- 2 STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
- 3 OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
- 4 THE UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Washington's economy depends heavily on international
- 9 trade, shipbuilding, seafaring, and tourism; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The United States merchant marine continues to play a
- 11 vital role in meeting the economic, military defense, and international
- 12 aid objectives of our nation; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The cruise ship industry has grown on average 9.3 percent
- 14 annually since 1980 and is expected to double by the year 2000; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The cruise ship trade, which now features Alaska, could
- 16 grow even faster if it also featured Washington state; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The cruise ship industry could potentially provide an
- 18 additional one hundred million dollars to the Washington state economy
- 19 if a United States coastwise cruise ship trade were established, with
- 20 United States vessels transporting passengers between Washington state
- 21 and other states, such as Alaska; and

1 WHEREAS, Representatives from United States ports, labor 2 organizations, government agencies, and the maritime industry have met 3 to develop an agreement on the successful advancement of a United 4 States coastwise cruise ship trade; and

WHEREAS, The United States Congress has been considering legislation that provides financial incentives and operating provisions to effectively establish a United States coastwise cruise ship trade; NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United States Congress and President William J. Clinton establish a United States cruise ship industry, thereby developing a United States cruise ship registry, United States jobs, and a United States coastwise cruise ship trade.
