be expended for direct costs of
2 state administration of school construction funding.

3 (3) A maximum of \$630,000 may be expended for three full-time
4 equivalent field staff with construction or architectural experience to
5 assist in evaluation of project requests and reviewing information
6 reported by school districts and certifying the building condition data
7 submitted by school districts.

8 (4) A maximum of \$75,000 is provided solely for development of an
9 automated state inventory and facility condition management data base.
10 This data base shall utilize information obtained through
11 implementation of the new priority system developed in the 1991-93
12 biennium and periodic updating.

13 (5) Projects approved for state assistance by the state board after
14 the effective date of this section, in which new construction will be
15 in lieu of modernization of an existing instructional facility or
16 space, shall receive state assistance only if the district certifies
17 that the existing facility or space will not be used for instructional
18 purposes, and that the facility or space will be ineligible for any
19 future state financial assistance. Further, if the district does
20 return the facility or space to instructional purposes, the district
21 shall become ineligible for state construction financial assistance for
22 a period of at least five years as determined by the state board of
23 education. The state board shall adopt regulations to implement this
24 subsection.
