- 1 AN ACT Relating to solid waste permit renewal; amending RCW
- 2 70.95.030 and 70.95.180; and repealing RCW 70.95.190.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.95.030 and 1992 c 174 s 16 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 As used in this chapter, unless the context indicates otherwise:
- 7 (1) "City" means every incorporated city and town.
- 8 (2) "Commission" means the utilities and transportation commission.
- 9 (3) "Committee" means the state solid waste advisory committee.
- 10 (4) "Department" means the department of ecology.
- 11 (5) "Director" means the director of the department of ecology.
- 12 (6) "Disposal site" means the location where any final treatment,
- 13 utilization, processing, or deposit of solid waste occurs.
- 14 (7) "Energy recovery" means a process operating under federal and
- 15 state environmental laws and regulations for converting solid waste
- 16 into usable energy and for reducing the volume of solid waste.
- 17 (8) "Functional standards" means criteria for solid waste handling
- 18 expressed in terms of expected performance or solid waste handling
- 19 functions.

- 1 (9) "Incineration" means a process of reducing the volume of solid 2 waste operating under federal and state environmental laws and 3 regulations by use of an enclosed device using controlled flame 4 combustion.
- 5 (10) "Jurisdictional health department" means city, county, city-6 county, or district public health department.
- 7 (11) "Landfill" means a disposal facility or part of a facility at 8 which solid waste is placed in or on land and which is not a land 9 treatment facility.
- 10 (12) "Local government" means a city, town, or county.
- 11 (13) "Modify" means to substantially change the design or
 12 operational plans including, but not limited to, removal of a design
 13 element previously set forth in a permit application or a disposal or
 14 processing activity that is not approved in the permit.
- 15 <u>(14)</u> "Multiple family residence" means any structure housing two or 16 more dwelling units.
- (((14))) <u>(15)</u> "Person" means individual, firm, association, copartnership, political subdivision, government agency, municipality, industry, public or private corporation, or any other entity whatsoever.
 - ((\(\frac{(15)}{15}\))) (16) "Recyclable materials" means those solid wastes that are separated for recycling or reuse, such as papers, metals, and glass, that are identified as recyclable material pursuant to a local comprehensive solid waste plan. Prior to the adoption of the local comprehensive solid waste plan, adopted pursuant to RCW 70.95.110(2), local governments may identify recyclable materials by ordinance from July 23, 1989.
- $((\frac{16}{16}))$ <u>(17)</u> "Recycling" means transforming or remanufacturing waste materials into usable or marketable materials for use other than landfill disposal or incineration.
- 31 $((\frac{17}{17}))$ (18) "Residence" means the regular dwelling place of an 32 individual or individuals.
- (((18))) <u>(19)</u> "Sewage sludge" means a semisolid substance consisting of settled sewage solids combined with varying amounts of water and dissolved materials, generated from a wastewater treatment system, that does not meet the requirements of chapter 70.95J RCW.
- (((19))) <u>(20)</u> "Solid waste" or "wastes" means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid and semisolid wastes including, but not limited to, garbage, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, swill, sewage sludge,

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- 1 demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles or parts 2 thereof, and recyclable materials.
- (((20))) (21) "Solid waste handling" means the management, storage, collection, transportation, treatment, utilization, processing, and final disposal of solid wastes, including the recovery and recycling of materials from solid wastes, the recovery of energy resources from solid wastes or the conversion of the energy in solid wastes to more useful forms or combinations thereof.
- 9 $((\frac{(21)}{21}))$ "Source separation" means the separation of different 10 kinds of solid waste at the place where the waste originates.
- (((22))) <u>(23)</u> "Vehicle" includes every device physically capable of being moved upon a public or private highway, road, street, or watercourse and in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public or private highway, road, street, or watercourse, except devices moved by human or animal power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.
- 17 $((\frac{(23)}{)})$ <u>(24)</u> "Waste reduction" means reducing the amount or 18 toxicity of waste generated or reusing materials.
- 19 **Sec. 2.** RCW 70.95.180 and 1988 c 127 s 30 are each amended to read 20 as follows:
- 21 (1) Applications for permits to operate new or existing solid waste 22 ((disposal sites)) handling facilities shall be on forms prescribed by 23 the department and shall contain a description of the proposed and 24 existing facilities and operations at the site, plans specifications for any new or additional facilities to be constructed, 25 and such other information as the jurisdictional health department may 26 deem necessary in order to determine whether the site and solid waste 27 disposal facilities located thereon will comply with local and state 28 29 regulations.
- (2) Upon receipt of an application for a permit to establish, ((alter, expand, improve)) modify, or continue in use a solid waste ((disposal site)) handling facility, the jurisdictional health department shall refer one copy of the application to the department which shall report its findings to the jurisdictional health department.
- 36 (3) The jurisdictional health department shall investigate every 37 application as may be necessary to determine whether an existing or 38 proposed site and facilities meet all <u>solid waste</u>, <u>air</u>, <u>and other</u>

- 1 applicable laws and regulations, and conforms with the approved 2 comprehensive solid waste handling plan, and complies with all zoning 3 requirements.
- 4 (4) ((\text{When})) The jurisdictional health department shall hold a public hearing before making a permit decision. If the jurisdictional health department finds that the permit should be issued, it shall issue such permit. Every application shall be approved or disapproved within ninety days after its receipt by the jurisdictional health department.
- (5)(a) Except as provided in (b) of this subsection, every permit for a solid waste handling facility may be issued for a period of one to five years, as determined by the local jurisdictional health department.
- 14 <u>(b) An existing solid waste handling facility shall be reviewed and</u>
 15 <u>issued a permit before making any changes meeting the criteria under</u>
 16 RCW 70.95.030(13).
- 17 <u>(6)</u> The jurisdictional board of health may establish reasonable 18 fees for permits and renewal of permits. All permit fees collected by 19 the health department shall be deposited in the treasury and to the 20 account from which the health department's operating expenses are paid.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** RCW 70.95.190 and 1984 c 123 s 9 & 1969 22 ex.s. c 134 s 19 are each repealed.
