This compares to a level of 700 commissioned officers that was established in the 1993-95 biennium. To achieve these levels: A class of not less than 30 cadets shall begin in July of 1995 and a class of not less than 40 cadets shall begin in January of 1996.

Priority for grants provided from these 22 23 accounts shall be given to projects and programs that can be 24 accomplished in the 1995-1997 biennium and that are not primarily 25 intended for the planning of facilities. Prior to July 1, 1996, no 26 applications for grants from the central Puget Sound public 27 transportation account may be accepted from, nor may funds from that account be granted to, the regional transit authority.
