The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations and specified amounts are provided solely for that activity:

The legislative transportation committee shall convene 29 (1) representatives from the department of transportation, Washington state 30 patrol, department of licensing, and any other agency receiving an 31 appropriation in this act, as necessary, to establish performance 32 33 measures that are associated with the ((final legislative 34 appropriation)) budget for the 1997-1999 biennium. The performance measures are to be established and will be tracked within the 35 36 transportation executive information system.

(2) The legislative transportation committee shall convene one or 1 more groups to address activities that result in the loss of 2 transportation tax revenue. The groups shall present their findings to 3 4 the legislative transportation committee and the office of financial One of the groups shall study and submit to the 5 management. legislature by October 1, 1996, draft legislation to move the special 6 fuel tax point of collection from the special fuel dealer level to the 7 8 bulk transfer/terminal system. The group may also study the 9 feasibility of moving the point of collection for motor vehicle fuel. 10 (3) ((The legislative transportation committee shall study the governance and operations of the ports.)) The legislative 11

12 transportation committee shall undertake an assessment of the methods 13 and technology currently available to create a driver's license and 14 identicard that cannot be fraudulently obtained from the department of 15 licensing, thereby providing the public, businesses, and agencies with 16 a more secure driver's license. A consultant may be hired to assist in 17 the assessment. A final report is due by January 15, 1997.
