State of Washington 54th Legislature 1995 Regular Session

By Senators Haugen, Morton and Winsley; by request of Community, Trade, and Economic Development

Read first time 01/23/95. Referred to Committee on Government Operations.

AN ACT Relating to disbursement of funds to border areas; amending RCW 66.08.190, 66.08.195, and 43.63A.190; adding a new section to chapter 66.08 RCW; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 66.08.190 and 1991 sp.s. c 32 s 34 are each amended to 7 read as follows:

8 When excess funds are distributed, all moneys subject to 9 distribution shall be disbursed as follows:

(1) Three-tenths of one percent to the ((department of community
development to be allocated to)) border areas under RCW 66.08.195; and
(2) From the amount remaining after distribution under subsection
(1) of this section, fifty percent to the general fund of the state,
ten percent to the counties of the state, and forty percent to the
incorporated cities and towns of the state.

16 (((3))) The governor may notify and direct the state treasurer to 17 withhold the revenues to which the counties and cities are entitled 18 under this section if the counties or cities are found to be in 19 noncompliance pursuant to RCW 36.70A.340. 1 sec. 2. RCW 66.08.195 and 1988 c 229 s 3 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 For the purposes of this ((section, the term)) chapter:

<u>(1)</u> "Border area" means ((Blaine, Everson, Friday Harbor, Lynden,
Nooksack, Northport, Oroville, Port Angeles, Sumas, and that area of
Whatcom county commonly referred to as Point Roberts)) any incorporated
city or town located within seven miles of the Washington-Canadian
border or any point of land surrounded on three sides by water and
adjacent to the Canadian border.

10 ((Funds allocable to border areas under RCW 66.08.190 shall be 11 distributed pursuant to a formula developed by the department of 12 community development, by rule, based on border traffic and historical 13 public impacts of law enforcement problems caused by the border on 14 local budgets. All such funds received by Whatcom county pursuant to 15 this allocation shall be spent within the Point Roberts area.))

16 (2) "Border area per-capita law-enforcement spending" equals total per capita expenditures in a border area on: Law enforcement operating 17 18 costs, court costs, law-enforcement related insurance, and detention 19 expenses, minus funds allocated to a border area under RCW 66.08.195. (3) "Border-crossing traffic statistic" means the number of 20 vehicles, vessels, and aircraft crossing into the United States through 21 22 a United States customs service border crossing during a federal fiscal 23 <u>year.</u>

(4) "Border-related crime statistic" means the sum of infractions
 and citations issued, and arrests of persons permanently residing
 outside Washington state in a border area during a calendar year.

27 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.63A.190 and 1984 c 125 s 11 are each amended to 28 read as follows:

29 Funds appropriated by the legislature as supplemental resources for 30 border areas shall be distributed by the state treasurer pursuant to ((a)) the formula developed by the department ((under chapter 34.05 RCW 31 based on border traffic and historical public impacts of law 32 33 enforcement problems caused by the border on local budgets)) based on the guidelines in section 4 of this act and the border area traffic 34 totals adopted in chapter 365-90 WAC. All funds received by Whatcom 35 county under this section shall be spent within the Point Roberts area. 36 37 ((As used in this section, "border area" means any incorporated city or town located within seven miles of the Washington-Canadian 38

border and any point of land surrounded on three sides by water and adjacent to the Canadian border.))

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 66.08 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) The formula used to allocate funds allocable to border areas 6 under RCW 66.08.190 shall be based on the following allocations:

(a) Sixty-five percent ratably based on border area traffic totals.

8 (b) Twenty-five percent ratably based on border-related crime9 statistics.

10 (c) Ten percent ratably based on per-capita law-enforcement 11 spending.

12 (2) The formula based on guidelines in this section may be13 reexamined every three years upon request of one of the recipients.

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. This act is necessary for the immediate 15 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 16 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take 17 effect July 1, 1995.
