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## HOUSE BILL 2729

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State of Washington 54th Legislature 1996 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to transportation improvement board statute
- 2 housekeeping changes; and amending RCW 47.26.121, 47.26.140, and
- 3 47.66.030.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.26.121 and 1995 c 269 s 2603 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) There is hereby created a transportation improvement board of
- 8 twenty-one members, six of whom shall be county members and six of whom
- 9 shall be city members. The remaining members shall be: (a) One
- 10 representative appointed by the governor who shall be a state employee
- 11 with responsibility for transportation policy, planning, or funding;
- 12 (b) two representatives from the department of transportation; (c) two
- 13 representatives of public transit systems; (d) a private sector
- 14 representative; (e) a member representing the ports; (f) a member
- 15 representing nonmotorized transportation; and (g) a member representing
- 16 special needs transportation.
- 17 (2) Of the county members of the board, one shall be a county
- 18 engineer or public works director; one shall be the executive director
- 19 of the county road administration board; one shall be a county planning

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director or planning manager; one shall be a county executive, 1 2 councilmember, or commissioner from a county with a population of one hundred twenty-five thousand or more; one shall be a county executive, 3 4 councilmember, or commissioner of a county who serves on the board of a public transit system; and one shall be a county executive, 5 councilmember, or commissioner from a county with a population of less 6 7 than one hundred twenty-five thousand. All county members of the 8 board, except the executive director of the county road administration 9 board, shall be appointed. Not more than one county member of the 10 board shall be from any one county. No more than two of the three county-elected officials may represent counties located in either the 11 eastern or western part of the state as divided north and south by the 12 13 summit of the Cascade mountains.

- (3) Of the city members of the board one shall be a chief city engineer, public works director, or other city employee with responsibility for public works activities, of a city with a population of twenty thousand or more; one shall be a chief city engineer, public works director, or other city employee with responsibility for public works activities, of a city of less than twenty thousand population; one shall be a city planning director or planning manager; one shall be a mayor, commissioner, or city councilmember of a city with a population of twenty thousand or more; one shall be a mayor, commissioner, or city councilmember of a city who serves on the board of a public transit system; and one shall be a mayor, commissioner, or councilmember of a city of less than twenty thousand population. All of the city members shall be appointed. Not more than one city member of the board shall be from any one city. No more than two of the three city-elected officials may represent cities located in either the eastern or western part of the state as divided north and south by the summit of the Cascade mountains.
- (4) Of the transit members, at least one shall be a general manager, executive director, or transit director of a public transit system in an urban area with a population over two hundred thousand and at least one representative from a rural or small urban transit system in an area with a population less than two hundred thousand.
- 36 (5) The private sector member shall be a citizen with business, 37 management, and transportation related experience and shall be active 38 in a business community-based transportation organization.

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(6) ((The public member shall have professional experience in transportation or land use planning, a demonstrated interest in transportation issues, and involvement with community groups or grass roots organizations.

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- 5 (7)) The port member shall be a commissioner or senior staff 6 person of a public port.
- 7  $((\frac{8}{1}))$  The nonmotorized transportation member shall be a 8 citizen with a demonstrated interest and involvement with a 9 nonmotorized transportation group.
- $((\frac{(9)}{)})$  (8) The specialized transportation member shall be a citizen with a demonstrated interest and involvement with a state-wide specialized needs transportation group.
- 13  $((\frac{10}{10}))$  (9) Appointments of county, city, Washington department of 14 transportation, transit, port, nonmotorized transportation, special 15 needs transportation, and private sector((, and public)) 16 representatives shall be made by the secretary of the department of 17 transportation. Appointees shall be chosen from a list of two persons for each position nominated by the Washington state association of 18 19 counties for county members, the association of Washington cities for 20 city members, the Washington state transit association for the transit members, and the Washington public ports association for the port 21 The private sector, ((public,)) nonmotorized transportation, 22 23 and special needs members shall be sought through classified 24 advertisements in selected newspapers collectively serving all urban 25 areas of the state, and other appropriate means. Persons applying for 26 the private sector, nonmotorized transportation, or special needs 27 transportation((, or the public)) member position must provide a letter of interest and a resume to the secretary of the department of 28 29 In the case of a vacancy, the appointment shall be transportation. 30 only for the remainder of the unexpired term in which the vacancy has occurred. A vacancy shall be deemed to have occurred on the board when 31 any member elected to public office completes that term of office or is 32 33 removed therefrom for any reason or when any member employed by a 34 political subdivision terminates such employment for whatsoever reason 35 or when a private sector, nonmotorized transportation, or special needs transportation((, or public)) member resigns or is unable or unwilling 36 37 to serve.
- (((11))) (10) Appointments shall be for terms of four years. Terms of all appointed members shall expire on June 30th of even-numbered

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- years. The initial term of appointed members may be for less than four 1
- 2 years. No appointed member may serve more than two consecutive four-
- 3 year terms.
- 4  $((\frac{12}{12}))$  (11) The board shall elect a chair from among its members
- 5 for a two-year term.
- $((\frac{13}{13}))$  (12) Expenses of the board shall be paid in accordance 6
- 7 with RCW 47.26.140.
- (((14))) for purposes of this section, "public transit system" 8
- means a city-owned transit system, county transportation authority, 9
- 10 metropolitan municipal corporation, public transportation benefit area,
- 11 or regional transit authority.
- Sec. 2. RCW 47.26.140 and 1995 c 269 s 2605 are each amended to 12
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 The transportation improvement board shall appoint an executive
- 15 director, who shall serve at its pleasure and whose salary shall be set
- by the board, and may employ additional staff as it deems appropriate. 16
- All costs associated with staff, together with travel expenses in 17
- 18 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060, shall be paid from the
- 19 urban arterial trust account, small city account, city hardship
- assistance account, ((transportation fund)) central Puget Sound public 20
- transportation account, public transportation systems account, and the 21
- 22 transportation improvement account in the motor vehicle fund as
- determined by the biennial appropriation. 23
- 24 **Sec. 3.** RCW 47.66.030 and 1995 c 269 s 2604 are each amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- (1)(a) The transportation improvement board is authorized and 26
- responsible for the final selection of programs and projects funded 27
- 28 from the central Puget Sound public transportation account; public
- 29 transportation systems account; ((high capacity transportation
- account;)) and the intermodal surface transportation and efficiency act 30
- 31 of 1991, surface transportation program, state-wide competitive.
- 32 (b) The board may establish subcommittees as well as technical
- 33 advisory committees to carry out the mandates of this chapter.
- 34 (2) Expenses of the board, including administrative expenses for
- 35 managing the program, shall be paid in accordance with RCW 47.26.140.
