1 AN ACT Relating to job opportunities and basic skills training 2 program participation criteria; and amending RCW 74.25.020.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 74.25.020 and 1993 c 312 s 7 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

б (1) The department of social and health services is authorized to 7 contract with public and private employment and training agencies and other public service entities to provide services prescribed or allowed 8 under the federal social security act, as amended, to carry out the 9 10 purposes of the jobs training program. The department of social and health services has sole authority and responsibility to carry out the 11 12 job opportunities and basic skills training program. No contracting 13 entity shall have the authority to review, change, or disapprove any 14 administrative decision, or otherwise substitute its judgment for that 15 of the department of social and health services as to the application of policies and rules adopted by the department of social and health 16 17 services.

18 (2) ((To the extent feasible under federal law, the department of 19 social and health services and all entities contracting with it shall 1 give first priority of service to individuals volunteering for program

2 participation.

3 (3)) The department of social and health services shall adopt 4 rules under chapter 34.05 RCW ((establishing)) that conform to the 5 criteria in federal law for mandatory program participation as well as establish criteria constituting circumstances of good cause for an 6 7 individual failing or refusing to participate in an assigned program 8 component, or failing or refusing to accept or retain employment. 9 ((These)) The good cause criteria shall include, but not be limited to, 10 the following circumstances: (a) If the individual is a parent or other relative personally providing care for a child under age six 11 years, and the employment would require the individual to work more 12 than twenty hours per week; (b) if child care, or day care for an 13 14 incapacitated individual living in the same home as a dependent child, 15 is necessary for an individual to participate or continue participation 16 in the program or accept employment, and such care is not available, 17 and the department of social and health services fails to provide such care; (c) the employment would result in the family of the participant 18 19 experiencing a net loss of cash income; or (d) circumstances that are 20 beyond the control of the individual's household, either on a shortterm or on an ongoing basis. 21

22 (((4))) (3) The department of social and health services shall 23 adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW as necessary to effectuate the 24 intent and purpose of this chapter.

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
