- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Harbor seal and sea lion populations have greatly expanded
- 9 in recent years due to the almost absolute protection afforded them
- 10 under the federal Marine Mammal Protection Act; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Seals and sea lions are active predators upon anadromous
- 12 fish such as salmon and steelhead trout; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Anadromous fish populations are significantly reduced in
- 14 numbers throughout Washington state, and some stocks have been listed
- 15 as threatened or endangered species; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Many more anadromous fish stocks are likely to be listed
- 17 as threatened or endangered; and
- 18 WHEREAS, In order to allow certain salmon and steelhead populations
- 19 to recover to and be sustained at viable levels, it will be necessary
- 20 to have more flexibility to manage seals and sea lions in identifiable

areas where they cause unacceptable mortality levels in specific fish 1 2 runs; and

3 WHEREAS, While recent amendments to the federal Marine Mammal 4 Protection Act do allow for lethal removal of problem seals or sea lions, the process established to do so is cumbersome and timeconsuming and will do little to protect the fish; and

7 WHEREAS, Seal and sea lion predation of anadromous fish is a 8 problem that has been going on for some time and needs to be addressed 9 with some urgency;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the Marine Mammal Protection Act be modified to allow for a more common-sense approach to managing predacious seals and sea lions, including provision for reasonable, balanced, and prudent population levels of seals and sea lions in Washington state and provision for the active management of abundant populations at set levels determined with modern wildlife management science by federal and state management agencies, including use of a less cumbersome lethal removal option when and where necessary. In asking for these amendments, it is not our intention to decimate or eliminate seals and sea lions but to find balance between protection of marine mammals and protection of anadromous fish.

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately 21 transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United 22 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the 23 24 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of 25 Washington.
