- 1 AN ACT Relating to penalties for driving without a driver's license
- 2 and negligent driving; amending RCW 46.61.525; reenacting and amending
- 3 RCW 46.20.021 and 46.63.020; and prescribing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.021 and 1991 c 293 s 3 and 1991 c 73 s 1 are 6 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1) No person, except as expressly exempted by this chapter, may
- 8 drive any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless the person
- 9 has a valid driver's license issued to Washington residents under the
- 10 provisions of this chapter. A violation of this subsection is (($\frac{a}{a}$)
- 11 misdemeanor and is a lesser included offense within the offenses
- 12 described in RCW 46.20.342(1) or 46.20.420)) an infraction and is
- 13 <u>subject to penalties as set by the supreme court under RCW 46.63.110 or</u>
- 14 community service.
- 15 (2) For the purposes of obtaining a valid driver's license, a
- 16 resident is a person who manifests an intent to live or be located in
- 17 this state on more than a temporary or transient basis. Evidence of
- 18 residency includes but is not limited to:
- 19 (a) Becoming a registered voter in this state; or

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- 1 (b) Receiving benefits under one of the Washington public 2 assistance programs; or
- 3 (c) Declaring that he or she is a resident for the purpose of 4 obtaining a state license or tuition fees at resident rates.
- 5 (3) The term "Washington public assistance programs" referred to in subsection (2)(b) of this section includes only public assistance 6 7 programs for which more than fifty percent of the combined costs of 8 benefits and administration are paid from state funds. Programs which 9 are not included within the term "Washington public assistance 10 programs" pursuant to the above criteria include, but are not limited to the food stamp program under the federal food stamp act of 1964; 11 programs under the child nutrition act of 1966, 42 U.S.C. Secs. 1771 12 13 through 1788; and aid to families with dependent children, 42 U.S.C. Secs. 601 through 606. 14
- 15 (4) No person shall receive a driver's license unless and until he or she surrenders to the department all valid driver's licenses in his 16 17 or her possession issued to him or her by any other jurisdiction. The department shall establish a procedure to invalidate the surrendered 18 19 photograph license and return it to the person. The invalidated 20 license, along with the valid temporary Washington driver's license provided for in RCW 46.20.055(3), shall be accepted as proper 21 identification. The department shall notify the issuing department 22 23 that the licensee is now licensed in a new jurisdiction. No person 24 shall be permitted to have more than one valid driver's license at any 25 time.
- (5) New Washington residents are allowed thirty days from the date they become residents as defined in this section to procure a valid Washington driver's license.
- 29 (6) Any person licensed as a driver under this chapter may exercise 30 the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and highways in this 31 state and shall not be required to obtain any other license to exercise 32 such privilege by any county, municipal or local board, or body having 33 authority to adopt local police regulations.
- (7) If a person cited for a violation of subsection (1) of this section appears in person before the court and provides written evidence that at the time the person was cited, he or she had a valid driver's license, the court shall dismiss the notice of infraction. In lieu of personal appearance, a person cited for a violation of subsection (1) of this section may, before the date scheduled for the

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- 1 person's appearance before the court, submit by mail to the court
- 2 written evidence that at the time the person was cited, he or she had
- 3 <u>a valid driver's license in which case the court shall dismiss the</u>
- 4 <u>notice of infraction</u>. The court may assess court administrative costs
- 5 of twenty-five dollars at the time of dismissal.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.61.525 and 1979 ex.s. c 136 s 86 are each amended 7 to read as follows:
- 8 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle in
- 9 a negligent manner. For the purpose of this section to "operate in a
- 10 negligent manner" shall be construed to mean the operation of a vehicle
- 11 in such a manner as to endanger or be likely to endanger any persons or
- 12 property: PROVIDED HOWEVER, That any person operating a motor vehicle
- 13 on private property with the consent of the owner in a manner
- 14 consistent with the owner's consent shall not be guilty of negligent
- 15 driving.
- 16 ((The offense of operating a vehicle in a negligent manner shall be
- 17 considered to be a lesser offense than, but included in, the offense of
- 18 operating a vehicle in a reckless manner, and any person charged with
- 19 operating a vehicle in a reckless manner may be convicted of the lesser
- 20 offense of operating a vehicle in a negligent manner. Any person
- 21 violating the provisions of this section will be guilty of a
- 22 misdemeanor: PROVIDED, That the director may not revoke any license
- 23 under this section, and such offense is not punishable by imprisonment
- 24 or by a fine exceeding two hundred fifty dollars)) A violation of this
- 25 <u>section is an infraction and is subject to penalties as set by the</u>
- 26 supreme court under RCW 46.63.110 or community service.
- 27 Sec. 3. RCW 46.63.020 and 1994 c 275 s 33 and 1994 c 141 s 2 are
- 28 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 29 Failure to perform any act required or the performance of any act
- 30 prohibited by this title or an equivalent administrative regulation or
- 31 local law, ordinance, regulation, or resolution relating to traffic
- 32 including parking, standing, stopping, and pedestrian offenses, is
- 33 designated as a traffic infraction and may not be classified as a
- 34 criminal offense, except for an offense contained in the following
