- (f) Iron Horse/Bandera, King county, to the state parks and recreation commission for state park purposes;

(g) Kitsap Forest, Kitsap county, to the department of natural resources for natural area preserve purposes;

- (h) Mount Peak, King county, to King county for open space and recreation purposes; and
- (i) Upper Sultan Basin, Snohomish county, to the department of natural resources for natural resources conservation area purposes and protection of the city of Everett watershed.
- (3) Lands may be transferred under the authority provided in this section only if timber on these lands are commercially unsuitable for harvest due to economic considerations, good forest practices, or other interests of the state. Upon authorization of transfer by the board of natural resources, the department shall report to the office of financial management and the appropriate legislative committees regarding the determination of the reason for transfer.
- (4) Property transferred under this section shall be appraised and transferred at fair market value. The value of the timber transferred shall be deposited by the department of natural resources in the same manner as timber revenues from other common school trust lands. No deduction shall be made for the resource management cost account under RCW 79.64.040.
- (5) All reasonable costs incurred by the department of natural resources to implement this section are hereby authorized to be paid out of the appropriation. Authorized costs include the actual cost of appraisals, staff time, environmental reviews, surveys and other similar costs.
- (6) Intergrant exchanges between common school and other trust lands of equal value may occur if the exchange is in the interest of each trust, as determined by the board of natural resources.
- (7) Prior to or concurrent with conveyance of these properties, the department of natural resources, with full cooperation of the receiving agencies, shall execute and record a real property instrument which dedicates the transferred properties to the purposes identified in subsection (2) of this section for a minimum period of twenty years. The department of natural resources, in consultation with the receiving agencies, shall develop policy to address requests to replace transferred properties subject to the recorded property instrument that are no longer deemed appropriate for the purposes identified in subsection (2) of this section.

Moneys in the account may 17 18 also be appropriated to provide for state match requirements under federal law for projects and activities conducted and financed by the 19 board under the drinking water assistance account. During the 1995-97 20 fiscal biennium, moneys in the public works assistance account may be 21 appropriated for ((transfer to the flood control assistance account to 22 23 be used for)) flood control and repair assistance, including ((grants)) 24 transfer to the flood control assistance account program under chapter 25 86.26 RCW. To the extent that moneys in the public works assistance account are not appropriated during the 1995-97 fiscal biennium for 26 public works or flood control assistance, the legislature may direct 27 their transfer to the state general fund. In awarding grants under 28 29 chapter 86.26 RCW, the department of ecology shall give strong preference to local governments that have: (1) Implemented, or are in 30 the process of implementing, an ordinance that establishes a flood 31 plain policy that is substantially more stringent than minimum federal 32 33 requirements; (2) completed a comprehensive flood control plan meeting 34 the requirements of RCW 86.12.200; or (3) constructed, or are in the process of constructing, a system of overtopping dikes or levees that 35 36 allow public access.

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1 **Sec. 47.** RCW 43.155.065 and 1990 c 133 s 7 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

3 The board may make low-interest or interest-free loans to local 4 governments for emergency public works projects. Emergency public 5 works projects shall include the construction, repair, reconstruction, replacement, rehabilitation, or improvement of a public water system 6 7 that is in violation of health and safety standards and is being 8 operated by a local government on a temporary basis. During the 9 1995-97 fiscal biennium, emergency projects shall also include repair, reconstruction, or replacement of streets, roads, bridges, water 10 systems, storm water systems, sanitary sewage systems, and flood 11 12 control facilities and structures damaged during the November 1995, December 1995, and February 1996 storm and flood incidents. The loans 13 14 may be used to help fund all or part of an emergency public works 15 project less any reimbursement from any of the following sources: (1) 16 Federal disaster or emergency funds, including funds from the federal 17 emergency management agency; (2) state disaster or emergency funds; (3) insurance settlements; or (4) litigation. Emergency loans may be made 18 19 only from those funds specifically appropriated from the public works 20 assistance account for such purpose by the legislature. The amount appropriated from the public works assistance account for emergency 21 loan purposes shall not exceed five percent of the total amount 22 appropriated from this account in any biennium, except that during the 23 24 1995-97 fiscal biennium, the amount shall not exceed ten percent.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 48. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
