- 1 TO THE HONORABLE BILL CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, the Senate and House of Representatives of Washington State, in
- 6 legislative session assembled, respectfully represent and petition as
- 7 follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The 10th Amendment to the Constitution for the United
- 9 States reads as follows:
- 10 "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution,
- 11 nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to the states
- 12 respectively, or to the people"; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution for the United
- 14 States specifically defines the total scope of power and no more that
- 15 has been granted to Congress by the People of the several States; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Article II of the Constitution for the United States
- 17 enumerates the powers, duties and responsibilities of the office of
- 18 President of the United States; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Article X of the Bill of Rights clearly states that
- 20 neither the Congress, the President nor the Judicial branch of the
- 21 United States shall delegate unto themselves or each other any powers

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- 1 not specifically enumerated in the Constitution for the United States;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, Today, in the mid-1990's, the states are demonstrably
- 4 treated as agents of the federal government; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Numerous resolutions have been forwarded to the federal
- 6 government by the Washington State Legislature without receiving any
- 7 positive response or result from Congress, the federal government or
- 8 its agencies; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Many federal actions, laws, proclamations, mandates and
- 10 presidential orders are in direct violation of the Constitution for the
- 11 Untied States; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court has ruled in New York v.
- 13 United States, 112 S. Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply
- 14 commandeer the legislative and regulatory processes of the states; and
- 15 WHEREAS, A number of proposals from previous federal
- 16 administrations and some now pending from the present administration
- 17 and from Congress may further violate the United States Constitution;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the House of Representatives and
- 19 the Senate:
- 20 (1) That Washington State hereby claims sovereighty as provided in
- 21 the 10th Amendment to the Constitution for the United States over all
- 22 powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government
- 23 by the people and the several States respectively through the
- 24 Constitution for the United States; and
- 25 (2) That this serve as Constructive Notice and Demand to the
- 26 federal government, to cease and desist, effective immediately, actions
- 27 and mandates that are beyond their scope of constitutionally delegated
- 28 powers.
- 29 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 30 transmitted to the Honorable Bill Clinton, President of the United
- 31 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 32 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from Washington
- 33 State.

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
