SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5026

- 1 AN ACT Relating to separating the duties of coroner and prosecuting
- 2 attorney; and amending RCW 36.16.030, 36.17.020, and 36.24.175.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.16.030 and 1991 c 363 ss 46, 47 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 Except as provided elsewhere in this section, in every county there
- 7 shall be elected from among the qualified voters of the county a county
- 8 assessor, a county auditor, a county clerk, a county coroner, three
- 9 county commissioners, a county prosecuting attorney, a county sheriff
- 10 and a county treasurer, except that in each county with a population of
- 11 twenty thousand or more and less than forty thousand the county
- 12 legislative authority may appoint a coroner, and in each county with a
- 13 population of less than ((forty)) twenty thousand no coroner shall be
- 14 elected or appointed and the prosecuting attorney shall be ex officio
- 15 coroner. Whenever the population of a county increases to forty
- 16 thousand or more, ((the prosecuting attorney)) an appointed coroner
- 17 shall continue ((as ex officio coroner)) until a coroner is elected, at
- 18 the next general election at which the office of ((prosecuting
- 19 attorney)) coroner normally would be elected, and assumes office as

- provided in RCW 29.04.170. In any county where ((the population has 2 once attained forty thousand people and)) a current elected coroner is in office and a subsequent census indicates less than ((forty)) twenty 3 4 thousand people, the county legislative authority may maintain the office of coroner by resolution or ordinance. If the county 5 legislative authority has not passed a resolution or enacted an 6 7 ordinance to maintain the office of coroner, the elected coroner shall remain in office for the remainder of the term for which he or she was
- 9 elected, but no coroner shall be elected at the next election at which

- 10 that office would otherwise be filled and the prosecuting attorney shall be the ex officio coroner. 11
- In a county where the county legislative authority appoints the 12 13 coroner, the county legislative authority shall set the coroner's salary and the coroner shall serve at the pleasure of the county 14 15 legislative authority. An appointed coroner may serve two or more 16 counties if the legislative authorities of the counties authorize such 17 arrangement by interlocal agreement.
- A noncharter county may have five county commissioners as provided 18 19 in RCW 36.32.010 and 36.32.055 through 36.32.0558.
- 20 **Sec. 2.** RCW 36.17.020 and 1994 sp.s. c 4 s 1 are each amended to 21 read as follows:
- The county legislative authority of each county is authorized to 22 23 establish the salaries of the elected officials of the county. One-24 half of the salary of each prosecuting attorney shall be paid by the 25 state. The annual salary of a county elected official shall not be less than the following: 26
- (1) In each county with a population of one million or more: 27 Auditor, clerk, treasurer, sheriff, members of the county legislative 28 29 authority, and coroner, eighteen thousand dollars; assessor, nineteen 30 thousand dollars; and prosecuting attorney, thirty thousand three hundred dollars; 31
- (2) In each county with a population of from two hundred ten 32 33 thousand to less than one million: Auditor, seventeen thousand six 34 hundred dollars; clerk, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; treasurer, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; sheriff, nineteen 35 36 thousand five hundred dollars; assessor, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; prosecuting attorney, twenty-four thousand eight hundred 37 dollars; members of the county legislative authority, nineteen thousand 38

- 3 (3) In each county with a population of from one hundred twenty-4 five thousand to less than two hundred ten thousand: Auditor, sixteen thousand dollars; clerk, sixteen thousand dollars; treasurer, sixteen 5 thousand dollars; sheriff, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; 6 assessor, sixteen thousand dollars; prosecuting attorney, twenty-four 7 8 thousand eight hundred dollars; members of the county legislative 9 authority, seventeen thousand six hundred dollars; and coroner, sixteen 10 thousand dollars;
- 11 (4) In each county with a population of from seventy thousand to less than one hundred twenty-five thousand: Auditor, fourteen thousand 12 13 nine hundred dollars; clerk, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; treasurer, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; assessor, fourteen 14 15 thousand nine hundred dollars; sheriff, fourteen thousand nine hundred 16 dollars; prosecuting attorney, twenty-three thousand seven hundred 17 dollars; members of the county legislative authority, fourteen thousand nine hundred dollars; and coroner, fourteen thousand nine hundred 18 19 dollars;
- 20 (5) In each county with a population of from forty thousand to less than seventy thousand: Auditor, thirteen thousand eight hundred 21 dollars; clerk, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; treasurer, 22 23 thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; assessor, thirteen thousand 24 eight hundred dollars; sheriff, thirteen thousand eight hundred 25 dollars; prosecuting attorney, twenty-three thousand seven hundred 26 dollars; members of the county legislative authority, thirteen thousand 27 eight hundred dollars; and coroner, thirteen thousand eight hundred dollars; 28
- 29 (6) In each county with a population of from eighteen thousand to 30 less than forty thousand: Auditor, twelve thousand one hundred 31 dollars; clerk, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, twelve thousand one hundred 32 dollars; assessor, twelve thousand one hundred dollars; prosecuting 33 attorney in such a county in which there is no state university or 34 35 college, fourteen thousand three hundred dollars; in such a county in which there is a state university or college, sixteen thousand five 36 37 hundred dollars; ((and)) members of the county legislative authority, eleven thousand dollars; and elected coroner, twelve thousand one 38 39 hundred dollars;

- 1 (7) In each county with a population of from twelve thousand to less than eighteen thousand: Auditor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, ten thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, ten thousand one hundred dollars; assessor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, eleven thousand two hundred dollars; prosecuting attorney, thirteen thousand two hundred dollars; and members of the county legislative authority, nine thousand four hundred dollars;
- 8 (8) In each county with a population of from eight thousand to less 9 than twelve thousand: Auditor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; 10 clerk, ten thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, ten thousand one 11 hundred dollars; assessor, ten thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, 12 eleven thousand two hundred dollars; prosecuting attorney, nine 13 thousand nine hundred dollars; and members of the county legislative 14 authority, seven thousand dollars;
- (9) In each county with a population of from five thousand to less than eight thousand: Auditor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, nine thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, nine thousand one hundred dollars; assessor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, ten thousand five hundred dollars; prosecuting attorney, nine thousand nine hundred dollars; and members of the county legislative authority, six thousand five hundred dollars;
- (10) In each other county: Auditor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; clerk, nine thousand one hundred dollars; treasurer, nine thousand one hundred dollars; sheriff, ten thousand five hundred dollars; assessor, nine thousand one hundred dollars; prosecuting attorney, nine thousand nine hundred dollars; and members of the county legislative authority, six thousand five hundred dollars.
- 28 **Sec. 3.** RCW 36.24.175 and 1991 c 363 s 54 are each amended to read 29 as follows:
- In each county with a population of ((forty)) twenty thousand or more, no person shall be qualified for the office of county coroner as provided for in RCW 36.16.030 who is an owner or employee of any

33 funeral home or mortuary.
