AN ACT Relating to special base years for unemployed persons directly affected by the salmon fishing disaster; adding a new chapter to Title 50 RCW; creating a new section; providing an expiration date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The purpose of this chapter is to provide a 7 special base year for persons who are unemployed as a result of the 8 closure of the salmon fishing season in Washington waters.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A special base year is established only for 10 the purpose of calculating the amount of unemployment benefits and 11 disaster unemployment assistance for persons defined in section 3 of 12 this act. The special base year consists of the four calendar quarters 13 in any one calendar year in which employment, wages, and/or self-14 employment are highest for the years of 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 15 or 1993.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** An individual is eligible for a special base 17 year only if the commissioner finds that he or she:

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(1) Resided in or worked in a county that is included in the major
disaster declaration for the salmon fishing season of 1994 under the
Robert T. Stafford disaster relief and emergency assistance act;

4 (2) Is unemployed as a result of the closure of the salmon fishing 5 season in Washington waters; and

6 (3) Filed an application for an initial determination for 7 unemployment benefits or disaster unemployment assistance, or would 8 have filed such application had a special base year been available. If 9 he or she failed to file an initial determination but would have filed 10 if the special base year had been available, the commissioner shall 11 deem such failure good cause for backdating the initial determination 12 to the start of the unemployment period.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Individuals who are eligible for the special 14 base year and who previously filed an initial determination for 15 unemployment benefits or disaster unemployment assistance are entitled 16 to a retroactive monetary redetermination using the special base year.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. The weekly benefit amount and maximum 18 benefits payable are governed by RCW 50.20.120 using the special base 19 year and are based on the average weekly wage for calendar year 1993.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. The special base year may not include wages, 21 hours, or weeks that have been used in the computation of a valid claim 22 for an expired benefit year.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** This chapter applies equally to persons 24 entitled to regular unemployment benefits and persons entitled to 25 disaster unemployment assistance.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. Benefits that are paid as a result of using 27 the special base year and are in excess of the benefits that would have 28 been paid under other provisions of Title 50 RCW shall not be charged 29 to the experience rating account of individual employers.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. This act is necessary for the immediate 31 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 32 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take 33 effect immediately.

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. This act shall expire on June 30, 1998.

2 Sec. 11. If any part of this act is found to be in NEW SECTION. 3 conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed condition to 4 the allocation of federal funds to the state or the eligibility of employers in this state for federal unemployment tax credits, the 5 conflicting part of this act is hereby declared to be inoperative б 7 solely to the extent of the conflict, and such finding or determination shall not affect the operation of the remainder of this act. The rules 8 9 under this act shall meet federal requirements that are a necessary condition to the receipt of federal funds by the state or the granting 10 11 of federal unemployment tax credits to employers in this state.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 12. If any provision of this act or its 13 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 14 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 15 persons or circumstances is not affected.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 13.** Sections 1 through 8 of this act shall 17 constitute a new chapter in Title 50 RCW.

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
