## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2167

## State of Washington 54th Legislature 1996 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to regular maintenance of marinas; adding a new 2 section to chapter 75.20 RCW; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 The legislature finds that initial NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 5 construction of a marina and some maintenance activities change the natural flow or bed of the salt or fresh water body in which the marina 6 7 is constructed. Because of this disturbance, it is appropriate that plans for initial marina construction as well as some maintenance 8 9 activities undergo the hydraulic project review and approval process 10 established in chapter 75.20 RCW.

It is the intent of the legislature that after a marina has received a hydraulic project approval and been constructed, a renewable, five-year hydraulic project approval be issued, upon request, for regular maintenance activities within the marina.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 75.20 RCW 16 to read as follows:

17 (1) For a marina in existence on the effective date of this act or18 a marina that has received a hydraulic project approval for its initial

construction, a renewable, five-year hydraulic project approval shall
be issued, upon request, for regular maintenance activities of the
marina.

4 (2) Upon construction of a new marina that has received hydraulic 5 project approval, a renewable, five-year hydraulic project approval 6 shall be issued, upon request, for regular maintenance activities of 7 the marina.

8 (3) For the purposes of this section, regular maintenance 9 activities are only those activities necessary to restore the marina to 10 the conditions approved in the initial hydraulic project approval. 11 These activities may include, but are not limited to, dredging, piling 12 replacement, and float replacement.

13 (4) The five-year permit must include a requirement that a 14 fourteen-day notice be given to the department before regular 15 maintenance activities begin.

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
